Adding Value to Our Schools

In addition to raising funds to support eight Orange County Public Schools district-wide initiatives, the Foundation for OCPS manages several programs.

Read2Succeed - Our Foundation created this

successful program to assist struggling 1st and 2nd graders with increasing their vocabulary and reading fluency.

Clubs - Currently 19 book clubs established in 12 OCPS middle schools, the clubs are designed to facilitate pleasure reading via e-readers and to develop and increase the joy of reading to our reluctant readers.

Teacher Grants Program - Classroom teachers across the District received more than \$190,000 in teacher grants in 2014 for innovative teaching and instruction for District students.

Teach-In 2014 - Over 4,500 volunteers

contributed more than 8,000 volunteer hours in 175 OCPS schools sharing stories, careers and giving demonstrations.


