Below is an extract of the rules for HOTY events

State Horse of the Year and Riding Championships

These rules are to be adhered to by the State Organizing Committees in the conduct of State Horse of the Year and Riding Championships and only refer to those classes that qualify horses/riders for the Australian Show Horse Championships. States are still able to include additional conditions to the conduct of their State event that are State-specific and not in contradiction to these rules.

- 4.1 The event is to be conducted under the rules and by-laws of Equestrian Australia.
- 4.2 Horses must be registered with the Equestrian Australia Ltd and owned or leased by a financial member of that State.
- 4.3 Horses can only be shown at State HOTY by a financial member of that State.
- 4.4 Show Horse, Show Hunter and Leading Rein Classes - All horses must have a current EA Height Certificate.
- 4.5 Rider of the Year Classes - Riders may only compete in the class for which they are eligible. Age is at the day of the event.
- 4.6 Show Horse, Show Hunter, Leading Rein and Rider of the Year Classes - All riders must be members of EA in the State in which the event is being held.

Interstate riders are not permitted to ride in any class at EQ Horse of the Year.]

- 4.7 Show Horse, Show Hunter and Leading Rein Classes - Horses/Ponies must be currently EA registered and domiciled in that State (including where appropriate within a 100 km radius of a border) for a total period of 3 months immediately preceding the date of that State's Horse of the Year event. However, if the horse has not competed under saddle (with the exception of horse racing) in any state prior to purchase and is registered and eligible/qualified in the state in which it is to compete by closing date of entries it shall be eligible to compete in that respective state's HOTY.

[EQ Show Horse additional rules - Additionally, Horses/Ponies must be EA registered for a total period of 3 months immediately preceding the date of that State's Horse of the Year close of entries.]

Show Horse, Show Hunter and Leading Rein Classes – Horse/Pony must be 3 years of age or over at 1 August.

- 4.8 Interstate HOTY
 - 4.8.1 Show Horse, Show Hunter and Leading Rein - If a horse has competed in a qualifying class at an EA HOTY in the current year in another State it is not eligible to compete in another HOTY in the same calendar year.
 - 4.8.2 Rider Classes - If a rider has competed in an EA HOTY in the current year in a qualifying class in another State they are not eligible to compete in another HOTY in the same calendar year.
 - 4.8.3 Show Hunters – if a horse/pony is entered as a Show Hunter at a State HOTY, it will be precluded from entering the State Horse of the Year as a Show Horse.
- 4.9 To judge State Horse of The Year
 - 4.9.1 Judges must have a minimum of two year's experience on a State or National list.
 - 4.9.2 A maximum of two judges from any one state are permitted.
- 4.10 State Show Horse and Riding Championships Classes

- 4.11 For the smaller States where there are not enough competitors to hold two Galloway or Show Hunter height divisions, they may continue to hold one division with the winner and runner up from each division participating in their applicable height division at the National Championships.
- 4.12 Random swabbing will take place in accordance with the EA Medication Control Policy.
- 4.13 Judges must be selected from the EA Show Horse Judges List.
- 4.14 The Judges' decision is final.
- 4.15 The Organizing Committee has the right to refuse any entry without having to assign any reasons.
- 4.16 As a minimum, a winner and runner-up is to be sashed and announced at the event.
- 4.17 In qualifying Show Horse, Show Hunter and Rider classes three judges must be used as per the preferential judging system in 5.7 (excluding Northern Territory due to geographic isolation).
- 4.18 All qualifying events for the Australian Show Horse Championships (i.e.: State HOTYs) must be run by the State's Show Horse Committee (who may form or co-opt an organizing sub-committee).
- 4.19 Results of winners and runners-up, and the names of all Finalists (top 10) to be sent to the relevant EA State Branch Office.
- 4.20 Judges who have accepted to Judge at a State Horse of the Year and Riding Championships will not accept a Judging appointment for a Royal Show in the same State in the same year.

