ENCORE! offers opportunities for children, who have completed Kindergarten through 5th grades (by the end of the school year), to attend a week-long camp designed to provide exploratory learning experiences based upon individual interests. Offered both weeks (appropriate for all ages)

Offered July 13-17 only (appropriate for all ages)

Offered both weeks (appropriate for all ages)

#### Creative Cupcakes

Offered both weeks (appropriate for all ages) !!Allergy Alert!! This class is an introduction to the essentials of becoming a master cupcake decorator. We will read recipes, measure ingredients, and make beautiful treats. Lean a variety of creative cupcake decorating techniques.

#### Cursive Camp

Offered both weeks (for students that completed 3rd-5th grade) We will review the proper formation of manuscript letters and move quickly into cursive writing. Just to make it fun we will use a variety of pens, pencils, markers, and paper =)



#### Dancing Through the Decades

Offered July 13-17 only (appropriate for all ages)

Each day we will focus on a different decade of dancing. Decades include: 50's, 70's, 80's, and 2000's. Students will learn how dancing has evolved through the decades. We will also be comparing styles of dance, music, dress, and the impact it had on that decade. It will be fun for all ages!

#### Deep Oceans

Offered both weeks (appropriate for all ages)

In this class, students will explore the wonders and amazing marine life in our oceans. Offered both weeks (appropriate for all ages)

We'll have a fun time learning to play classic board games and other games you may have enjoyed as a kid! We'll also be playing some math games to sharpen your child's skills while having a great time.

Offered July 13-17 only (for students that completed 3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> grade) Do you enjoy making 3-D art? Do you like being creative? Do you love getting messy? Offered the week of July 13-17 only (appropriate for all ages) What's all the buzz about? Bees! Did you know most of the food you eat today would not exist if not for bees? We will explore inside a bee colony, learn why bees are so important and how they make such yummy honey, and meet a real bee keeper and help harvest honey.

#### So You Think You Can Dance and Sing?

Role-play stimulates students' imagination, enhances their social development, and encourages friendship through cooperation, listening, and turn taking.

#### Wacky Weaving

Students will be creating a wall hanging, a funny character, and a dream catcher in addition to wrist bands, lanyards/necklaces, and headbands.
