• This is a reminder to parents about the importance of maintaining an accurate profile on shp.org, and a link to a video about how to do so.

• All grades and communication are funneled through <u>www.shp.org</u>, and NetClassroom. Consequently, it is critical that the profile of each member of a family is correct, and includes an email and a mobile phone number for emergency communications. This <u>video</u> will remind you about how to navigate <u>www.shp.org</u> and NetClassroom. You will also find your son's schedule of classes and assignments posted there. I would encourage parents to log in regularly to review their son's grades, and to reach out to teachers directly if you have any questions about your son's performance.

Dear Parent/Guardian:

On October 5, 2015 we will begin our annual screening program at the Prep. All students will be weighed, measured and have their blood pressure taken. Freshman and Juniors will have their vision tested. Sophomores and Seniors will have their hearing tested. Freshmen and Sophomores will be examined for scoliosis.

Scoliosis is a condition in which the spine may curve to the left or right. It is most commonly found during the time of rapid growth and may progress if not treated. The purpose of the screening is to recognize scoliosis in its earliest stage. This screening is required by law.

A pupil may be exempt from this examination if requested by a parent/guardian in writing. However, a doctor's certificate stating that the student has been examined by his doctor, and his findings must be received in my office prior to screening.

You may be present when your son is screened if you desire. If so, you will need to complete the form below so that you can be advised of the day and time to be present. Return the bottom tear off section ONLY if you wish to be present during the scoliosis screening of your son. I will set a time convenient to all three of us.

Please read, sign and return the Medical Information Release Form to me as soon as possible.

Dear Parent(s)/Guardian(s):

The Governor's Office has made a commitment for New Jersey to provide universal health insurance to children and affordable options for parents/guardians with the signing of new legislation. This law mandates that all children age 18 and under have health insurance.

The requirement for health insurance coverage can be met in a variety of ways: (1) through a health insurance plan provided by your employer; (2) through a health insurance policy you purchase directly; and (3) through NJ FamilyCare which provides free or low cost insurance for children and their parents/guardians. *Enrollment in school insurance ONLY does not satisfy this mandate*. For more information about NJ FamilyCare or to apply, please call 1-800-7010710 or visit www.njfamilycare.org.

Parents or guardians who earn too much to qualify for NJ FamilyCare can purchase health insurance for their children at reasonable rates through another program called NJ FamilyCare Advantage at 1-800-637-2997 or visit <u>www.horizonNJhealth.com</u>

As the law also requires, the New Jersey Department of Education is now assisting the New Jersey Department of Human Services in its efforts to identify uninsured children and to help families access free or low cost health insurance.
