CAMP DIRECTOR NICK TOTTA



Nick Totta became the William Woods University head men's basketball coach during the spring of 2010. Totta is the second men's basketball coach at William Woods. The program was founded in 2007.

In his fifth season, the Owls set a new school record for American Midwest Conference victories in a season. The Owls have also had two consecutive seasons with AMC postseason victories. The Owls had one player receive AMC-All-Conference recognition. They also had four players

named AMC All-Conference Academic team.

Totta came to William Woods from Avila University, where he served as head men's basketball coach from 1999 to 2004. During his time at Avila, Coach Totta produced 12 All-Conference players, one Heart of America Freshman and Newcomer of the Year, five academic All-HAAC players and two NAIA Scholar-Athletes. Coach Totta's 2001-02 team produced 24 victories and the university's first NAIA Top 25 ranking.

Totta served as an assistant men's basketball coach at Avila from 1998 to 1999 before taking the reigns as head coach. Prior to Avila, Totta was the head boys basketball coach at Canton High School (Canton, Mo.) from 1996 to 1998, where led his team to the 1997 and 1998 district finals. He was named Northeast Missouri Coach of the Year in 1998. Canton HS was also conference co-champion in 1997.

From 1990 to 1996, Totta was an assistant men's basketball coach at Culver-Stockton College. The Wildcats won the HAAC championship in 1991.

Coach Totta began his coaching career at White Rock High School (Burr Oak, Kan.), where he was the head boys basketball coach from 1989 to 1990.

Totta graduated from Ottawa University, where he was a point guard and shooting guard. He was All-Conference and team captain for two years. He finished third nationally for three point field goal percentage at 56.6 percent. He was over 50 percent from the three point range for his career. He was also named an Academic All-American his senior year.

STAFF MEMBERS

Members of the William Woods University coaching staff will serve as camp directors.

Area coaches will also serve as staff, along with some of the top Owls players as counselors and assistant coaches.

REGISTRATION

Enrollment will be limited to the first 72 campers. Registration application forms and \$50 deposit should be sent to Owls Basketball Camp, One University Avenue, Fulton, MO 65251, by **July 1, 2015**.

The remainder of the tuition will be due on opening day. Make checks payable to William Woods University.

INSURANCE AND MEDICAL CARE

The Owls basketball camp will NOT be responsible for any medical or other charges in connection with a camper's attendance.
