Honor Flight Benefit Breakfast - The Wenatchee FFA will be hosting a breakfast at Applebees from 8:00 -10:00 a.m. this Saturday, Nov. 22nd to benefit the Honor Flight program. Tickets are \$10, and can be purchased through FFA members, Mrs. Hammerberg in room 308, or can also be purchased at the door on Saturday. All proceeds will go to send WWII veterans to visit the WWII memorial in Washington DC. This is the FFA's second year participating in this program. Last year they were able to send four veterans to DC, having raised over \$4,000 for the Honor Flight.



- All juniors, beginning with the Class of 2016, will be taking the new Smarter Balance Assessment on a rotating schedule*

- The test will be administered in the auditorium and is a computerized assessment.
- Juniors will be taking this assessment whether or not they passed the HSPE or Math EOC. SBAC may substitute as students' graduation requirement for reading/writing & math, if standard is met.
