MEDINA COUNTY COMMISSIONERS Job Description Dog Warden Animal Shelter



SUMMARY

The Dog Warden works under the direction of the County Administrator. Develops policies and procedures for operation of facility and staff. Enforces statutes for regulation of licensing, ownership, and animal control. Warns owners and issues citations for animal violations pursuant to the Ohio Revised Code. Directs and supervises all county animal shelter employees.

PRINCIPLE DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- I. Directs and supervises operational activities of county animal shelter. Schedules staff, including prepares time sheets, monitors employee absences. Interviews, hires, disciplines and evaluates employee work performance. Prepares operational and staffing budgets. Maintains detailed information on upkeep of animals housed on daily basis; type of feed, amount, care of cages, routine sorting of animals to be destroyed and disposed. Collects and prepares lab samples for suspected rabid animals. Reports on number of dogs/cats housed or destroyed and licenses sold. Keeps detailed shelter operational to maintain budget requirements. Orders supplies and equipment. Time Spent: 40%
- II. Enforces statutes for regulation of licensing, ownership and animal control; warns owners and issues citations for animal violations pursuant to the Ohio Revised Code. Responsible for sale of animals; licenses and charging of pound fees. Maintains daily logs, takes phone calls and greets public. Maintains good public relations. Advises public regarding reclaim, relinquishing and adoption of animals. Destroys and disposes of animals when necessary. Conducts investigations of dog bite cases in conjunction with health department and monitors home quarantine for bite animals. Responds to animal complaint calls, seizes and impounds stray animals as required. Investigates and takes appropriate action to protect inhuman treatment of animals. Issues license warnings. Dispatches all calls. Attends meetings with local Humane Associations. Provides information on overpopulation of animals and what assistance is available to pet owners. Coordinates animal control activities and/or policies with various county and local agencies. Maintains clean vehicles. Attends Commissioner meetings. Time Spent: 55%
- III. Performs other duties as assigned. Time Spent: 5%
