13.2. Compliance Inspections

Ms B Bond: Does Council automatically inspect each development or, in the future, will it inspect each development, to ensure that there is compliance with the conditions attached to the development's approval as and when the conditions are due to be completed, particularly if there is a condition precedent before the development should proceed?

Each and every Development Plan Consent issued by Council officers at the City of Victor Harbor contains the following (or similar) condition: "*The development shall be in accordance with the plans and details submitted to and approved by Council as part of the application except as varied by any subsequent conditions imposed herein.*" This is the tool utilised by council officers to initiate, where necessary, reasonable steps to ensure the development takes place in accordance with the approved plans.

There is no requirement for such inspections, under the Development Act 1993. However, under that Act, relevant council officers are authorised to enter and inspect any land or building where the officers reasonably suspects that a provision of the Act is being breached. As a matter of routine, the inspection of Category 1 dwelling developments is carried out by building staff at either the footings, framing or roofing stage, to ensure compliance with the approved plans.

In the past, as a result of limited resources, Council officers have come across non-authorised development sites as a result of driving past the sites or through being notified by members of the public of the possibility of development being in breach of the Act.

However, Council staff have recently adopted a much more strategic approach to checking compliance with approved development applications. This has involved staff going back systematically through each Development Application lodged with Council, and utilising other resources such as rental lists and aerial photography, backed up by visits to individual sites, to check that what was built is what was actually approved. In those cases where there has been a discrepancy, applicants have been notified in writing and been asked to either explain the variation or undertake remediation works to ensure compliance.

Whilst this process has so far only involved Category 2 and Category 3 Development Applications, Council officers have now begun to broaden it to include changes to landuse that have not been authorised – for example, the conversion of a single two-storey dwelling into three independent living units, without authorisation; the keeping of animals on residential properties, without authorisation; large sheds built, without authorisation; and the use of land in residential zones for industrial purposes, without authorisation.

The engagement of Mr Wallace's services includes a time commitment for preparation, travelling, attendance and reporting back to Council. Costs incurred to date have included:-

- June 2007 Briefing, preparation, communications (written, email and phone) and presentation to Council on performance review methodology for a CEO \$1,320 (inc GST) . These are once-off costs for the establishment of a new process and methodology.
- July 2007 Performance Review participation and goal setting in relation to the City Manager - \$440 (inc GST)

Part (b) Workshop

August/September 2007 Council workshop to Review the Council Codes of Conduct - yet to be invoiced but confirmed to be \$726 (inc GST)

I am not aware of any other relevant associated costs. It is understood that Michael Barry of the Local Government Association, who accompanied Mr. Wallace in facilitating the workshop, will not incur Council any cost. Mr. Wallace had some communications with Norman Waterhouse Lawyers prior to the workshop but, given the minor nature of those communications, a charge is not expected.

In relation to the Residential (Hindmarsh Valley) PAR, the final draft variations are with Council and will be collated by the end of this week 28 September and expect final changes will be back with Principal Planner by 8 October 2007 with a report to Council on 22 October 2007.

Cr Ewens asked whether Council had undertaken a recycling review as a resident had questioned whether at some stage the kerbside recycling would be undertaken on a fortnightly cycle rather than monthly with the general rubbish collection also being fortnightly rather than weekly.

The Acting Director of Environment & Infrastructure Services responded that a review period was proposed and he would take the question on notice.

CR Rose questioned what measurement processes were in place to evaluation annual worth or return on spends from Tourism. Also whether there was some measurement against the expenditure relating to the FRD and Sea Change subscriptions.

The City Manager responded that in relation to the FRD and Sea Change, it was the responsibility of each organisation to their funding partners to produce an outcomes analysis, usually in the form of an annual report.

The Acting Director of Environment & Infrastructure Services indicated that DTEI were conducting a tree survey and it had been unfortunate that the trees had been marked and this was causing concern to local residents. The contact at DTEI had indicated that it was not the intention to cut these trees down – it was about management of trees not removing them.
