Gardening Column – by Deb Peters

I hope yall enjoyed last month's column. This month's column is very short, consisting only of some information concerning filling your garden boxes. This month, I have some suggestions on where to purchase your soil.

The two closest places are:

Compost Central (near airport) 5631 West Blvd. 704-588-9092

North Mecklenburg Recycling Center 12300 N. Statesville Rd. Call 311

If you bring a pickup truck, I think it is \$28 a yard. We found the compost and mulch to be of excellent quality, and it's more economical than buying in bags from a big box store. You should call ahead because they do run out, especially close to the weekend.

One last piece of info: Remember to add eggshells and coffee grounds to your soil. Most coffee shops will give you old grounds free if you call ahead.

Also, while waiting for planting time (I plan to plant May 1), use graph paper to decide what you want to plant and where you want to plant it.

Be patient. Don't rush and plant too early. You don't want all your hard work to be for nothing.

The new playground equipment should be installed soon.

We also are working on a community survey to solicit your feedback on a number of topics. The responses will be compiled and used to determine next steps for each of the topics, including updating our governing documents (Bylaws and CC&Rs). When you get it, please take time to respond.

Our Landscaping Committee (Beth Degrassi, Chair) has already been out doing some clean-up and beautification of our entry area facing Prosperity Church Road.

At the March board meeting, the decision was made to replace the playground equipment. An insurance claim was filed about the vandalism to the playground, which will partially offset the costs of replacement. We are also looking to make repairs to the pool, pool deck and fence. We continue to investigate options concerning improving the safety and security of our common area and are interested in no-cost or low-cost ideas you may have. Send your ideas to hoa@leacroft.org.

The Architectural Review Committee (ARC) (Mike Wisniewski, Chair) convened to review a request for a planter box, which was approved. If you have a change you wish to make to your property, you can find the guidelines and request form on the Leacroft Web site, or contact Mike Wisniewski (See contact box on page 3).

Our Outreach Committee for welcoming and neighbor assistance (Gerri Gercak, Chair) is working to be able to provide new neighbors with welcome packets.

Other Board News

- The board passed a resolution to ratify the HOA annual budget at the annual homeowners' meeting. This will serve to enact the homeowners' directive until the Bylaws and CC&Rs are updated and approved by the HOA members. The resolution incorporates the provisions of NC General Statutes Chapter 47f, Paragraph 3-103 (c) of the NC Planned Communities Act. The resolution will be published to the community Web site.
- Updated Leacroft Swimming Pool Rules and Regulations were approved. A copy will be sent to homeowners to review, sign and return the acknowledgement page prior to receiving their pool passes. A copy will also be posted to the community Web site.
- The board reviewed various quotes for playground equipment replacement and for pool and pool fence repair and selected the most cost and performance effective vendor for each need. The replacement playground system will cost approximately \$23,000, including delivery and installation and playground mulch. Proceeds from our insurance claim for vandalism should offset a fair portion of this. (See photo on page 7.)
