# History and background

The BA (Hons) Early Childhood Studies (Didsbury) was validated in 1993, and the BA (Hons) Childhood Studies (Crewe) and the FdA in Early Years Practice were first approved in 2001. The 2005 quinquennial Review created a framework of Childhood Studies courses that incorporated the FdA Early Years Practice.

### Summary of proposed changes:

To incorporate a franchise of the FdA Early Years Practice to Macclesfield College into the Childhood Studies Programme.

The proposed franchise will provide:

- flexible learning opportunities for students in the Macclesfield area
- the possibility of recruiting additional part-time students to the BA (Hons) Early Childhood Studies top up route
