



Porsche Selects Monterey Car Festivities To Unveil New Panamera in North America



944 SPEC/SP1 Build, Part 4:

Suspension

Ok so let's face it....the 8V 944NA just isn't fast in a straight line. No matter what you do to the motor (without spending a fortune), the car is going to get pulled down the straight by most vehicles. What the 944 can do though, is out-corner the vast majority of cars on the track. With a near 50/50 front to back weight balance, the car glides through corners with ease. With a little better suspension under the car, you will find a SPEC 944 eating up the rear bumpers of many faster turbo cars going through the corners. This car is a momentum car in that you don't use the brakes a whole lot. The cars are so light and nimble in SPEC/SP1 configuration, that when you turn the wheel, the car goes where it is pointed with little resistance. So while the big horsepower cars hammer it down the straight, they end up having to brake hard going into a turn because they are usually big heavy pigs. The 944 keeps that momentum going, and catches right back up to the big horsepower cars once they hit the turns. In PCA Stock Class racing, the guy who can spend the most money and buy the most expensive new suspension is probably going to get through the corners faster than his competitor. In the SPEC/ SP1 series though, you are only allowed a certain affordable suspension to keep everyone equal.

First we will talk about the shocks and struts. Standard Koni (preferred) or Bilstein (still allowed) stock replacement shocks are required. These would be the same shocks you would find in the Porsche Sport Suspension Option (M474). The fronts can have the housings modified to allow for a stiffer spring and adjustable ride height. The rear must be a standard shock, without coilovers. Torsion bars are free to be upgraded (though they must be retained), and you will find most people go with a 30mm bar, which will help to stiffen up the rear over the stock 23.5mm bar. That takes the effective rate from roughly 126lbs to around 335lbs,

which is a nice stiff increase. You will find guys running 350-400lb front springs as well. When you install the new bars, you will want to lower the car as far as you can get away with. No more 4x4 ride height, this is a race car, so get that weight as close to the ground as you can. When you have to start building special ramps to get the car on your trailer, then you know the car is at the right height. The Koni and Koni conversion kits can be had from various vendors including Paragon Products and Ground Control.

One of the other crucial items in the suspension are sway bars. Sway bars are open to change, as long as they are NOT cockpit adjustable. You can upgrade to 951 sway bars, 968 MO30 sway bars, Weltmeister sway bars, etc. I find the Weltmeister bars are the best bang for the buck. They are more expensive than the OEM MO30 bars, but they are also adjustable front and rear for stiffness. This makes a big difference when setting the car up. The MO30 968 bars are 30mm front with a 19mm 3 setting adjustable rear. The Weltmeister bars are 28mm front and 22mm rear, fully adjustable.

While the SPEC/SP1 series do not allow for solid bushings (which can be very expensive), they do allow for use of delrin bushings. OEM rubber bushings are subjected to breaking down with age and heat, but also swell when contaminated with oil. If you have owned a 944 in the past, you are probably aware that at some point, the car is going to leak oil or power steering fluid. While these leaks need to be fixed to race, it doesn't take much leaking to cover a rubber bushing and cause it to swell very quickly. The delrin is a much harder material that will not flex like the stock rubber bushings, so the more you can install, the stiffer the car is going to be. Delrin is also fairly affordable when you price them against the stock OEM bushings. So if you are in there and replacing the 20 year old rubber bushings, upgrade to the delrin, you'll thank me later.

For those running an early car with the early steel control arms, I highly recommend box welding the arms to increase their strength. Stock arms under extreme cornering are subjected to a lot of stress, and the steel will bend eventually. Box welding involves taking a strip of steel and welding it around the edge of the control arm. Also make sure your ball joints are replaced on a regular basis. Hopefully the SPEC series will allow aftermarket control arms with beefier ball joints in the future. Having seen stock ball joints sheer in half, as well as come out of the late aluminum control arms, safety can be an issue with the stock arms. The nice thing with the steel control arms is that the ball joints are cheap and easily replaceable, so these should be inspected and replaced on a regular basis. This is not nearly as easy with the later aluminum control arms. Factory 968 caster blocks may be used which eliminate a significant portion of rubber versus the early caster blocks.

Now that we have covered the basic suspension components, we are left with the wheels and tires. Due to a tire contingency program, SPEC and SP1 cars must run Toyo R888 tires on stock 15" phone dial or cookie cutter rims. NASA has also allowed drivers to use up any of their old Toyo RA1 tires which were previously allowed, so they can use up those old tires in the basement. Toyo awards money towards new tires to certain finishing positions in a race. In order to qualify for contingency money, the car must have at least 4 Toyo stickers on the body. Wheel assignment is based on affordable 15" OEM rims, which gives you cookie cutters and phone dials. 15" Fuchs, while OEM and available for years, are not allowed due to decreased weight and the fact that they are usually fairly expensive to obtain. You can pick up a set of 15" phone dials or cookie cutters in rough "track" condition for \$150-200.

In regards to brakes, any brake pad may be used, stainless steel lines are allowed, brake ducting from the front bumper is allowed, and stock brake rotors must be used.