*NEWCOMER HOTY (ADDITIONAL RULES TO ABOVE FOR ALL NEWCOMER HOTY)

- 1a. Newcomer HOTY is open to horses and ponies which have NOT debuted in any under saddle class at any event (excluding racing), which includes but is not limited to – breed, local, pony club, dressage, jumping etc. prior to July 1st, 2012.
- 1b. Horses and ponies which have competed under saddle in any event in any state (excluding racing) prior to July 1st, 2012, are not eligible to compete.
- 1c. All horses and ponies are to be ridden in a simple snaffle bridle. Nosebands may be cavesson, hanoverian or drop, as per EA rules.
- 1d. All entries must be accompanied by a Statutory Declaration stating the name of the horse, date of first hack class and the event attended.
- 1e. Horses and ponies must be owned/leased & domiciled in Queensland for at least 3 months prior to the date of this show.
- 1f. Owners/Riders/Exhibitors/Lessees must be bonafide residents of Queensland for at least 3 months prior to the date of this show.

**OWNER RIDER HOTY (ADDITIONAL RULES TO ABOVE FOR ALL OWNER RIDER HOTY)

- 1a. All Owner Riders must not be of a professional status. An Owner Rider is one who shows horses for pleasure and a hobby only. Not for money or as a profession.
A professional is defined as one who:
“is a person or business concerned with selling, preparing, agisting, and/or training competition horses and/or the training of riders, or a person who receives any monetary sponsorship, or a person who receives product sponsorship in excess of \$200 a year.”
- 1b. All horses and ponies are to have an official lease or be the bona fide property of the rider. An official lease must have been in existence for a period of at least three months prior to the owner-rider show.
- 1c. Horses and ponies must not have been ridden, trained or exhibited undersaddle by any other person in the previous three months. The only exception being those horses and ponies which have been ridden by another person who qualifies as an owner-rider (subject to rule 2)
- 1d. If a horse or pony is agisted, it must be in the sole care of the rider or the rider’s immediate family.
- 1e. Owner Riders will be required to complete a declaration and acknowledgement to prove eligibility and submit this with their Owner Rider application form.
- 1f. Any protests regarding eligibility must be lodged in writing on the day of the event with \$110.

2. All riders/owners/lessees, entered or competing in the ridden Equestrian Queensland Show must be financial members of the Equestrian Australia (Queensland Branch) Inc. and all horses entered or competing in the ridden Equestrian Queensland Show must be registered with the Equestrian Australia (Queensland Branch) Inc. Such membership/registrations shall be effective by close of entries.

*****INTERMEDIATE HOTY (ADDITIONAL RULES TO ABOVE FOR ALL INTERMEDIATE HOTY)**

- 1a. Intermediate HOTY is open to horses and ponies which have NOT won or runner-up at any EA State HOTY (including Intermediate and open HOTY), or won 1st, 2nd in any open hack or open show hunter class at any Royal Show.
- 1b. Horses and ponies must be owned/leased & domiciled in Queensland for at least 3 months prior to the date of this show.
- 1c. All entries must be accompanied by a Statutory Declaration stating the name of the horse, date of first hack class and the event attended.
- 1d. Owners/Riders/Exhibitors/Lessees must be bonafide residents of Queensland for at least 3 months prior to the date of this show.

*****CHILDRENS CLASSES (ALL RIDERS MUST BE UNDER 18YRS OF AGE OTHER THAN SMALL PONY RIDERS MUST BE UNDER 14YRS OF AGE.**

- 1a. All riders/owners/lessees, entered or competing in the ridden Equestrian Queensland Show must be financial members of the Equestrian Australia (Queensland Branch) Inc. and all horses entered or competing in the ridden Equestrian Queensland Show must be registered with the Equestrian Australia (Queensland Branch) Inc. Such membership/registrations shall be effective by close of entries.
- 1b. Horses and ponies must be owned/leased & domiciled in Queensland for at least 3 months prior to the date of this show.
- 1c. Horses/ Ponies in these classes do not have to be a newcomer they can be a open horse/pony but must be ridden by a child.

