HEADMASTER OF THE DAY, LORENZO LARGENT (8th grade) led the school masterfully and confidently on a busy, busy Monday Morning Assembly followed by the dedication of Corbett Prep's **new Healthy Choices Kitchen** which is housed in the Middle School Dean Dining Hall. The dream kitchen renovation became a reality thanks to the generosity of the Henning, and Johannpeter families and grandparents, John and Nina Soileau. The entire Middle School gathered in and around the Dean Dining Hall, as Headmaster Largent and Development Director, Mark Nouss enthusiastically shared the magnitude of this gift to the entire Middle School.

In fact, this effort was spearheaded by our PFA Committee for Healthy Choices, who understands that a healthy lunch in the middle of the school day can help students become better learners, improve their abilities to focus and concentrate as they absorb new information. Our **new Healthy Choices Kitchen**, provides a prime spot for Chef Garret Jagdmann to ensure students receive the balanced meals they need to succeed. The renovations doubled the catering staff's food preparation and storage area. Equipment also was upgraded. Several cooking appliances were converted from electric to gas to increase efficiency. A six-burner oven, a char-broiler and griddle all were added. Corbett Prep also now has a 17-by-6-foot walk-in cooler and freezer to add more storage opportunities. "It's fantastic," said Brooke Soileau-Henning.

BIG EVENT AUCTION BID WINNERS EARN ANNUAL MANHUNT FUN and STRATEGIZING SKILLS: On May 4, the fourth annual Big Event offering of **Middle School Manhunt** was a sweaty success! The event, which sold out early, raised over \$2,400 for Corbett Prep. Last Friday, twenty-two students, two Corbett Prep alumni, and twelve ENERGETIC MIDDLE SCHOOL teachers gathered for an epic battle of the classic neighborhood game: hide and seek tag in the dark. After pizza, drinks, and intense strategizing, the students won the coin toss and became the first team to hide.

The entirety of the Middle School grounds was fair game as the students crouched behind, climbed under, and hid in various trees, benches, bushes, and buildings to avoid being seen by their teachers. Once spotted, the students had to run to base, or face spending the remaining time in each round in Ms. Jones's air conditioned jail, usually known as the Dean Dining Hall. After the first round, the teachers became the hunted and the students their hunters. After much pizza, four heated rounds, and some well-earned popsicles, everyone left anticipating, planning, and speaking of the next year's battle. The Middle School teachers would like to thank their students' parents for their generosity at the Big Event, and for providing them with an excuse to act like the Middle Schoolers they teach. THE 6TH GRADE ASTRONOMY CLASS completed its end of year project by constructing a large scale model of the Solar System, to scale, alongside the Middle School driveway. Ten objects in the solar system, planets, and dwarf planets, are represented, along with the gates to the school representing the Sun. The spacing between the objects is to a scale and proportion calculated by the students themselves to fit the space available. All parents and classes on the East Side are invited to walk along the model, reading the information on the posters at each point for an informational journey!

THE 8TH GRADE INTRODUCTORY PHYSICAL SCIENCE CLASS has embarked on its culminating activity, one that integrates all the information, skills, and technique learned over the course of the entire year. Students have been given a sample of 'Sludge', a complex mixture of materials. They must use all of their scientific knowledge to separate this mixture into as many fractions as possible, using separation techniques such as Flotation, Filtration, Chromatography, and Fractional Distillation. At every step they must consider the order in which the processes must be done and must examine the results carefully to identify as many materials as possible. TEACHERS EXCITED TO SHARE MORE ABOUT MIDDLE SCHOOL'S NEW HORIZON'S WEEK!!

