DISTRICT 4 CONVENSION REPORT: It is the time of the year to vote in the USSVI National Elections. This year the voting will be done electronically by E-mail, for those of you who chose to vote by E-mail and by written ballot for the rest of you. The paper ballots went in the mail during the first week in July. If you did NOT receive one, please let me know and I will mail you one or you can pick one up at the August meeting. Let me encourage you to fill out your ballot and get to me ASAP. I asked earlier that if you did NOT intend to vote, to please let me know and I would see to it that you would not receive a paper ballot, thus saving USSVI about 75 cents per person. Since I didn't hear from you it means that you obviously intend to vote, SO PLEASE DO SO. If you chose to vote by E-mail and have NOT received your E-mail ballot, please let me know and I will check on it for you. I intend to vote for all of the candidates who are running "unopposed" and I intend to vote for Gordon Clark for National Secretary and George Boyle for Eastern Regional Director. I also intend to vote "YES" on ALL of the PA's to the Constitution and By-laws.

2004 ANNUAL SUBVETS WWII MEMORIL SERVICE:

This year's annual SUBVETs WWII Memorial Service at the Submarine Base, Kings Bay, Georgia will be 3-6 November 2004. If you plan on attending, you MUST fill out the Privacy Act Release Form and the Registration Form (attached to this newsletter) and mail it in along with your check. Each person attending must fill out the Forms. You MUST have your forms mailed in by 10 October. Rooms will be available at the Transient Visitor Quarters (TVQ) on the Submarine Base for \$15 per night. SUBVETs WWII have first priority for these rooms until 1 October. After 1 October, the remaining rooms will be available to USSVI members. The number to call is 912-573-8486. Base minutes for 5 June 2004:

ADOPT-A-ROAD PROGRAM: Update for this program was given at this meeting. An application and \$50 was sent in and a final application was received back for signatures. The Base Commander, to confirm that the base was still interested in this project, asked for a show of hands. Over 30 members raised their hands, a majority at this meeting. The Base Commander said that he would sign the final application and send it back. Edsel Wright is the Point of Contact (POC). More information to follow, along with training requirements before the Base can start.

PLASTIC MEMBERSHIP CARDS: During the year, when a new member joins our Base or when a member renews their membership, the Base Treasurer gives those members a paper membership card with their Snug Harbor Base number and year of membership printed on it. National is thinking about replacing the paper cards with a plastic one. National wanted to know what the Base members thought of this idea. After further discussion, it was not clear how National would handle the new year membership renewals. Upon further discussion, it was decided by the Base membership that we didn't care if National went to plastic membership cards or not. The Base Commander will relay the results to National.

2006 NATIONAL CONVENTION: The sponsor for the 2006 National convention has dropped out. Earlier, the Orlando Base had made a bid to sponsor a National convention but had lost to another Base. Our Base Commander asked the Orlando Base if they were interested in the 2006 opening. After some discussion, the Snug Harbor Base indicated that they were willing to help the Orlando Base, if the Orlando Base was willing to bid for 2006 and won. The Base Commander will contact the Orlando Base with this news.

SPACE-A-LODGING RULES HAVE CHANGED: This is a follow-up to the Space-A-Travel program. The Space-A-Travel program has been a big hit and as reported in earlier Newsletters, this program has been extended – indefinitely. Space-A-Travel has been opened more for military retired and families. Reservations can now be made up to 30 days in advance, with a reservation of up to three nights. This is obtainable as long as military facilities are available. Only 30 days a year can be used in this manner.

ANOTHER ADOPT-A-ROAD PROGRAM UPDATE: The final application was sent in soon after the 5 June meeting. The Base Commander waited three weeks but heard nothing. He called the program organization and at first they claimed that they did not receive the final application. The organization promised to send a second application. Later, the program organization call the Base Commander back and informed that they found the original application and would begin processing it.

2007 NATIONAL CONVENTION NEWS: The 2007 National convention will be held on a cruise ship that will go to Alaska. After the mail out, a general release of information will commence. So make your room reservations as soon as possible. CHANGES FROM LAST YEAR HAVE BEEN MADE. SO PLEASE READ THE FOLLOWING. Commanding Officer SUBASE will hold the memorial service at the SUBVET WWII Memorial Pavilion. He also has made the TVQ (Old BOQ) available for SUBVETS WWII & THEIR WIDOWS to reserve a room on the SUBASE. After 1 October reservations will open up to SUBVET INC members. NAVY BUS TRANSPORTION limited to hospitality room, museum and SUBASE locations. CMC SUBASE MCPO John Bradley, and the Chiefs on SUBASE will have the CPO CLUB open, as an on base SOCIAL ROOM. MCPO Bradley is also coordinating a golf outing on Thursday. Kings Bay Trident SUBVETs will have their HOSPITALITY ROOM, at the CUMBERLAND ISLAND INN & SUITES, (Old Family Hotel, new owners total renovation completed). SUBASE to have new Commanding Officer upon your arrival. SECURITY REQUIRMENTS. As with any submarine base, security is always required. more so since 911. As such this form is held until MAY, for the latest information concerning the SUBASE. I'm working with SUBASE personnel to assist them to obtain the required information they need to permit access to the annual event. To confirm identity I will use the National Organizations of SUBVETs WWII & SUBVETs INC membership lists. Widows need to provide the husbands name and ID, if known. You MUST be a U.S. Citizen to tour a Submarine. A Privacy Act Release Form is attached to obtain certain information. ONE PERSON PER FORM. Forms MUST be provided to me by 10 October so I can submit them to the SUBASE on 15 October, to generate an access list. EACH PERSON ENTERING THE SUBASE MUST HAVE A PHOTO ID, military, state issued or any other official type ID card with photo. Car vehicles, registered or not registered with SUBASE, are subject to full search, leave the guns & knives at home.

