All classes and Saturday workshops are held in the historic Steinert building conveniently located at 162 Boylston Street in Boston. The underground Boston Common garage is within walking distance, as well as numerous parking meters near the theater district and the Public Garden. The Boylston Street T stop is diagonally across the street.

All Day Saturday Workshop: July 25, 2009

Scheduled from 9:30 AM to 4:30 PM, this unique workshop is designed to give you an opportunity to maximize your painting experience. Limited to 10 students, this workshop will include fun filled warmup group activities combining an engaging energy with concentrated focus. Participants may break for lunch nearby or bring a sandwich. The workshop will typically conclude with a general critique. Tuition is a very reasonable fee of \$125. All levels and media are welcome.

Mini Session Classes:

August 6, 13, 20, 2009

Classes meet on Thursdays from 9:30 AM to 12:30 PM for 3 weeks. All levels and media are welcome. Class size is limited to 10 students. Set in a friendly and supportive atmosphere, you will be free to either work on a project of your choosing or follow the directives as suggested by a more defined structure. In either case William St.George will provide his expertise and support. Tuition is \$175. On the back page you will find various options, a sign up form and a policy statement.
