To ensure that the design, academic standards and quality of learning opportunities of the existing programme, together with the proposed developments, as approved in principle on 14 May 2009 (PAF ref PARM/09/097) and as outlined in 7 below, remain appropriate to the awards to which the programme leads and are informed by reference to institutional regulations and policies, national benchmarks and relevant professional and employment demands.

#### A7 Outline of Proposal/Development(s)

The Legal Practice Course at MMU was last reviewed in 2002 and has had no significant modifications since that time, other than the introduction of a unit in Immigration Law during the academic year 2008/2009. The LPC is regulated by Solicitor's Regulatory Authority (SRA) and as such is subject to Quality Assurance processes imposed both internally and externally of MMU.

The two year deferral of review (the Programme was due for quinquennial review during 2006/07) had exceptionally been permitted pending major changes to the Programme being introduced by the professional body (the SRA).

The purpose of this review event is to extend the approval of the current LPC course for a further year and to approve the new, Full and Part Time LPC to run at MMU from September 2009 and September 2010 respectively.

#### A8 Conduct of the Event and Panel Membership

The event, comprising private panel meetings and meetings of the panel with members of the programme team and representatives of current students, was held on the All Saints South Campus.

She had, however, verbally passed her comments to other members of the Panel, for inclusion in the discussion.

### A11 | Conclusions on Quality and Standards

The Panel concluded that the intended learning outcomes of the programmes were being achieved by students, that the standards of the University's awards were being maintained and that the programmes as modified remain current and valid in the light of developing knowledge in the discipline, practice in their operation and developments in teaching and learning.

### A12 | Summary of Outcome

The Panel recommended:

Continued approval of the existing Post Graduate Diploma in Legal Practice for one year with effect from September 2009.

And

Initial approval of the proposed Part and Full Time Post Graduate Certificate and Diploma in Legal Practice with effect from September 2009 and 2010 respectively, subject to fulfilment of the 2 conditions in Section A13 below. With respect to the Full Time Programme this is subject to the Solicitors Regulatory Authority (SRA) approval being in substantially the same format. Any changes arising out of the SRA approval should be notified to the Chair of the panel by the end of January 2010. The Chair will then determine agreement, or if necessary, refer to CASQE for further action.

#### A13 Condition(s) of Approval

The following conditions of approval must be fulfilled before the modified programme may commence:

- 1. Update the Definitive Document to
  - a) integrate the credit framework
  - b) ensure it includes all sections required by MMU, substantially the addition of unit specifications. The panel suggests that the programme team refer to the current template to ensure completeness.
- 2. Provide the Learning and Teaching Committee with the detail of exemptions as approved, in principle, from MMU regulations.

#### A15 | Recommendations

The Programme Team must consider and address explicitly the following recommendations in the course of its annual monitoring processes:

- 1. Evaluate the effectiveness of support for Part Time students in relation to the diversity of the student body.
- 2. Extend the existing analysis of employment outcomes to include longer term consideration on different dimensions of the student body.
- 3. Consider the use of alumni and Post Graduate students to educate Undergraduate and Graduate Diploma students in relation to the importance of undertaking work experience.
- 4. Continue endeavours to integrate work placements into the programme.
- 5. Monitor the impact of changing the Learning and Teaching Strategy on staff and students.