SIXTH GRADE TAKES LEARNING TO THE TREETOPS...AND RIVER BOTTOMS: Each year, the sixth grade class participates in New Horizon's week by traveling to Lithia, Florida to attend Pathfinders, a three day outdoor, experiential learning trip. On their first major excursion without parents, Corbett Prep middle schoolers impressed their teachers, trip directors, and counselors alike. Students worked together in "families" of ten to complete team building challenges, learn about the Alafia River, participate in an Underground Railroad simulation, and climb out of their comfort zones as they scaled stately oaks in a rock climber's harness. Prior to returning home, the "TEAM families" participated in a Florida Country simulation where they experienced the joys and hardships of being Florida's first settlers. Tired but joyful, the sixth grade returned home on April 30 to the welcoming arms of their parents. When asked about the experience, many sixth graders simply replied, "Best trip ever!"

SEVENTH GRADE TAKES LEARNING TO THE MOUNTAINS: The Sixth Grade Pathfinders Trip serves as the perfect foundation for the seventh grade traditional adventure of Wolfcreek! Seventh graders load onto charter busses early on a Friday morning to drive the seven hours to Pine Mountain, Georgia. Camping in FDR National Park, seventh graders kick it up a notch by leaving the comforts of cabins, showers, and kitchens behind for six days of backpacking.

SEVENTH GRADE TAKES LEARNING TO THE MOUNTAINS - continued: Seventh graders, their teachers, and Wolfcreek Professional Staff hike approximately fifteen to twenty miles over their three to four days on the Pine Mountain Trail, set up camp each evening, and pack up, leaving no trace of their visit, each morning. Aside from their hiking, students also push themselves to complete a high ropes course and participate in Mountain Heritage Day.

When students return home, the true reflective nature of the trip begins. Some students loved the woods. Others were challenged and were glad or even surprised at what they could accomplish.

Even parents were nice enough to send in a few insights, for example: "I must say that I have never seen him happier, tell more stories, laugh and smile more than he did when he came home." "She really enjoyed the trip! Thank you for making a difference!" "I never a hundred percent believed all the things that are said about why Wolfcreek is good for the kids and why this belongs in a school program, but now I completely get it. It was an experience like none he would ever have had..."

8TH **GRADE WASHINGTON/PHILADELPHIA TRIP TAKES SCHOOL ON THE ROAD:** On Sunday, April 26, 2015, our 8th grade students arrived at Tampa International Airport excited and ready to board the plane to Washington, D.C. for a week of "History Alive!" Sixty Corbett Prep students and seven faculty members spent five days filled with touring, workshops, and fun in our nation's capital, and in the cradle of our democracy, Philadelphia!

After landing in D.C., we boarded the Metro Subway and journeyed to the Museum of Natural History for lunch and on to the National Holocaust Museum for active learning and deeper thinking. Students made visual, concrete connections to the book *Night*, by Eli Wiesel, one of the required study pieces in English. That evening, students were placed into mixed-school workshop groups with the Close-Up Organization giving students and opportunity to connect with students from Alaska, Arizona and Texas in their on-the-go hands-on live learning experience.

Day two and three were filled with "walking workshops" with their Close-Up groups. Before entering each site, the Close-Up professional staff prepared the students through seminar fashion discussions and role plays to gain the deepest possible understanding of the meaning of liberty and freedom. Seeing the students so engaged in unique and powerful ways brought great pride to our Corbett Prep teacher escorts and the Close-up Instructors.

Each day, we returned to the hotel for dinner and an hour of Program Workshops, where our students were natural leaders as they provided thought provoking comments while discussing and simulating many areas of government...for example, how bills should become laws.

On day four, we were off to Philadelphia on Wednesday! We had an early wake up so we could board the bus for the trip to Philadelphia. When the students arrived, we quickly entered Constitution Center to view an amazing show called "Freedom Rising". Did you know that there is a Corbett Prep connection to the Constitution Center and Independence Hall? Yes! Elbridge Gerry has a bronze statue, along with the other signers of the Declaration of Independence, and is an ancestor of our own Cornelia Corbett!

On Thursday morning, our students made their final good-byes to their new found friends from the other visiting schools and returned to their Corbett Prep groups for additional "site workshops. All along the way, they were showered with unsolicited compliments on their model behavior, knowledge and manners. All students came back with a wealth of knowledge about the key concepts of our American history and government, while having another Corbett Trip of bonding and amazing experiences!


