A lawyer asked [Jesus] a question to test him: "Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?" And he said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the great and first commandment. And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments depend all the Law and the Prophets (Matthew 22:34-40).

If you watched the Olympic gymnastics competition, you know that there's basically two ways to fall off the balance beam: to the left and to the right. As Christians, we must keep in balance every day the two basic commandments which Jesus teaches. We fall into trouble when we lose one (Love God) or the other (Love your neighbor).

FROM THE PASTOR

Beware of the worldly opinion (proclaimed by shrewd morticians, government and hospital chaplains, lodges of a religious nature, and Oprah) which ignores the first commandment! It is not loving to spread lies about God. We dare not tell others or believe for ourselves: "You can believe in any kind of god or deity as long as you are sincere and live a life of love." What a

slap in the face to God and His Son, Jesus Christ! (The death of Jesus on the cross would be irrelevant and so would faith in Him.) God has spoken in the Bible: I AM the Lord. The Lord is One God yet three persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. To say or confess a different God is unloving to Him. Doubting God or neglecting to listen to Him in the Bible and worship is unloving, too.

But as Christians, we dare not fall off the other side of the balance beam either. As individuals, we can focus so much on MY faith and MY salvation and MY heavenly home, and MY church that we lose sight of the 2nd great commandment: Love your neighbor as yourself. We could end up focusing so much on MY God that I lose sight of living out my faith in God--the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—as I love my neighbor. After all, God Himself commands us to love our neighbors according to commandments 4-10.

That's where the Epistle of James comes in. Much of this book focuses on how our life as Christians--as individual members of the body of Christ (a.k.a. the Church)--should look like. During the month of September, we will be hearing and learning from this marvelous book of the Bible. May God increase in all of us our need for Christ's love and forgiveness! May God increase in us repentance and faith in Christ! May God increase in us a sincere love for others! I am confident that the Holy Spirit will do all these things as we hear and learn and take to heart God's Word in the Book of James.

Where charity and love prevail there God is ever found;
Brought here together by Christ's love by love are we thus bound.
Let strife among us be unknown; let all contention cease;
Be God's the glory that we seek: be ours His holy peace.
Let us recall that in our midst dwells Christ, His only Son;
As members of His body joined we are in Him made one. (LSB 845; 1,4,5)






