PROCEDURES AND TIME REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Participants must attend an event orientation session where they will:
 - Be given an overview of the event and the participant's responsibilities
 - Draw an identification number indicating order of participation (participant must wear number during event)
 - Review time schedule
- 2. Participants will remain in the holding room until the assigned presentation time and may not return to the holding room.
- 3. At the designated time, the individual participant will recite the creed from memory to the evaluators. There will be no time limit for this part.

Note: By memory means that once the participant has begun reciting the creed, he/she may not stop and start over.

- 4. Participants may not use note cards or other properties such as music or visuals.
- 5. The participant may not offer introductory remarks or concluding remarks other than the title.
- 6. At the conclusion of the creed presentation, the evaluators will ask the participant to answer three questions concerning the meaning of the creed and how the creed fits the participant's personal philosophy. There will be a three-minute time limit for questions and answers.
- 7. The decision of the evaluators is final.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- 1. Spectators may not observe this event.
- 2. Appropriate attire is FCCLA official dress.

SAMPLE QUESTIONS

- 1. How can one determine what is good and fair in today's society?
- 2. How is America's future dependent on the home?
- 3. What are values?
- 4. What are examples of old and precious values?
