

In Remembrance of Jane Faul



my first Belted Galloway cattle, I remember being introduced to a lovely woman named

Jane Faul from Battletown, Kentucky. She spent time asking about my cattle experience, about where my farm was located, and about what my plans were for my wonderful new cow and calf.

She was a fountain of information about the breed, the Belted Galloway Society and its member-ship. Before I left the sale, I had both her phone number and the con-tact information for the secretary, president and vice president of the Society. Having been involved previously in a breed with a large membership and large numbers of cattle, I was very impressed with the welcome I received from the Belted Gallo...

I met Jane again later that fall at Anderson Hill Farm in Vermont during the Annual General Meeting for the Belted Galloway Society. I was amazed that she remembered me from the previous spring and that she even remembered the name of the cow I purchased at the National Sale. She made sure I was introduced to other breeders and she was genuinely inter-

ested that I was benefiting from the meeting. At every event thereafter, I saw Jane talking to members new and old, and making sure people con-nected with others who had similar interests. Most of the work of the work she did was on a volunteer basis and required monumental hours. Of all the advocates for a breed of cattle, Jane was one of the best I have ever met!

Jane Faul December 29, 1934– September 27, 2014

Jane was born in Connecticut and lived in many places until she settled in Barrington, Illinois to raise her four children. Largely self-educated, she was an excellent wordsmith and she successfully built Faul Graphics, a typesetting company which expanded into a print shop. She joined the local Chamber of Commerce and served first as treasurer, then president. In 1981 her profile was included in a book called *Working From Home, The New Entrepreneurs* by Terri Tepper. Jane accompanied Terri and the two of them appeared in *Good Morning America* and several national radio programs as an example of a female entrepreneur who succeeded in an otherwise male-dominated industry. Jane retired to Paradise Bottom Farm outside of Battletown, Kentucky—and that is where her Belted Galloway story begins. There is

els and he considers it a great opportunity to work with the Council help grow the breed in the vast western part of the country.

Leanne Fogle (IL) and her husband, David, have maintained a beef herd for 30 years. During 1997, Belted Galloway cattle were purchased. Her goal is to breed highperforming Belted Galloway cattle that are powerful from the ground up, have tremendous rib shape and dimension, and maintain function in the pasture. Her farm, Wayside Valley, has participated in regional and national shows/sales over the years and they sell breeding stock, semen, and feeders. She was the former editor and recording secretary for the Great Lakes Belted Galloway Association. Since 2001, she has held the position of editor of the *U.S. Beltie News*. Leanne has served on the annual meeting, newsletter, advertising, show and executive committees. She is a contributor and writer for *The Belted Galloway Journal*.

Lisa Lovett (IL), and husband, Jeff, started Antietam Farm in 1997, where they raise Belted Galloway, Norwegian Fjord horses and chickens. They have a small herd of Belties consisting primarily of cow/calf pairs and some steers, showing Antietam cattle since 1999. Summers are busy producing hay on the farm and Lisa also enjoys riding, training, driving, and showing her horses. Lisa previously served as the membership registrar, and edited and produced the Great Lakes Belted Galloway Association newsletter. Lisa also served as an area youth leader and was the first superintendent for the Midwest Classic Show held in Pecatonica for four years. Lisa returns to the Belted Galloway Council and has served on the BGJA, newsletter, and show committees. Lisa is a proofreader for many Belted Galloway Society publications.

virtually no part of the Society that Jane did not work tirelessly to promote. Her two-plus decades with the Belted Galloway Society, Inc. were vital. Her work benefited the entire membership.

Jane served on Council during 1982-83 and again from 1989 to 1992. She hosted the annual meeting in1984 and was co-host in 1990. Her early energies established a 1990 Belted Galloway exhibit at the North American International Exhibition in Louisville, Kentucky and she later organized the NAILE Belted Galloway show which is now known as The Belted Galloway National Show.

We will always remember her best for her love of words. She edited, designed and published the U.S. Beltie News from the inception until 2001. Several editions of the Breeder's Handbook were compiled, designed and abridged solely by Jane. She worked as editor and ad solicitor of the Herd Book III covering the period of 1981-1991 and she was the driving force behind the production of all the early promotional literature for the Society. During 2003, she was awarded the prestigious Harry T. Burn Award for her outstanding contributions to the breed. Jane worked diligently on the project to institute a breed database and she subsequently worked to establish the five-generation pedigree printed on the back of the current registration/recordation certificate. Jane was integral in the planning of the Galloway Getaway U.S.A. 2004 held in Milwaukee, WI and she was also the past secretary/treasurer of the World Galloway Council.

Jane produced, designed and edited *Belties 2004-2009*. She was a forward thinker before the days of Facebook and she oversaw the Beltie Forum, an independent email discussion group about Belted Galloway cattle. She lived in Battletown, Kentucky at Paradise Bottom Farm, her 120-acre farm that was home to 20 or so Belted Galloway cattle. Foundational bloodlines included Aldermere, Sleepy Creek and Stonecroft. In the past decade she sold her cattle, and this gave her more free time to pursue other interests. Jane is survived by her children -- Liz, Brian, Marj, and Jon--and her granddaughter, Anika. Her passion was doing what she loved, and her dedication to the breed resonates in every facet of Belted Galloway history!
