Information required by Judge

- Tax return, most recent unless judge asks for more
- Current pay stubs for last 2 months
- 2. Make 2 copies of all completed forms. Each party keeps a copy for their records.
- 3. File the original completed forms at your local court.
- 4. Pay the <u>required fee</u> or submit the Request for Exemption from Payment of Fees, TF-920.
- 5. The court will give you a Domestic Relations Procedural Order when you file. This document is the first Order from the judge. Please read it carefully.
- 6. Wait for the court to schedule a hearing to put your agreement on the record.
- 7. Call the Family Law Self-Help Center with any questions at (907) 264-0851 or (866) 279-0851 (in Alaska, but outside the Municipality of Anchorage).

Parent Education: For cases involving child custody and visitation, you must:

- (1) watch the parent education video at the courthouse, or
- (2) complete the web-based class Children in Between.