MEMORIAL PRE-REGISTRATION. Pre-registration fee pays for the general expenses for this event. Such as the early mail out of this form, wreath, rental expenses for High School Auditorium, even as a backup location, phone calls, postage, buffets, entertainment and some hospitality room expenses to name some items. Some people attend with out pre-registering. The more who pre-register, means we can pay for more items to make the trip more enjoyable, with more to offer. Those who don't preregister must arrange for their own access to SUBASE to attend the memorial.

DINNER PRE-REGISTRATION. Pre-registration fee pays for the caterer, dinner & the Clubs of Kings Bay rental fees and those other little expenses. There are no free dinners, except for the guest speaker & the duty drivers who drive you to the dinner. KINGS BAY TRIDENT (KBT) SUBVETS HOSPITALITY ROOM. The local Kings Bay Trident SUBVETs maintain this room. Most of the expenses are covered by the room operations. TVQ ROOM REGISTRATION. CO SUBASE has made available the reservation of rooms for this year's memorial. Room rates are \$15.00 per night. The Transient Visitors Quarters (TVQ), are located in the old BOQ on the SUBASE. About 130 rooms are available. Due to the limited number, only SUBVETs WWII & widows can make room reservations early. After 1 October. SUBVETs INC members & other SUBVETs can make reservations. Must have access to SUBASE with military ID card or on the pre-registration access list.

CPO CLUB. The Chiefs on the SUBASE have re-opened the Chiefs Club at the Clubs of Kings Bay in the Old Enlisted Bar. This will be open as a SOCIAL ROOM on the SUBASE; this will be convenient, especially for the SUBVETs staying on the SUBASE, TVQ or Navy Lodge.

SSBN and TRIDENT TRAINING FACILITY TOURS can be arranged by individual SUBVETs WWII Chapters and SUBVETs INC Bases throughout the year. You must coordinate directly with the SUBASE PAO Office at 912-573-4714. So, if you can't get on a tour this November, contact the Base PAO Tour Coordinator. Give yourself a few months to coordinate the tour. You will have to complete the same security requirements that I do. The person coordinating must have a military ID card. Bill Weisensee, Museum's President, and myself went to Middletown, CT. IN 2003, to bring Ben Bastura Submarine Library & Museum to St. Marys, in June. Ben departed on Eternal Patrol and willed his museum to us. His library has been combined with our library. We now have 26-4 drawer, file cabinets with history. To protect this one of a kind library, it is secured from general access. To view it you must coordinate with me prior to your visit. Even with all that, if you have typed your boats history, or patrol reports, into the computer, please bring a copy on a disk, or email me. 8xI0 or 8.5x11 photos of submarines are also desired. The directors have expended over \$8,500 to complete the move, with more expense to be discovered. If you wish to support the museum's work please make a donation. Please make check payable to St. Marvs Submarine Museum. St. Marys Submarine Museum is a nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization.

From Ben's library we discovered a copy of VADM Lockwood's official Submarine History. Two books submitted to the Naval Archives in 1946. Computer copies now on sale in the museum's Gift Shop.

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ARRI VAL OF USS RAZORBACK DELAYED:

The World War II-era submarine that is to be the centerpiece of a planned maritime museum on the Arkansas River should be on time for a Friday ceremony at Montgomery Point Lock and Dam but will not be in North Little Rock as planned for July 18. The lock and dam is to be dedicated this week, and organizers say the USS Razorback will be on hand. However, festivities that had been planned for the following Sunday in North Little Rock have been postponed, officials announced Saturday. "Due to concerns over the safe passage of the submarine up the Mississippi River and through several shallow patches on the Arkansas River, we are postponing the North Little Rock American Homecoming event," North Little Rock Mayor Patrick Hays said. "As soon as we have definitive information regarding her safe passage, we will announce an alternate date for later this summer for the grand homecoming."

Hays said he is "optimistic" that the sub will make it to the Montgomery Point Lock and Dam dedication. The submarine is drafting at 11.5 feet at its bow and at nearly 15 feet at its stern. Shallow portions of the Arkansas River are 9 feet. "Current water conditions are such that it would be risky to bring the submarine or any tow that is drafting more than 9 feet up the Arkansas River," Lee E. Bass of the Army Corps of Engineers said. "There are several shallow areas between North Little Rock and the Mississippi River."

He said the corps, at present can't guarantee safe passage of the sub, which was towed from Turkey to take its place in North Little Rock.

Hays said organizers are working with the Corps and the Coast Guard. "We are doing everything we can to make sure she arrives here safely. When she does arrive, we will be sure to have a grand homecoming," Hays said.

The Navy decommissioned the 312-foot vessel Nov. 30, 1970, and handed it over to the Turkish navy, which recently agreed after 2 1/2 years of negotiations to sell it to North Little Rock for \$1. The rusty, barnacled Razorback entered the Mississippi on July 3, towed by the same oceangoing tugboat that has been with it since its departure from Istanbul on May 5. The company that towed the submarine, Smith Maritime, is to have the craft in Rosedale by Wednesday. Difficult conditions on the Mississippi River led the crew to stop in Baton Rouge, La.

The crew estimates the submarine will pass by Natchez, Miss., by noon (11 July), and by Vicksburg, Miss., by noon on Monday (12 July), with an arrival in Rosedale, sometime early Wednesday (14 July) morning.

As of 22 July, the Submarine is still delayed due to issues not being resolved.
