Membership Application for Persons with Disabilities

CATAClub is a free membership program exclusively for CATA customers who have a disability — temporary or permanent — or are age 62 and older. **Only persons with a disability should complete this form.** Members with a temporary disability are issued an Annual CATAClub Card—good for the calendar year. Members with a permanent disability are issued a Lifetime CATAClub Card—valid up to 10 years, depending on when you apply. Both cards allow members to:

- Pay discounted cash fares on CATA services—Fixed-Route, Rural Service, Connector, Redi-Ride. When you board a bus, swipe the card on the farebox before you pay your fare.
- Purchase discounted multiple-ride passes for use on the services identified above.

Section 902 Definition of the Term Disability from U.S. Equal Opportunity Commission

“Disability” (statutory definition (Section 902.1)) means any person who **A.** Has a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities, **B.** Has a record of such an impairment or, **C.** Is regarded as having such an impairment, as used in this definition:

A. “Physical or mental impairment” means **1.** Any physiological disorder or condition, cosmetic disfigurement, or anatomical loss affecting one or more of the following body systems: neurological; musculoskeletal; special sense organs; respiratory, including speech organs; cardiovascular; reproductive; digestive; genito-urinary; hemic & lymphatic; skin; and endocrine; or **2.** Any mental or psychological disorder, such as mental retardation, organic brain syndrome, emotional or mental illness, and specific learning disabilities. The term “physical or mental impairment” includes, but is not limited to, such diseases and conditions as orthopedic, visual, speech, and hearing impairments; cerebral palsy; epilepsy; muscular dystrophy; multiple sclerosis; cancer, heart disease; mental retardation; emotional illness; drug addiction; and alcoholism. (Section 902.2)

“Major life activities” means functions such as caring for one’s self, performing manual tasks, walking, seeing, hearing, speaking, breathing, learning, and working. (Section 902.3)

B. “Has a record of such an impairment” means has a history of, or has been classified, or misclassified, as having a mental or physical impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities. (Section 902.7)

C. “Is regarded as having an impairment” means **1.** Has a physical or mental impairment that does not substantially limit major life activities but that is treated by a recipient as constituting such a limitation; **2.** Has a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits major life activity only as a result of the attitudes of others toward such an impairment; or **3.** Has none of the impairments set forth in paragraph **1** of this definition but is treated by a recipient as having such an impairment. (Section 902.8)
