Dear friends, *Alleluia. Christ is risen!* How great to see the crowd on Palm Sunday and Easter when there were more than 400 in attendance.!! Alleluia. Thanks ever to those who worked so hard to make everything happen. The pictures are worth more than a thousand words. Shirley Topping made all the extra altar guild work look effortless and flawless. Thank you, Shirley! The flowers on Easter were so awesome—thank you Ann Boyd. The anthem written by Tim Hinck and music of the choir was joyous. Thank you Sarah Poole for all the lovely food at the Seder—and all the helpers, too numerous to mention. Thank you, youth group for the Easter Egg Hunt and to our College and Career group who helped so selflessly.

On May 22, 10 AM in the Bracewell Room, our church holds its Parish Meeting and elects members to our vestry to lead the church into the new year. The requirements for vestry are that you must be a confirmed member and pledge and be older than 16. The number of members we need for this coming year are five---one to serve the unexpired term of Robert Hartmans who is now at Virginia Theological Seminary (VTS) and four regular three year term members to replace our retiring members: Chuck Lee, Jacqueline Hoover, Bo Chamberlain, and Ed Colucci. Each has served and contributed in so many ways that to list their contributions would take more space than I am allowed. We need persons who are willing to serve in fellowship, stewardship, and Christian formation. Please give your nominations to these retiring vestry members along with your thanks. Vestry meets monthly on the third Monday evening at 6 PM. The new vestry members will be oriented and trained during the summer so that we can move forward on task in September. Confirmed members may vote. There will be a slide show and year end reports as we celebrate a year of resurgence and eleven confirmations. I was given a small book written by a Methodist bishop called **Cultivating Fruitfulness**. This bishop astutely identifies five characteristics of vibrant congregations: Radical Hospitality, Passionate Worship, Intentional Faith Development, Risk-taking Mission and Service, and Extravagant Generosity. He points out that all these are characteristics of Our Lord's ministry among us and that the adjectives are the keys. I believe that St Peter's Church and School have these characteristics and that we can build on them this summer and into the new 2011-2012 year. Cultivating Fruitfulness is a five week meditation, and I will ask that we as a congregation examine our life in the light of this excellent and clear summary of what it means to be the Body of Christ in our times.

We have come far the past few years and there is much still to do in joyful obedience to the Lord Jesus. We do not need to allow the busy month of May to keep us from Worship on Sunday. On the 8^{th} of May is Youth Sunday and Mother's Day, and on the 15^{th} at 11 AM Walt Thomas will be with us from Richmond.

Thank you for blessing St Peter's and me in this past year.

Although we have been through some very tough times, I have felt the spirit of the living God as we have taken care of each other. That is what the Body of Christ is to be---for one another, just as Christ is for us

Students experience history through Core Knowledge

Preschoolers recently created an "American Landmarks" display in the St. Peter's main lobby. You will see replicas of the Washington Monument and the Liberty Bell.

We began our study of the **Washington Monument** by practicing building with one-inch sugar cubes. We then worked our fine motor skills by moving on to building with a smaller component - the sugar cube. It was fun for the students to once again see the obelisk and pyramid shapes that were introduced in our Egyptian unit in January.

We decided to make our **Liberty Bells** by reusing/recycling plastic bottles. This served as a reminder to all of us of our school motto "Go Healthy, Go Green". The students began construction of their bells by applying several coats of a variety of acrylic paints. The next and most fun part for the kids was determining where and how big to make the crack in their Liberty Bell! They then used scissors to cut and design a crack in their bell. A final coat of gold paint was then applied.

First graders enjoyed a fun **St. Patrick's Day** with activities aligned with their current Core Knowledge curriculum. They began the day with a study of inventor **Thomas Edison**. **First grade teacher Michelle Bailey** presented them with their own opportunity for invention—creating their own leprechaun trap!

Using their imagination, students picked items from a table full of supplies and separated to design and build their own secret traps! Afterwards, they wrote about their projects, either detailing why they built their trap or how it would work. With traps "set" in the hallway, first graders were excited to return from lunch and see gold glitter dust at each of their traps--- their work had obviously peaked the leprechauns' interest!

After lunch, each got a chance to show off their imagination by reading their "essay" in the author's chair and presenting their traps to classmates for validation. Students were also quizzed that if traps were creative enough, they could be issued their own "patent," just like **Thomas Edison**.

The fun continued with dancing to an Irish jig and discovering the story of the **Blarney Stone**, rumored to give you the gift of gab! Students went on a "rock hunt" and decorated their very own blarney stones in rainbow shades or the colors of the Irish flag. While outside, leprechauns really went crazy, visiting each student's project and leaving them a gold coin!


