



foods that protect your heart

- **1. Avocados.** A food almost too good to be true, avocados are packed with heart-healthy fats, cholesterol-lowering minerals, and are high in fiber and foliate that promote healthy arteries. Yet they do contain about 300 calories each, so go easy on the guacamole.
- **2.** Salmon, sardines, and other fatty fish. Treasures from the sea contain a heart-protective type of fat (omega-3) to help regulate heartbeats and decrease blood clotting and inflammation.
- **3.** Oatmeal and oat bran. Great foods to start your day because they're loaded with soluble fiber that helps lower LDL "bad" cholesterol.
- **4. Walnuts.** Go nuts. They contain heart-healthy fats that can also lower LDL. Some people may be allergic to nuts. Walnuts are high in calories, so a handful is plenty.
- **5. Edamame.** These protein-rich green soybeans contain all eight essential amino acids. They also help lower LDL cholesterol. Try them steamed.
- **6. Bananas.** A portable source of the blood-pressure-regulating mineral potassium. Apricots, kiwi fruit, spinach, and other dark leafy greens are also rich in potassium.
- **7.** Ground (not whole) flaxseed. Another abundant source of heart-healthy omega-3s. Grind in your coffee grinder first, then sprinkle onto cereals, soups, and salads.
- **8. Apples.** Why take vitamins, when you can get Mother Nature's heart-protective best from fruits such as apples?
- **9. Blueberries.** These juicy gems contain more protective heart-healthy compounds than any other fruit.

A different kind of love story, directed by out Bill Condon (based on the novel by Christopher Bram), it tells the sometimes true tale of the "unrequited" love that develops between worldly gay director (of "Frankenstein" fame) James Whale (a U.S. star-making turn by out Shakespearian actor Ian McKellan) and his gardener, Clayton (a very introspective, A list performance by a buff-andtoned Brendan Fraser).

This from IMDb.com: "The semi-fictionalized story of director James Whale's last days is a melancholy tale of an intelligent, creative mind that is beginning to fail and Whale's desperate fear of that mental failure. He sees in the handsome, hulking form of his gardener an individual that reminds him of his most famous film creation, Frankenstein's monster, and he tries to reach out to him and offer the friendship that his film creation was denied. However, his mind is swimming in and out of fantasy, memory, and reality, and his gesture initially confuses the gardener, who sees it only as a sexual advance....Lynn Redgrave is funny and touching as his housekeeper, and Brendan Fraser, an adventurous actor who does not shy away from stretching his abilities, has yet to find a better role than that of Clayton Boone..."

Winner of the 1999 Oscar for Best Adapted Screenplay (with nominations for McKellan and Redgrave as actors), and winner or nominee of over 50 other international awards, (including the 1999 GLAAD Media Award for Outstanding Film), this is a not-to-be missed experience.

For February 2009, the selection: Go Tell It On The Mountain by James Baldwin



Go Tell It On The Mountain, first published in 1953, is Baldwin's first major work, a novel that has established itself as an American classic. Baldwin chronicles a fourteen-year-old boy's discovery of the terms of his identity as the stepson of the minister of a storefront Pentecostal church in Harlem one Saturday in March of 1935. Baldwin's rendering of his protagonist's spiritual, sexual, and moral struggle of self-invention opened new possibilities in the American language and in the way Americans understand themselves.

This novel was selected in recognition of Black History Month. ■


