IMPORTANT NOTICE ABOUT NEW CARPARKING ARRANGEMENTS FOR RINGWOOD CHURCH OF CHRIST Monday - Friday

Please note that there will be a permanent change to our private church car park. We are finding that there are increased incidences of people using our car park who are unauthorised. This has a flow on effect, causing the church challenges as we do not have enough parking for the people who attend the activities at the church that run through the weekdays.

Having considered our alternatives, we regrettably will be implementing a 4 hour parking restriction on both the Bedford Road and Pitt Street car parks during the hours of 8.00am to 6.00pm, Monday through Friday. The car park will be managed by the Maroondah City Council, and if you are not displaying a current and valid parking permit on your dashboard you will be fined by the Council.

You will need to request an "Application to apply for a Car Parking Permit" from the church office if you use the carpark to commute to the city on a regular basis, (3 or more times a week). This will be free to regular church attenders.

Please note this does not automatically assume a permit will be granted, as there are many factors which will need consideration. We will do our best to respond to each application as soon as we are able. It will mean that your application will need to be handed into the church office by no later than the 10th October, 2014 so that we may give due consideration to all applications.

If you volunteer at the church, which may extend your carparking requirements to in excess of 4 hours, you will be supplied with a volunteers' carparking permit (eg. for Oasis meals and/or Op Shop), and we will be requesting registration details, etc. If you have any questions about this please contact the church office.

If you are planning on only using the carpark from time to time for more than 4 hours at a time, you will need to obtain a temporary permit from the office (during church office hours 9-5) for each occurrence. These will only be valid for each single occasion, and cannot be used for more than the noted period of time on the permit. Please note for Seniors Outings, a temporary day permit will be supplied to drivers on arrival at the church.

Where a permit has been issued, this will only be done on the condition that Ringwood Church of Christ will be able to request that cars are not parked on the church property on the occasions where all parking will be required for funerals, special occasions.

A SIGNIFICANT TRANSITION FOR THE MINISTRY OF RAHAB'S ROOM

More than ten years ago, God powerfully called Nicole White to a ministry to people with mental health and addiction issues. This incredible ministry, "Rahab's Room", has operated since that time with Ringwood Church of Christ as its base and Nicole as the Ministry Co-ordinator. Since 2007, Nicole has been employed by the church for one day a week.

Nicole has been amazingly faithful in this calling – providing spiritual and pastoral care for many vulnerable people. Nicole co-ordinates the weekly service, prayer groups, social outings and is always there to provide care and support.

With the introduction of the new constitution, a new agreement (including Vic/Tas Churches of Christ Conference documentation regarding the professional practice, ongoing health and formation of ministers and ministry) has been created for everyone in a paid or voluntary position in the ministry team. After ongoing consultation and discussion with the elders over a number of months, Nicole has made the decision not to enter into the new employee agreement and to resign from her ministry position, effective from 28th September 2014.

Nicole has also decided to relocate the ministry of Rahab's Room away from Ringwood Church of Christ to an independent venue, removing it from under the authority and leadership of this church. A short transition will occur with Nicole leading Rahab's Room in a voluntary capacity until 19th October 2014, which is the last meeting date for Rahab's Room at Ringwood Church of Christ. After this move, Rahab's Room members will be encouraged by Nicole to continue attending Ringwood Church of Christ church services and Oasis Meals ministry.

As an eldership, we have recommended other courses of action with regards to the ongoing ministry of Rahab's Room and Nicole's leadership here at Ringwood, but agreement was not able to be reached.

This has been a difficult and sad time for all involved. As a church we continue to pray for all those who are part of Rahab's Room. We also pray for the White family as they continue to navigate through enormously challenging issues arising from Gary's illness. May we all be prayerful and support the White family as valued members of our church community at Ringwood.

Share a cuppa, Be welcoming, Be creative and inventive in our hospitality (Keep on loving one another as brothers and sisters. Do not forget to show hospitality to strangers, for by so doing some people have shown hospitality to angels without knowing it. Hebrews 13:1,2).

Be a constant positive influence, Take time to care, Offer to pray, Introduce people to the Creator of love, Be prepared to leave our comfort zone, Be sacrificial, Seek to discover beauty in everyone, May we "...act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God" (Micah 6:8) and may we Anticipate God speaking to us and speaking through us.

Let's continue to be prayerful about our role in sharing Jesus with those with whom we rub shoulders. As John Sharpe says, we are the nerve endings of the Kingdom, in touch with the people that God desires to see come into relationship with Him.
