Rich South – High School Senior Scholarship Criteria

All candidates for the Rich South Scholarship must meet the following criteria:

1. Submit a complete Scholarship Application by **Thursday, April 2, 2015**.
2. Write a 300 word or more essay clearly stating how the requirements of the category for which you are applying were successfully met. Applicants should include what their experience has taught them or how it has prepared them for the next phase of their life. They should also include how they plan to use the scholarship.
3. Graduating High School Senior, one award per student.
4. Cumulative Grade Point Average of 2.5 or better. Copy of an official high school transcript and for the Citizenship category an attendance record is also required. Resume (optional).
5. Letter of acceptance or proof of enrollment at an accredited college or vocational trade school. “This is a must”

Parents/Guardian of applicants must have PTSO membership dues paid in full by October 31, 2014, and Parents must have proof of volunteering for 4 PTSO sponsored/school supported activities by May 14, 2015.

2014/2015 APPLICATION

Rich South PTSO Scholarship is awarded to graduating high school seniors. Listed below are the categories the committee will consider: academic performance, civic performance, innovation performance, citizenship performance and non-traditional performance. Students can apply for all categories but only one scholarship will be awarded. To receive a scholarship, students must obtain an acceptance letter from the Offices of the Registrar from an accredited college or vocational trade school during the 2014/2015 school year stating that you are enrolled full-time for the 2015-2016 school year. The verification letter must have the raised school stamp from the Offices of the Registrar. When all information is received your scholarship will be given to you.

Application Deadline

1. Applications must be returned no later than April 2, 2015.
2. Late and incomplete applications will not be considered.
3. Applicants are responsible for returning the entire completed application to the MAIN OFFICE PTSO BOX or Counselor.
4. Please read and follow all instructions. Please put your complete name on all paperwork.

Essay Requirements

- In 300 words or more on a separate sheet of paper clearly state the scholarship category for which you are applying with an explanation of how the requirements were successfully met.
- Essay should include what your experience has taught you or how it has prepared you for the next phase of your life. Also, include how you plan to use the scholarship.
- Essay must be typed, double-spaced, Times Roman, 12 font, 1 inch margins.

Scholarship Categories

Academics

1. Student exhibits academic excellence in course work, maintaining a GPA of 3.5 or better.
2. Student is involved in at least two extracurricular school activities.
3. Student should provide three teacher references to attest to the above (participation and quality of contribution).

Civic

1. Student has community involvement in three projects over high school life for which no pay was received (which may or may not involve Rich South – i.e. hospital/nursing home volunteer, tutor, volunteer at area shelter, church ministry, village peer mediator, big brother/big sister, assisting elderly/disabled, etc.).
2. Student has maintained a GPA of 2.5 or better.
3. Student should provide three community or Rich South H.S. references to attest to the above.

Innovation

1. Student has proven record of creativity within Rich South H.S. promoting the school and its reputation, its continued viability and student/staff morale. Examples include creating banners/posters for special event, designing logos for school, creating newsletter, initiating fundraising effort for special school cause, or etc.
2. Student has maintained a GPA of 2.5 or better.
3. Student should provide three letters of validation from teacher, counselor, church or social group.

Citizenship

1. Student is a positive role model to others concerning good conduct.
2. Student exhibits leadership qualities.
3. Student has maintained a GPA of 2.5 or better.
4. Student has maintained a high standard of good behavior, excellent and noteworthy character, and moral values.
5. Student has an excellent attendance record. Less than six tardies and six unexcused absences per academic year. Attach attendance record (required).
6. Student should provide three community or Rich South H.S. references to attest to the above.

Non-Traditional

Any course of study not typically pursued by males or females, example: **male** studying Nursing, Paralegal, Radiology Tech, Dental Assisting, Medical Coding/Billing/Records, **female** studying Engineering, Electrician, Fire Fighter/Fire Science, Chef/Culinary Arts.

Also, any course of study not typically pursued in college –examples: Aircraft Mechanic, Graphic Arts, Web design, Fine Arts, Photography, Auto Technician, Veterinary Science, Mortuary Science, HVAC, EMT and etc.

1. Student is pursuing a non-traditional career choice.
2. Student exhibits leadership.
3. Student has maintained a GPA of 2.5 or better.
4. Student should provide letter of acceptance that will verify they are in the program.
5. Student should provide three community or Rich South H.S. references to attest to the above.
