Communion Bread Recipe — Bakers Needed

Ingredients

3 c white flour

1 c whole wheat flour

2 tsp baking soda

6 tbsp white sugar

1 tsp salt

1/4 c vegetable oil

1 1/4 c water

In large bowl, stir all dry ingredients. Add oil and water and stir again. Knead dough with with floured hands right in bowl. If too moist, add a little flour. Make 4 round balls. Roll out in 7-8" diameter loaves on a floured surface and place on cookie sheet.

Puncture or score each loaf with a fork, or knife or pizza cutter so the bread can be broken easier during service.

Bake at 350 degrees for 9-10 minutes. Any longer, and the bread will get too dry.

Let cool completely. Place bread in Ziploc bag marked with the date. Bring to church for the freezer.

NOTE: Bread machine works great for making the dough – place all ingredients into machine and set on knead cycle.

TELLERS

A teller tabulates the weekly offering after the 10:30 worship service and makes the bank deposit. Tellers serve on two person teams which work on a monthly rotational basis.
