## A7 Outline of Proposal/Development(s)

The BSc (Hons) International Clothing Technology and Design programme is offered at Level 6 only and provides a valuable 'top-up' route to Honours level for anyone, worldwide, with the necessary entry requirements, ability and commitment to study. The programme focuses on the technology of clothing design and manufacture with strong international culture and business input. Successful graduates will be well equipped for further study at Masters level or for entry into employment within the global fashion industry. The programme is accredited by the chartered body for the textile, clothing and footwear industry - The Textile Institute - allowing graduates to become Chartered Technologists at Associate Level.
