On November 19, 2009, Elk Township along with over 440 local police departments and sheriff departments in all of New Jersey's 21 counties hosted collection sites for Operation Medicine Cabinet. New Jersey was the first state in the nation to coordinate a statewide effort to rid homes of unwanted and unneeded prescription drugs of all types. Many local and statewide prevention and enforcement organizations participated in the operation. Operation Medicine Cabinet New Jersey was deemed a huge success. Over 9,000 pounds of prescription and over-the-counter medicine was collected within the state and turned over to the DEA Newark Division, for disposal. Residents are reminded that you can turn in any unused or unwanted prescription medication to us at any time to be destroyed. Prescription drug abuse is on the rise and parents must understand that the majority of juveniles that abuse prescription medication report that they obtained them from their parent's medicine cabinets within their own home. We as parents have to educate ourselves on how to prevent these medications from falling into the hands of our children. The following organizations have a lot of information available on their websites to help educate the public about prescription drug abuse: The New Jersey Poison Control Center, Partnership for a Drug Free America, The Office of National Drug Control Policy and the National Institute on Drug Abuse. The Drug Enforcement Administration has a downloadable, full color guide on their website called "Prescription for Disaster", to help educate parents on what to look for and how to keep our children drug free. Licenses can also be purchased by mail.

Put your check or money order in a self addressed envelope along with a copy of the rabies certificate and mail them to the clerk's office. License(s) will be returned to you by mail. Please send the attached registration form with your payment.

An after hour drop has been installed in front of the municipal building. Follow the directions for a license by mail.

Environmental Commission Update:

With grant money received from the NJDEP, the ETEC installed nine (9) educational plaques (see right) along the Elephant Swamp Recreational Trail this fall. These plaques provide photos and educational information about the variety of plants, shrubs, trees, birds, wildlife, frogs, and reptiles that can be found along the trail and throughout Elephant Swamp. They have been installed at particular viewing locations corresponding with the Trail Guide prepared earlier this year (a copy of the Trail Guide can be obtained from the Township website). We are especially excited about these beautiful plaques and the educational information they provide about plants and wildlife in Elephant Swamp. We encourage for residents, children, and outdoor/wildlife enthusiasts to look for these plaques the next time you take a stroll, hike, jog, or ride along the trail.

The ETEC will be installing distance markers, benches, signs, additional stone and another gate at the trail this winter and next spring, and is in need of volunteers to help. Additionally, the ETEC is hoping to schedule a Community
