## CALENDAR REMINDERS: PLAN AHEAD

# THE PRIMARY DIVISION BRINGS EXCITEMENT TO EARLY LEARNING!!

## *TEACHERS ARE BUSY CHALLENGING STUDENTS TO THINK ABOUT THEIR THINKING!*

**EARLY PRIMARY--PRE-KINDERGARTEN 3-YEAR OLDS:** The Flower Patch has hit the ground running with amazing energy and excitement for the 2013-2014 school year. From community and caring, to colors and shapes, they have been thoroughly engaged in active, hands-on exploration. They've built a tree in their classroom, a garden outdoors, and cooperatively discussed the distinguishing characteristics of objects and shapes in their environment. There is so much to learn through careful observation and meaningful reflection, and the Flower Patch's beginnings have taken this route to learning with 100% enthusiasm. While laying the foundation for concepts such as change and perspective and skill-building in language and math, the Pre-K3 students are showing how much they love to learn. From their very first day at Corbett Prep, when they carefully planted their own real-life flower garden, members of our Pre-K3 class came to know that this will be a year that they will grow, grow, grow!

**EARLY PRIMARY---PRE-KINDERGARTEN 4 Beach Buddies and KINDERGARTEN "Fun"tasticFrogs** are exploring "Who We Are" in our first unit of inquiry, "*Getting to Know You, Getting to Like You*". Over the next few weeks we will discover how establishing common values can help individuals interact with the wider world. Through a variety of activities, we are developing essential agreements, fostering positive relationships, and cultivating behaviors and responsibilities.

The **Beach Buddies** (Pre-K4) are busy learning about our own families and families around the world. During our "Going Global Centers", the students are discovering the many similarities and differences of families from all around the world. We discussed and viewed a day in the life of a student from China and compared/contrasted it to a day in the life of a student at Corbett Prep.

The **Kindergarten Frogs** were in touch with their feelings last week as they participated in a visual thinking routine called CSI. After reading the story, *The Way I Feel*, by Janan Cain, the students used colors, symbols, and images to represent the way they felt during the story and the concepts they wanted to capture. This routine encourages students to identify and distill the essence of ideas from reading, watching or listening in a non-verbal way by using a color, symbol, or image to represent the ideas. An in-depth discussion of the text occurred as the students shared their responses to the story. The frogs look forward to *leaping ahead* in this unit by transferring our knowledge of feelings into citizenship and developing positive relationships with others.

**UPPER PRIMARY (FIRST AND SECOND GRADES)--BRILLIANT BUGS, COOL CATS and MIGHTY MONKEYS** are actively deepening their understanding of how the choices they make in their personal lives may contribute to leading a healthy lifestyle. In their inquiry unit "*Good for You,*" the students are focusing on three specific aspects; nutrition, exercise and well-being. This past week, students experienced physical activity **recording** how their heart rate changed after each exercise and any physical or mood changes they noticed. **Lunch and play time have a whole new meaning!** Students are engaging in conversations about nutrients and asking themselves if their lunch is well-balanced. On the playground, it is common to have students running up to teachers to assist them with help checking their heart rate! We have also tapped into our parent community to share their expertise in this area. Chantal Peterson, (Michael Peterson's mom), will be speaking to **all** of upper primary on Friday, promoting nutrition and healthy lifestyles through the **MORE HEALTH** program. ## Red, White and Blue Day Inspires Appreciation for Heroes of 9/11 and Beyond

**Sept. 11, 2013 (TAMPA, FL)** – Krissy Lloyd was just a year old when the Twin Towers fell. Tyler Hostler-Mathis had yet to be born.

The two middle school students have heard family members share where they were on Sept. 11, 2001, and they have studied the events in school. Corbett Preparatory School of IDS marks the anniversary to recognize past and present heroes who work to keep the country safe and to honor the freedom we enjoy in the United States, regardless of our gender, country of origin, race or religion.

Corbett Prep began its third annual Red, White and Blue Day on Sept. 11 with a moment of silence at precisely 9:11 a.m. Then Krissy and Tyler raised their trumpets to play *Taps* over the loudspeaker for the east and west campuses.

They felt a responsibility to do their best out of respect for the commemoration. “I wanted to get it right,” said Tyler, a seventh grader.

This important day provided many opportunities for students to challenge their assumptions, reflect and learn. Several primary classes used *Fireboat* by Maira Kalman as a springboard to discuss the characteristics of heroes. Kindergartners described and drew heroes important to their lives to make a giant “Wall of Heroes” display outside their classroom.

Often children think of superheroes when first asked whom they consider a hero. The book expands students’ understanding to include helpers, teachers, parents and rescue workers. In the multiage first and second grade “Brilliant Bug” class, students drew a picture of a hero before reading *Fireboat* and a second picture afterward.

