## Guidelines for Submission of Manuscripts to Applied Radiology

All materials submitted to *Applied Radiology* must be original work, and may not have been published elsewhere. Submissions should be review articles geared to the general radiologist and should reflect practical everyday clinical applications, rather than research activity. Articles may pertain to clinical management, applications of a particular imaging modality, imaging of specific anatomic or disease states, as well as administration, fiscal, technical, and/or medicolegal issues. Scientific articles are *not* published in *Applied Radiology*.

## **Submission Requirements**

Cover Page The cover page should include the full title of the article as well as the following information:

**Author Information** All authors should be listed, including full names, degrees, and current affiliations (department, institution/company, city and state). For the corresponding author, provide full contact information: mailing address, phone and fax numbers, and e-mail address.

**Conflict of interest/author disclaimer** Any actual, potential, or apparent conflicts of interest must be stated on the cover page. All sources of financial support for the study presented or any author relationships with manufacturers of any products mentioned in the article must be stated.

**Prior publication/presentation** If any part or portion of the article has been published or presented in another form previously (eg, published as an abstract or presented at a meeting), the original presentation must be identified with a complete citation.

**Manuscript** Articles should run approximately 1,500 to 2,500 words in length. Four or five key words reflecting the article topic should be placed at the bottom of the cover page. Manuscripts should be sent by e-mail to: stuart@appliedradiology.com. The cover page, body of the manuscript, figure legends and references should be in separate files. Images may be sent on a CD-ROM to the address above (see below for image preparation) or may be sent as a zipped file with the text files. If your file is too large to email, you may upload your zipped materials to our upload link at: https://www.hightail.com/u/Applied-Radiology.

**References** As appropriate, information in the article should be referenced to the literature. Accuracy of all reference material is the responsibility of the authors. Do not place reference citations in the text inside brackets or parentheses. Instead, references should be numbered sequentially and superscripted, in order of first appearance in the text. <u>Do not</u> list the references alphabetically. Reference numbers may be cited repeatedly in the text; however, all references must be cited at least once. Personal communications, articles not yet accepted for publication, and unpublished data should be cited parenthetically in the text, not in the numbered reference list. References cited in tables or figures must be numbered according to the citation of the table or figure in the text.

Each journal reference must include: names of all authors (if there are more than 3 authors, list the first 3 and then add "et al"), complete article title, name of journal, volume number, issue number, full inclusive page range, and an indication if it is a letter, editorial, or abstract. Use the reference style of *Applied Radiology* (examples below; for further examples, consult the *AMA Manual of Style*). Use the journal title abbreviations used by the National Library of Medicine in *Index Medicus* and on Medline. If in doubt of the proper abbreviation, include the full journal title. Cutting and pasting reference information from on-line sources is likely to result in incorrect and varying formatting and style. Please check that references are formatted as described above.

**Figures** Articles should include no more than 20 individual images. All figures must be cited in text, numbered in order of first appearance in the article (Figure 1, Figure 2, etc.). Please annotate images appropriately to point out key areas and cite annotations of the figures (arrow, circle, etc.) in the legend.

**Digital images** Submit images in TIF, JPG, or PNG format at high resolution (300 dpi resolution at 5 inches wide is ideal). Each image should be named by figure number and the corresponding author name before the ".tif" or ".jpg" or "png." ending (eg, "Smith \_figure01A.tif"). **Do not** supply images taken from Web sites as these will not provide publication-quality images. Also, **do not** embed images in Word or PowerPoint documents. They cannot be used that way. If your images are too large to email, you may ZIP them and upload them to: <u>https://www.hightail.com/u/Applied-Radiology</u>. Be sure to include the corresponding author's name and the article title in your message to us. **Figure Legends** A legend must be submitted for each figure. The legend should describe the appearance/relevance of the figure clearly, without unnecessary duplication of article text. Also, each legend must identify each image included in the figure (figure 1A, 1B, etc.) as well as any abbreviations, arrows, or other markers included in the image.

**Tables** All tables must be cited in text, numbered in order of first appearance in the article (Table 1, Table 2, etc.). All tables should be submitted in a separate file from the rest of the manuscript. Indicate appropriate table title and define all abbreviations, symbols, and footnotes used.

**Permission to Reprint** If any images, graphs, tables, etc., in the submitted article are to be reprinted from another source in an article, written permission must be obtained from the original publisher. *Such permission must be requested before submission to* **Applied Radiology**, *and must be received before the article can be published.* Proper credit, as required by the owner of the copyright, must be indicated in the figure legend or table footnote. **Product Information** Whenever an author has used specific products (scanner, contrast media, etc.) to collect data or produce images used in the article, this must be indicated. The author must provide the brand name of the product, the name of the manufacturing company, and the company's location. We request that the author also create a list of products (including the manufacturing companies and company locations) and include this list at the beginning or end of the manuscript file.

**Copyright Assignment** Once an article is accepted for publication, all authors must sign the Copyright Assignment form. Accepted manuscripts become the property of the Anderson Publishing, Ltd., publisher of *Applied Radiology*. The assignment of rights to Anderson Publishing includes, but is not limited to, rights to edit, publish, reproduce, distribute copies, and publish in electronic form or other media. Authors retain the right to revise, adapt, prepare derivative works, present orally, or distribute the article, provided notice of copyright is given.
