

Application for Directed Study

Definition:

A Directed Study is designed for highly qualified students who, under the direction of a member of the sponsoring academic department, engage in an agreed upon in-depth independent examination, investigation, and analysis of a specialized topic.

Eligibility (students must meet one or more of the following):

- 1. A 3.0 cumulative grade point average, or
- 2. A 3.3 cumulative grade point average for the previous two semesters, or
- 3. A 3.3 cumulative grade point average in at least 12 credit hours in the curriculum area (Humanities, Social Science, Math/Science, Major Field) in which the Direct Study is to be done. The academic department is responsible for verifying the student's record with the Registrar.

Limitations:

- 1. A student may not take more than two Directed Study courses in any Department.
- 2. A student may not take more than two Directed Study courses in any semester.
- 3. Directed Study courses may only be used for credit as **elective courses**.
- 4. A student and the faculty supervisor develop a written proposal to be approved by Faculty Supervisor,

Department Chair, and the appropriate Associate Dean (Arts and Science or Business). This, along with the approved application form and a copy of the student's transcript, are filed as follows:

- Original to the Registrar
- Copy to the Associate Dean (Arts and Science or Business)
- Copy to the Faculty Supervisor
- Copy to the Department Chair
