Sustainability Merit Badge

Here is the alternative that may be used in place of requirement 2a:

"Develop and implement a plan that attempts to reduce your family's water usage. As a family, discuss water usage. To aid in your discussion, if past water bills are available you may choose to examine a few. As a family, choose three ways to help reduce water consumption. Implement those ideas for one month. Share what you learn with your counselor, and tell how you think your plan affected your family's water usage."

The luncheon and lodge elections was attended by over 300 members (199 from Machek N'Gult and 105 from Royaneh) and marked the official start of the new "as yet to be named lodge" of the San Francisco Bay Area Council.

To commemorate the forming of Achewon Nimat Lodge we are holding a Lodge Banquet on December 13, 2014 exactly 50 years to the day of the merge. Update to BSA's <u>Alcohol, Tobacco,</u> <u>and Drug Use and</u> <u>Abuse</u> Policy

This includes the use of electronic cigarettes, personal vaporizers, or electronic nicotine delivery systems that simulate tobacco smoking.

All Scouting functions, meetings, and activities should be conducted on a smokefree basis, with smoking areas located away from all participants.

What is offered at Winter Camp Awareness?

Get all your boys ready to camp in the winter months! A MUST for all new Scouts, and a nice refresher course for you older boys. January 17, 2015. Winter camping is a fun activity that builds friendships as well as developing leadership and outdoor skills. However, this type of activity presents many hazards that would be difficult to overcome if the unit is not well prepared. At Winter Camp Awareness experienced Scouts teach classes covering the skills needed to provide any first aid that might be needed while snow camping as well as discussions concerning what to pack. The first aid class will cover details about diagnosing cold related illnesses and how to treat and prevent them in addition to covering other common first aid issues. Other classes will cover what type of snow camping equipment is needed on a group and an individual level, including things needed to sleep warm at night, necessary clothing to stay warm and dry during the day, types of stoves and fuel that work well in the snow and at high altitudes, and how to build snow shelters as well as choosing a snow shelter that works best for the conditions in which you find yourself.



When and Where will this Event take place?

Winter Camp Awareness will be help on January 17, 2015 on the USS Hornet Museum at 707 W. Hornet Ave in Alameda. The event fee includes all day access to the museum and all participants are encouraged to tour the ship following the day's training. The event fee is \$12.00 per participant. There will be an optional additional of \$5.00 for each participant desiring to purchase a lunch while on board.

Originally called the "Kearsarge", this aircraft carrier (CV-12) was renamed in 1942 to commemorate the loss of the original USS Hornet (CV-8) on October 27th of that year. The USS Hornet not only played a major role in the Pacific in WW II, but continued to serve in the Korean conflict as well as the Vietnam War and the Apollo space program before being decommissioned in 1970. From San Francisco and the Bay Bridge: Cross the Bay Bridge towards Oakland and follow the signs for I-880 South/San Jose/Alameda. Take the Broadway/Alameda exit and turn right at the bottom of the ramp onto 5th Street. Continue straight on 5th Street, remaining on street level. At the Broadway intersection, veer to your left to enter the Webster Street Tube (the Alameda entrance to the tunnel is under the freeway). Follow Alameda directions.

From San Jose and I-880 Northbound: Proceed toward downtown Oakland and take the Broadway exit. At the end of the ramp, follow the signs to Alameda, turning right on Broadway and then immediately turning right on 7th Street. Go two blocks to Webster Street and turn right again, entering the Webster Tube (tunnel) to Alameda. (Alternate: Turn left on Broadway and left again to enter Tube under freeway overpass.) Follow Alameda directions.

From Sacramento and I-80 Westbound: Take I-880 south and take the Broadway/Alameda exit. At the end of the ramp turn right onto 5th Street. Stay in the right lane. Continue on 5th Street, staying on street level. At the Broadway intersection, veer to your left to enter the Webster Street Tube (the Alameda entrance to the tunnel is under the freeway). Follow Alameda directions.

From Walnut Creek and 24 Westbound: Take Highway 24 to I-980 to downtown Oakland. Take the 11th/12th Street exit onto Brush Street. Proceed to 7th Street and turn left onto 7th Street. Turn right on Webster Street which will take you into the Webster Tube (tunnel) to Alameda. Follow Alameda directions.

Alameda from the Webster Street Tube: After emerging from the Tube, follow the sign for Webster Street. At the corner of Webster and Atlantic, turn right onto Ralph Appezzatto Memorial Parkway and drive approximately one mile. Turn left onto Main Street and then turn right onto W Pacific Ave to enter the former naval air station. At the intersection of Skyhawk St, turn left and drive to the end of the street. Turn right onto W Hornet Ave and proceed towards the cluster of large ships. Parking is located across the street from the pier. (See Detour instructions in the event of Tube closure.)

Detour for Tube Closures: From I-880, take the 23rd Street exit. Follow the signs to Alameda and go over the Park Street Bridge. Turn right at Lincoln Avenue and proceed approximately 3.5 miles. Lincoln Ave will merge into Pacific Ave. Cross Main Street to enter the former naval air station. At the intersection of Skyhawk Street, turn left and drive to the end of the street. Turn right onto W Hornet Ave and proceed towards the cluster of large ships. Parking is located across the street from the pier.

From Oakland Airport: Follow Airport Drive out of the Airport and turn left on Doolittle Drive. This will lead over a bridge into Alameda and become Otis Drive. Proceed on Otis to Westline Drive/8th Street (end of road before park entrance) and turn right. Turn left on Central Avenue and follow the road approximately one mile and past Encinal High School. Turn left onto W Oriskany Ave to enter the former naval air station (a storage facility is on the corner). At the intersection of Skyhawk Street, turn left and drive to the end of the street. Turn right onto W Hornet Ave and proceed towards the cluster of large ships. Parking is located across the street from the pler.

The upcoming World Scout Jamboree in Yamaguchi City, Japan, promises to be one of the best ever.
