On Friday, October 1, the seventh grade students will complete their health screenings and obtain a multitude of health information from various community health service agencies. Completing these screenings in one day prevents further classroom disruptions and promotes health awareness. Along with the screenings there will be speakers discussing nutrition, cardiovascular care, dangers of using illegal substances, and several other health related topics. Hocking Valley Hospital offers free cholesterol and blood sugar screenings for the student that has written permission. This is a great opportunity for our students to LEARN about current health trends, dangers, and strategies.

 - •Grade 5: Otis- Lennon School Ability Test, 8th edition (OLSAT 8)
 The OLSAT 8 is a test designed to assess student cognitive ability through measurement of abstract thinking and reasoning abilities.
 - •Grade 8: Explore

The EXPLORE is an achievement test designed to assess student knowledge in the areas of Math, Language Arts and Science.

These tests must be given due to House Bill 282, which requires school districts in the state of Ohio to use state approved instruments with national norms for the identification of gifted children. While the results help us to make decisions about enrichment placements, they also offer a very good overview of every student's academic progress.

Friendly Reminders from the office:

- •Please make sure your son or daughter brings a note to Student Services upon arrival for an *Early Dismissal* to be written. This will eliminate a parent having to wait when you come in to sign them out.
- •<u>ALL</u> Absences require a written form of documentation when your son or daughter returns to school. Documentation includes: doctor or dentist excuse, court appt. or written note from home explaining the absence.
- •Students who need **bus passes** are to drop the note off in the main office upon arrival. If a student is riding a bus home with another student, **BOTH students must submit a note** with parent permission.
- •PLEASE make sure phone messages are called to Student Services <u>BEFORE</u> 2:00. This will allow the office time to deliver the message to your son/daughter.

COUNSELORS' CORNER

Parent involvement in the middle school grades is just as important as it was in elementary school. Studies show that kids whose parents stay involved during these years do better in school. Following are some tips on how you can stay involved during the middle school years:

- •Go to school when you are invited. If your child plays in the band, go to the concert. If he's on a team, go to his games.
- •Learn who can help. Your child has several teachers. When you have a problem, you may not know which one to call. Here's a general rule of thumb—if your child has a problem in one class, ask to talk to that teacher. If the problem is in several classes or involves a personal problem or adjustment to the school, contact your child's school counselor—Mr. Jim Collins (A-K) at 385-8764, Ext. 2617 and Mrs. Kim Walker (L-Z) at 385-8764, Ext. 2618.
- •Learn how to get in touch with teachers. Some teachers are easy to reach by phone. Others prefer contact by email. Remember when emailing to put LHSD in the subject line.
- •Visit the school's website. Log on to www.loganhocking.k12.oh.us to check the school calendar or to get your child's homework assignments.
- •Schedule a parent/teacher conference. Face-to-face conferences are very beneficial, not only for the parent but for the teacher as well.
- •Read the LHMS Parent Newsletter. This is a good way for parents to stay abreast of important, upcoming events.
- •Volunteer. There are many opportunities at the middle school for parent volunteers. Contact the school office at 385-8764 for more information.
