Entomologist. While ACE certification is not equivalent to an entomology degree, it is the U.S. standard for pest management professionalism. ACE is the most respected indicator of professional achievement in the pest management industry and is rapidly becoming the benchmark for pest management around the world.

What do I need to know to become an ACE?

The ACE exam is designed to test pest management professionals on the practical aspects of applied entomology in urban settings. The major categories of competency covered by the exam are below (*additional information can be found online and on page 6*):

- Monitoring (12% of exam)
- Inspection and Identification (45% of exam)
- Selection/Implementation of Control Methods (28% of exam)
- Evaluation (15% of exam)

You will need knowledge of the most prevalent insects and related arthropods found in urban settings around the world. You can find a detailed list of the specific pests online at www.entocert.org/ace-certification:

- Biting and Stinging Pests
- Ants (Family Formicidae)
- Stored Product and Fabric Pests
- Occasional Invaders/General Household Pests
- Flies
- Cockroaches
- Wood Destroying Insects
- Common Commensal Pests (Non-arthropod)*

* Non-arthropod pests are only covered by the ACE and ACE-I exams to the extent that they can harbor arthropod pests.





Which ACE is right for you ... ACE or ACE-I?

The ACE program started in the U.S. in 2004 as a credentialing program exclusively for U.S.A. pest professionals. In 2014 an international program was added and ACE is now available to pest management professionals worldwide. Read below to determine which program is right for you. Both programs certify your basic knowledge of urban entomology and both certify your knowledge of pesticide safety. The U.S.A. ACE program is designed for pest management professionals living and working in the United States. For this program, pesticide safety training is validated largely by requiring a current pesticide applicators license. For ACE-International, pesticide safety training is validated by requiring an additional examination that focuses entirely on pesticide safety.

ACE is right for you if you...

- Hold a current U.S.A.-based pesticide applicators license that allows you to apply pesticides without supervision (or the highest license in your state), and
- Have at least five years' pest management experience in the United States

If you apply for the U.S.A. version of ACE, you will need to....

- · Complete and submit this application,
- Submit two professional reference letters,
- Submit a copy of your state, tribal, or military applicator's license that allows you to apply pesticides without supervision (or the highest license allowed in your state),
- Document at least a 5 year work history,
- Abide by the ACE Code of Ethics, and
- Take and pass one ACE examination on your knowledge of urban entomology.



ACE-International is right for you if you...

- Have at least five years' pest management experience,
- Are not a permanent resident of the United States at the time of application to ACE-I, and
- Do not possess a U.S.A.-based pesticide applicators license

If you apply for ACE (International), you will need to.....

- · Complete and submit this application,
- Document at least a 5 year work history,
- Submit two professional reference letters,
- Abide by the ACE Code of Ethics,
- Take and pass an ACE examination on your knowledge of urban entomology, and
- Take and pass an ACE examination on your knowledge of pesticide safety.
- ACE-I applicants are also encouraged to supply copies of any business or pesticide applicator licenses held.



How do I get started?


Start by completing the attached application. Once your ACE application is approved, it is valid for a three year period. During this period you are permitted to take the ACE exam(s) as many times as needed, waiting from 3 to 12 months between any unsuccessful attempts. As soon as you pass the exam(s) you are ACE certified until 3 years from your ACE application approval date. Applications must include:

- Applicant contact information
- Adherence to the ACE Code of Ethics
- Payment of the application fee

- Copy of any pest control licenses*
 - 2 professional reference letters
 - Work history/CV/resume

*All U.S.A. applicants are <u>required</u> to submit a copy of <u>at least</u> one state, federal, or tribal pesticide applicators license. International applicants should provide a copy of any type of pesticide or business certification or license held.





What do I study?

IPM for the Urban Professional is the official ACE study guide and it may be purchased at a discounted rate with this application. Applicants are encouraged to thoroughly read/understand the guide or similar reference material, especially the *NPMA Field Guide to Structural Pests*. The ESA Certification Board recommends a minimum of 40 hours of self-study prior to attempting the exam. Some state and national pest control associations offer ACE review courses. Consult the certification website to find if one will be held near you soon (www.entocert.org). As soon as you are ready, choose a proctor and schedule your test with ESA. Application and Exam Details

An ACE application is valid for 3 years from acceptance. Your first attempt at the exam must occur within 1 year of application. If successful, you will be immediately ACE-certified until the end of the 3-year period. If you need to re-test you must wait between 3 and 12 months to re-test and a fee will be required to re-test. If you have not passed the exam(s) within 3 years the application expires.

All exams are to be proctored by someone with whom you have no conflict of interest. See www.entocert.org/select_proctor for details. Many applicants take the exam as part of a prep course. Submit this application. Details online at www.entocert.org/ACEapplication.

2) Get approved via email

Once approved, you have up to one year to sit for your exam(s) and up to three years to pass the exam(s).

3) Study for your exam(s)

Study on your own or with a prep course. Find resources online at www.entocert.org/ACEstudy.

4) Take exams with a proctor

Coordinate your exam date with ESA HQ and your proctor. Take your exam(s) online and your unofficial score will display on the screen. Official scores will follow via email within approximately one week.

5) Maintain your certification

Renewals are for three years and must include documentation of continuing education units (CEUs) earned.