*****First season rules**

Events 76-83 are open to all Horses that commenced their saddle career after 1 July 2013.

First season is open to horses and ponies which have NOT debuted in any under saddle class at any event (excluding racing), which includes but is not limited to – breed, local, pony club, dressage, jumping etc. prior to July 1st, 2013.

- 1b. Horses and ponies which have competed under saddle in any event in any state (excluding racing) prior to July 1st, 2013, are not eligible to compete.

- 1c. All horses and ponies are to be ridden in a simple snaffle bridle. Nosebands may be cavesson, hanoverian or drop, as per EA rules.
- 1d. All entries must be accompanied by a Statutory Declaration stating the name of the horse, date of first hack class and the event attended.
- 1e. Horses and ponies must be owned/leased & domiciled in Queensland for at least 3 months prior to the date of this show.
- 1f. Owners/Riders/Exhibitors/Lessees must be bonafide residents of Queensland for at least 3 months prior to the date of this show.

Additional EQ Rules and Conditions of Entry

1. **Protests**

All protests must be submitted in writing to the ringmaster no later than sixty (60) minutes following the completion of the event in question. All protests shall be accompanied by a cash fee of \$110.00 which shall be forfeited should the protest be deemed frivolous.

2. **Equine Anti-Doping and Medication Control Rules applying to EA Events and Competitions**

7.2 Provisional Suspensions

The EA may provisionally suspend a Person Responsible and/or his or her Horse prior to the opportunity for a full hearing based on (i) an Adverse Analytical Finding from the "A-Sample" or "B-Samples"; (ii) the review described in Article 7.1.2; and (iii) the notification of the EA, either the hearing in accordance with Article 8 will be advanced to a date that avoids substantial prejudice to the Person Responsible, or the Person Responsible will be given an opportunity for a Provisional Hearing either before imposition of the Provisional Suspension or on a timely basis after imposition of the Provisional Suspension. Provisional Suspension shall be applied solely to anti-doping rule violations according to Article 2 (where a Doping Prohibited Substance or a Prohibited Method is involved). For the avoidance of doubt, Provisional Suspensions shall not be applied where there is a medication control rule violation.

3. **Payments**

Payments are NON-REFUNDABLE and NON-TRANSFERABLE.

4. **Prize/s**

Any prize/s not collected on the day of the show will be forfeited.

5. **Prize Money**

Prize money will ONLY be paid if the EQ HOTY qualified place getter **competes** at the Australian Show Horse and Riding Championships (ie. EA Nationals). Payments will therefore be made AFTER the Australian Show Horse and Riding Championships subject to who qualified and competed at the discretion of the EQ Show Horse Committee (Winner \$100, Runner-up/third \$50).

6. **Contact with Appointed Official**

If it is brought to the attention of the organizing committee that any competitor has been in contact with and/or makes contact with an appointed official, that competitor will automatically forfeit their right to entry.

7. **Policy on Bullying**

Bullying is an issue in many sports today. The EQ Show Horse Committee wants members, organizers and officials to know that bullying is not acceptable at any EQ Show Horse events.

Respect

Every official, competitor and helper has the right to be treated with dignity and respect. The EQ Show Horse Committee has a responsibility to ensure this occurs at our events. The EQ Show Horse Committee can only discipline the appropriate person/s if intimidation is reported. We encourage any person who feels they have been bullied to report it in writing to the EQ Show Horse Committee:

- Reports will be handled promptly and confidentially
- Disciplinary action will be taken against those who have bullied others at events run under the auspices of the EQ Show Horse Committee

What is Bullying?

