Florida Department of Environmental **Protection: Pushing Boulders**



Drew Bartlett, Deputy Secretary Water Policy & Ecosystem Restoration Florida Department of Environmental Protection, Tallahassee

Drew Bartlett exercises general oversight over the State's Water Management Districts, and manages the Offices of Water Policy, Ecosystem Projects, and Coastal and Aquatic Managed Areas, and the Division of Environmental Assessment and Restoration (DEAR). Mr. Bartlett is responsible for carrying out the Department's role in implementing the Everglades Forever Act and in restoring America's Everglades, managing over 4 million acres of Florida's most valuable submerged lands, and implementing the Florida Watershed Restoration Act and the Clean Water Act for Florida. Mr. Bartlett previously served as Director of the Division of Environmental Assessment and Restoration. Under Mr. Bartlett's leadership in this position, the state implemented the most comprehensive nutrient water quality standards in the nation.
