

Zoo Teen Volunteer Application

Application must be received by May 8, 2015 to be considered for the program.

Binder Park Zoo offers two Zoo Teen Programs each of which strive to provide our Zoo Teen's with a fun, educational and worthwhile summer experience at our zoo. Zoo Teens are required to volunteer a minimum of 50 hours between June and October 2015.

JUNIOR ZOOKEEPER PROGRAM:

Teens that opt for this program will work with our Animal Care Staff and will learn about basic animal husbandry (feeding and cleaning), care and well being of our zoo animals. Teens must be willing to work inside and outside, rain or shine and be willing to get dirty. Must get a current Tuberculin (TB) Skin Test (must be negative and administered within the last year to work with animals) upon acceptance into the program.

What qualities do we look for in a Junior Zookeeper?

- Trustworthy, reliable, and responsible
- Able to present a neat and well-groomed appearance
- Able to accept supervision of adults and ask for assistance when needed
- Courteous to his/her peers, the general public, volunteers and staff
- Willing to learn new skills and get his/her dirty
- Comfortable working with guests of all ages and backgrounds
- Able to demonstrate a positive attitude at all times
- Supportive of Binder Park Zoo's mission

What kind of effort is required?

Junior Zookeepers are required to perform many kinds of physical tasks which may include standing for prolonged periods of time, safe lifting, reaching, bending, climbing, kneeling, shoveling/raking, pushing/pulling objects, and handling/grasping objects.

Much of the work JZKs do takes place outside and in various weather conditions. In addition, many zoo buildings are not air-conditioned and can be uncomfortable and smelly during hot summer months. A Junior Zookeeper must be willing and able to work in these types of environments. Binder Park Zoo will make reasonable accommodations to allow the participation of individuals with physical limitations.

Other eligibility requirements

- Be available to attend an interview, if invited (Dates TBD).
- Be able to attend the mandatory Parent/Participant Orientation (Date TBD; usually early June).
- Be able to donate a minimum of 50 hours over the course of June-October. Have reliable transportation to and from the Zoo.
- Be willing to adhere to all Zoo Teen policies and procedures.
- Obtain a parent/legal guardian's written permission to apply for and participate in the Zoo Teen program.

JUNIOR ZOO EDUCATORS PROGRAM:

Teens that opt for this program will work with our Education Staff helping out with camps, birthday parties, overnights, bio-fact stations and public presentations. Teens need to feel comfortable around children and talking to the public.

What qualities do we look for in a Junior Zoo Educator?

- Trustworthy, reliable, and responsible
- Able to present a neat and well-groomed appearance
- Able to accept supervision of adults and ask for assistance when needed
- Courteous to his/her peers, the general public, volunteers and staff
- Willing to work with and around children
- Comfortable speaking to guests of all ages and backgrounds
- Able to demonstrate a positive attitude at all times
- Supportive of Binder Park Zoo's mission

What kind of effort is required?

Junior Zoo Educators are required to perform many kinds of physical tasks which may include standing for prolonged periods of time, safe lifting, reaching, bending, climbing, kneeling, pushing/pulling objects, handling/grasping objects and talking to various guests, camp participants and adult volunteers.

Much of the work JZEs do takes place outside and in various weather conditions. In addition, many of the summer camps spend a great deal of time outdoors walking around zoo grounds. Conditions can be uncomfortable during hot summer months. A Junior Zoo Educator must be willing and able to work in these types of environments. Binder Park Zoo will make reasonable accommodations to allow the participation of individuals with physical limitations.

Other eligibility requirements

- Be available to attend an interview, if invited (Dates TBD).
- Be able to attend the mandatory Parent/Participant Orientation (Date TBD; usually early June).
- Be able to donate a minimum of 50 hours over the course of June-October. Have reliable transportation to and from the Zoo.
- Be willing to adhere to all Zoo Teen policies and procedures.
- Obtain a parent/legal guardian's written permission to apply for and participate in the Zoo Teen program.