One little girl drew a picture of a superhero who “saves the day” the first time and after reflection, added a second picture of a female firefighter with long blonde hair like hers.

Teacher Jennifer Jones said several students thought of role models such as Martin Luther King Jr., Rosa Parks and even their parents during the first assignment. The book inspired other reflections.

First and second grade “Mighty Monkeys” expressed gratitude for heroes who keep the United States safe and generated ideas of other reasons they are thankful. The class listed friends, family, their country, clean water, safe homes and the opportunity to go to school.

Pre-kindergarten students also had a chance to show their patriotism.

PreK-4 children posed with a flag for pictures in their red, white and blue outfits. Teachers hung the snapshots on a large banner decorated with flags, hearts and stars and the John Lennon quote: “You may say we are dreamers, but we’re not the only ones. I hope someday you will join us, and the world will be a better place.”

PreK-3 helped beautify the campus by setting flags they decorated into the ground. The “Flower Patch” children also shared ideas for how they could be of service and perform good deeds. Sept. 11 is recognized as a National Day of Service and Remembrance to encourage charitable service. The Middle School is planning ahead for a community service day on Nov. 6.

## Mini-Basketball League Teaches Fundamentals, Character

**Sept. 16, 2013 (TAMPA, FL)** – Elementary school children will have a chance to learn basketball from experienced coaches in a positive environment when they join a new mini-basketball league at Corbett Preparatory School of IDS.

Corbett Prep and the Marvin Harvey Basketball School of Excellence are accepting children in first through fifth grade for a new basketball league that will play on Saturdays throughout the fall. Children will be grouped by age, with first and second graders (ages 6-7) playing together and third through fifth graders (ages 8-10) on their own teams. The program can accept as many as 60 children in each of the two age groups to form teams of 10 players each.

The league will start on Oct. 5 with tryouts and an instructional camp. Games will take place once a week on Saturdays, between 8 a.m. and 1 p.m. Practice will occur once a week at 6 or 7 p.m. Mondays or Wednesdays.

Mini-basketball is a great introduction to the fundamentals of basketball, adapted for children's mental and physical development. The ball is 27.5 inches and the basket 8.5 feet tall, and the focus is on player development rather than keeping score. Games are divided into four quarters of 10 minutes each, with a 2-minute break between quarters and a 5-minute break at halftime. Each player must play two quarters.

The mini-basketball league also strives to teach and model honesty, work ethic and teamwork – traits that benefit players on the courts, classrooms and throughout their lives. The program is based on internationally acclaimed Coach Marvin Harvey's philosophies found in his books *Winning Within Reason* and *Seven Principles for Teaching Basketball*.

Dear Parents,

The development of your child's overall communication skills of hearing, processing information, and talking is essential. These skills provide the foundation for all future learning. Dysfunctions of hearing, articulation of sounds, voice, fluency or understanding and use of the language can significantly affect your child's overall learning potential. Therefore, early identification and treatment of these disorders are important.

A communication screening will be held at **Corbett Preparatory School of IDS on November 7th and 8th**. A certified speech-language pathologist will assess production of specific speech sounds, voice quality, fluency, comprehension and use of language. We also check phonological awareness skills for children five and up since this is critical for reading success.

The screening is only provided for children 3 years and older. If you have concerns about a child that is younger, please feel free to call me to discuss your concerns. Younger children can be tested but screening this population is not possible in the short period of time allotted for screening.

The cost for the **speech and language screening is \$35.00**. If you wish your child to participate in the communication screening, please fill out the attached form. If your child is absent, another time will be arranged. You will be contacted as soon as possible regarding the results of your child's screening. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact me at (813) 933-7300 . If you have any specific concerns, please note them on the back on this sheet.

**DIRECTIONS:**

**ACADEMY AT THE LAKES (1800 COLLIER PKWY, LAND O'LAKES, FL. (813) 948-2133):**

1. Head north on Dale Mabry Hwy to the end of US 41.
2. Stay left onto US 41 for a 1/4 mile until you get to SR54.
3. Make a right onto SR54 east and travel three (3) miles until you get to Collier Pkwy.
4. Pass School and game is on the right at Land O Lakes Rec Center..

**BERKELEY PREP SCHOOL: 4811 Kelly Rd. Tampa, FL. (813) 885-1673:**

1. Take Dale Mabry Hwy south to the Hillsborough exit.
2. Take a right onto Hillborough at the end of the ramp.
3. Left onto Kelly Road (TJ Maxx and Mobil station on the corner). The school is on the left.

**CARROLLWOOD DAY SCHOOL (1515 W BEARSS AVE, TAMPA, FL. (813) 920-2288):**

***For Cross Country Meets, try to arrive there after 3:30 pm due stay out of their dismissal crowd/traffic.***
