1. The outgoing Lord Mayor, Oisin Quinn, opened the meeting by welcoming all the Members of the new City Council. He congratulated all Councillors who were reelected and those elected for the first time and said it was a wonderful achievement for them, that it was a credit to their supporters, friends, family and their parties. He thanked Councillors from the last Council, particularly the group leaders and his Labour Party colleagues. He said it was a great opportunity to serve the city and he offered commiserations to those who were not re-elected, which included himself and Deputy Lord Mayor, Henry Upton.

He said the outgoing Deputy Lord Mayor was a good friend and a great party colleague and had given the city great service. He thanked staff in the Mansion House paying particular tribute to Fanchea, Joanna, Margaret, Christine, Miriam, Ritchie, Liam, Ray, Jimmy, Noel and Ray Murray, the ADC. He said he enjoyed working with the Deputy Lord Mayor, Chief Executive, Owen Keegan, his team and all Dublin City Council staff, Community Groups, Residents Associations, volunteers, charities, Non Governmental Organisations, Sporting and Business Clubs, Embassies, Governments and State Agencies.

He thanked his family and friends for their support during the year. Among the many initiatives he was involved with were promoting Dublin as a Gateway to Europe for business, initiatives to include Mexico, Belfast and London, Freedom of the City, Family Friendly Initiatives, Streetfest proposal and other numerous activities. He wished the City Council Members every success in the future and said that the Lord Mayor will be 345th Lord Mayor to enter office.

2. It was then moved by Cllr. Nial Ring and seconded by Cllr. Gary Gannon "That Councillor Christy Burke is proposed for the office of Lord Mayor of the City of Dublin for the period from 6^h June, 2014 to continue in such office (subject to his death, resignation, disqualification, removal from office or otherwise ceasing to be a member of the City Council) until his successor shall have been elected at the Annual Meeting of the City Council in 2015". The motion was put and carried unanimously.

Christy Burke was declared elected Lord Mayor and he was invested with the Collar of SS and the Insignia of Office. The Members of the City Council, Chief Executive and staff all warmly congratulated the newly elected Lord Mayor. Lord Mayor Christy Burke then took the chair and thanked fellow Councillors for their support. He also thanked City Council staff and friends during his 29 years of office. He thanked Oisin Quinn for his help over 10 years and in his 12 months as Lord Mayor and he also thanked Henry Upton during his term in office. He paid tribute to family, friends, canvassers, former Councillors and the Inner City Helping Homeless Group in the gallery. He said he had four priorities during his term in office and they were housing, homelessness, illegal dumping and the need to speed up and get funds to deal with facilities for disabilities.

The outgoing Deputy Lord Mayor, Henry Upton thanked outgoing Lord Mayor, Oisin Quinn for his help and assistance over the last 12 months. He wished Lord Mayor, Christy Burke all the best for the coming year. He thanked staff in the Civic Offices, and gave particular thanks to Oonagh, Vincent, Brendan Kenny, Owen Keegan and staff in the Mansion House. He thanked his colleagues in the Labour Party, in particular Dermot Lacey, and congratulated the newly elected 6 Councillors in the Rathgar/Rathmines constituency and gave particular thanks to Councillors Mary

It was moved by Cllr. Kieran Binchy and seconded by Cllr. Naoise O Muirí. "That Councillor Paddy McCartan is proposed for the office of Deputy Lord Mayor of the City of Dublin for the period 15^h June, 2009 to continue in such office (subject to his death, resignation, disqualification, removal from office or otherwise ceasing to be a member of the City Council) until his successor shall have been elected at the Annual Meeting of the City Council in 2015".
