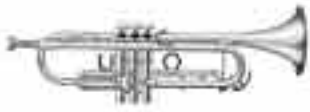

Veterans History Project

The Veterans History Project of the American Folklife Center collects, preserves, and makes accessible the personal accounts of American war veterans so that future generations may hear directly from veterans and better understand the realities of war. In addition, those U.S. citizen civilians who were actively involved in supporting war efforts (such as war industry workers, USO workers, flight instructors, medical volunteers, etc.) are also invited to share their valuable stories.

The United States Congress created the Veterans History Project in 2000. The authorizing legislation (Public Law 106-380), sponsored by Representatives Ron Kind, Amo Houghton, and Steny Hoyer in the U.S. House of Repre-

sentatives and Senators Max Cleland and Chuck Hagel in the U.S. Senate, received unanimous support and was signed into law by President William Jefferson Clinton on October 27, 2000.

How To Participate In The Project

A participant may be a veteran, an interviewer, or person donating a veteran's collection. Students in the 10th grade and above may also participate and there are special resources for educators, students and Eagle Scouts. The home web site is — <http://www.loc.gov/vets/vets-home.html>.

The reviewing stand is on Broadway between Colfax and 14th Ave.

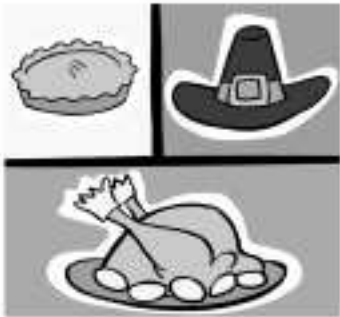
Art Class Gallery

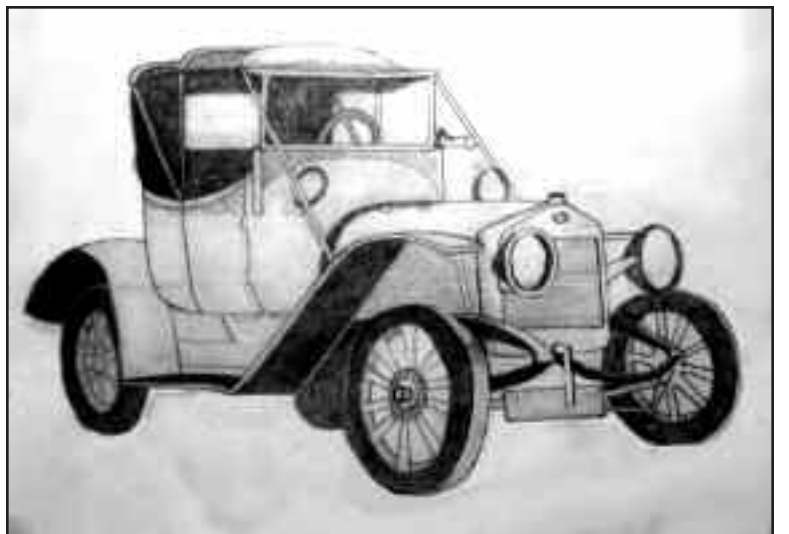

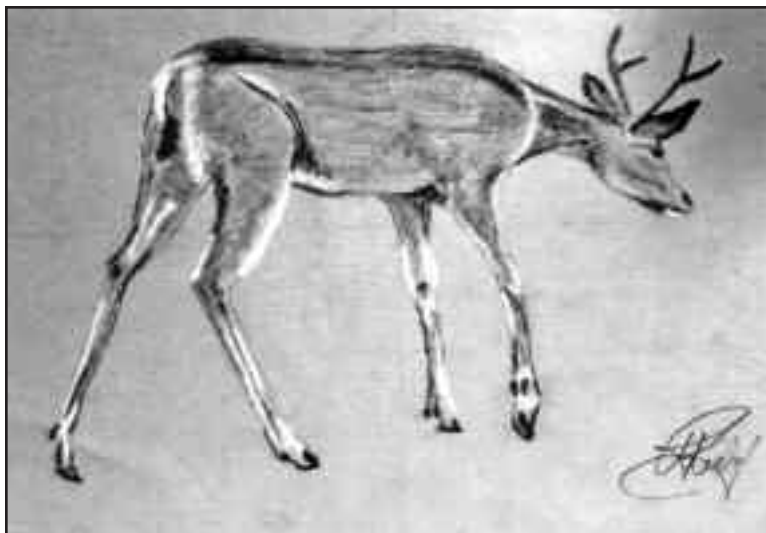
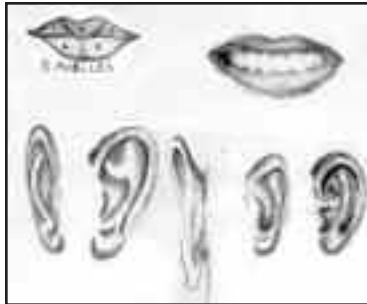