Bullying is any inappropriate behavior using force or power. Bullying undermines another person's self-esteem and confidence. It may be a one-off or may be repeated incidents:

Disparaging remarks
Public criticism
Verbal abuse

Name-calling
Smirking
Harassment

Written abuse
Threats
Shouting
Sarcasm
Belittling

Swearing
Socially excluding people
Spreading rumors and innuendo
Throwing papers etc down/around

***None of this is ever acceptable. Please report it to an EQ Show Horse Committee official.
Being uptight at a competition is no excuse for bad behavior.***

What is the cost of Bullying?

Bullying is not confined to the school yard. It costs Australians an estimated \$12 billion a year.

- 1 in 3 people quit work because of bullying (UK data)
- Bullying may make officials, competitors and sponsors leave our sport

WITHOUT OUR VOLUNTEER JUDGES, ORGANISERS, AND OFFICIALS, THERE WOULD BE NO COMPETITIONS.

Why do people Bully?

Those who can, do Those who can't bully.

The more inadequate the person, the more they bully

- Bullies blame others for their problems
- Some bully when they are overloaded and not coping
- Some are just socially inept

Steps the EQ Show Horse Committee may take

Every time a bully gets away with this behavior, it is a signal to him or her that the organization thinks it is acceptable. When unacceptable behavior is reported to the EQ Show Horse Committee, the committee can:

1. Send a letter to the bully to arrange a meeting with representatives from the EQ Show Horse Committee
2. Issue the bully with a written warning, which will remain on file
3. Suspend the bully from competing at EQ Show Horse Committee events for a period of time if in the judgment of the EQ Show Horse Committee the incident merits it, or if further incidents occur.

How do I handle a bully?

1. Stay calm. If necessary, tell the intimidator that you will not continue the conversation until you have a second official with you (walk away if you have to).
2. Stay polite. Inform the intimidator that the EQ Show Horse Committee wishes people at events to report inappropriate behavior.
3. Make a note of the following details as soon as possible.
 - a) Name or bridle number, (ask them to provide their name if you don't know it)
 - b) Time and date
 - c) Others present
4. Put a brief written report in to the EQ Show Horse Committee so the matter can be handled formally

**We need the knowledge & experience of our volunteers.
We cannot afford to lose good people through bad behavior.**

Here's how it might go:

Spectator: "You haven't got a clue how to marshal this event; my daughter should have been called 10 minutes ago. You're a bloody idiot".

Marshal: "If you wish to continue this conversation, you will need to come to the club house / scorer's caravan/ canteen so another official is present while we discuss this issue".

Spectator: "What the hell do you mean? She's riding in a test right now. I'm not going anywhere".

Marshal: "Officials have been asked to submit written reports on inappropriate behavior at competitions. When you say "You're a bloody idiot" I feel intimidated.

Spectator: "How ridiculous, get a life!"

Marshal: "In accordance with EQ Show Horse Committee guidelines, I am making a note of your daughter's bridle number, the time, what was said, and these other riders' bridle numbers so the incident can be properly reported".

Who are bullies?

People in authority can victimize people with less power. They are often charming to those they are not bullying, which can make it even more difficult for their victims to complain. Some are clever, competent sophisticated manipulators who enjoy dominating and humiliating others. They like to see their victims squirm.

Who do bullies target?

- Bullies often target people who have made a mistake. We all occasionally make mistakes. Riders do, officials do, judges do.
- Bullies often attack people who are victims – the 'blame the victim' syndrome
- For example, an organizer gets abused when a computer, P.A., printer or photocopier breaks down, or weather conditions damage a riding surface or blow arenas down.

How do bullies respond when challenged?

- Deny it
- Blame others
- Claim victimization if they are challenged
- Rationalise to explain their bad behavior

How do we eliminate bullying?

- Have a clear policy – bullying is unacceptable
- Define what is bullying and why it is unacceptable
- Encourage riders or officials who are being bullied to report it – providing support and confidentiality
- Appoint committee members to discipline bullies

Did you know?

In Criminal Law:

- Assault = threatening behavior, intimidation, bullying
- Battery = physical attack
