#### 2. Rules

Your office in home must either be: a)your principle place of work OR b) must be used on a regular and continuous basis to meet your clients. Furthermore, your expenses are prorated by dividing your business usage over the total square footage of your house.

If you are an employee, there is one test you must meet. Your employer must provide you with a signed T2200 - Declarations of Conditions of Employemnt that require you to have a home office.

For Proprietors, Office in Home expenses are dedeuctible to the extent you have income. Unused expenses can be carried forwarded used against future business income.
