2003 Cajun Spring Nationals

Fifty one competitors from all across our great nation, and one competitor from the UK arrived in Baton Rouge to take part in our now classic Spring opener match. Meteorologists had predicted mild temperatures, wind, and mostly cloudy skies, with the threat of thunderstorms for both match days. Match director Jack Kirkendoll held a shooter's meeting before the start of Saturday's Match. Half the shooters started on the deeply shaded Belle Terre (good earth) course, while the other half shot the Lagniappe (something extra) course. Each course was set up with the same Troyer difficulty factor (31) just in case the second day of the event needed to be cancelled due to inclement weather. Both courses consisted of 13 lanes. The first twelve lanes had two targets each, (4 shots), with the 13th lane having one dual kill zone, (4 shots), each hit worth 1/2 point. There was one standing lane on each course. Timers were utilized allowing 5 min. for 4 shots. The Saturday Match went smoothly, with only a few "cold lines" of short duration due mostly to reset line problems. Most all agreed that there was a good mix of easy, moderate, and difficult shots. The infamous 1/2" Crawfish conquered many a shooter, along with the 3/8" Bin Laden, and a 1" Bird set at 55 yards. The standing shots were a challenge to almost all, as well as the small kill zone component of the dual kill zone target.

At the end of Saturday's shooting, Doug Vinson led the Open Class with a 49/50, while Cliff Smith and Brad Troyer battled it out in the Piston Class with scores of 44 1/2 and 44, respectively. Shooters then enjoyed a fine Cajun meal of sausage and chicken jambalaya, tossed salad, kernel corn, a roll and brownies while seated under a canopy of live oaks, and visiting with their shooting friends.

On Saturday evening, many shooters responded to an open invitation to a get together at the home of Leon Purdin, a long time Marshall for BAC's Cajun Matches. Leon had been unable to Marshall for us in the recent years due to his devotion to his wife's failing health problems. All who attended had a great time, and were appreciative of Mr. Leon's southern hospitality.

On Sunday morning, shooters began arriving at the range shortly after daybreak, due to a 1 hour daylight savings time shift. The weather was overcast once again, so shooters were anxious to head into the woods to shoot. God blessed us with improving weather as the match progressed. Although an attempt was made to set both courses with equal difficulty, many shooters found the Belle Terre course harder due to darkness down the lanes. Once again, the match went smoothly, and as it neared completion, some shooters reported the wonderful aroma of Crawfish Etouffee being prepared on site as the morning breeze gently drifted their way.

Competitors anxiously waited in the scoreboard area to see how others fared in the 2nd and final round. As Linda Juneau and Elaine Zimmerer posted scores and rankings, lunch time was announced. Hungry shooters feasted on a springtime Cajun delicacy, crawfish etouffee, with Linda's carrot cake muffins for dessert. Jack Kirkendoll presented the awards, which were in the shape of an armadill-dillo field target. First place in the Open Class went to Eric Moe, with a hard earned score of 96. Bob Winer took 2nd place with a 94. Third place went to Doug Vinson, who shot 93%. Walt Roller trailed by a half point at 92 1/2 for 4th place. There was a 3 way tie for 5th place between Kevin Allen, Bill Isaac, and Wade Sutherland. Jack Kirkendoll compared their shooting performance on certain pre-designated lanes to determine the winner. And guess what? Their scores on those tough lanes were identical. When Jack then announced a shoot off on the Bin Laden target to settle the tie, the 3 shooters decided to flip a coin. Bill Isaac was the eventual winner.

Winners in the Piston Class were Brad Troyer in 1st place, with a fine score of 87%, Cliff Smith shot very well and finished 2nd at 85%, James Sumpter was 3rd, shooting an 82, Bill Greene took 4th place with 75 1/2 and Guy Omictin was right behind by a half point, to take 5th place at 75%.

Bob Winer won the highest scoring Senior Award, Jackie Damien earned the highest scoring Woman Award, the highest scoring Junior Award was won by Craig Daste, and the High Louisiana Shooter Award went to Perry Babin of Bayou Airgun Club

In the Manufacturers Team division, Team BKL was in 1st place. In the State Team division, Georgia was the winner.

Bob Winer sponsored the BKL Award, which was presented to the top piston gunner, Brad Troyer. Thanks Bob.

Ron Juneau donated an Upside Down Bat target, which was raffled off for the benefit of our AAFTA organization. Two hundred (\$244) dollars was presented to Cliff Smith, AAFTA Treasurer.

On behalf of Bayou Airgun Club, we would like to thank all who participated in our match and made it a success. To our friends who were not able to come, we missed you and hope you can make it next year. We extend special thanks to those who stayed after the match and helped to take down the course.

Also, we thank God for blessing our plans and for keeping the rain away, and for the privilege of living in America. We thank our President for his leadership and our armed forces for fighting to preserve the freedoms we enjoy today.

Field Target Match Review EFTCC@DCPA 1/26/2003 - Mid/Winter Off-Hand Only Match

This has been our 4th year running the Mid/Winter Off-Hand Only match and it has been our highest attend match to date. We had 24 shooters including 4 juniors. 1st time shooters with us were Bill Pratt, Mike Cohen and junior shooter Andrew McGee. The Juniors were all excited about the first match that would count for the Junior Club Championship Plaque and the 3 Field Target Prizes that go to the 2 top Juniors at the end of the season. I overheard a few of them already picking out which of the 3 Field Targets they wanted to claim. The season has a long way to go but it is good to see them so interested. Hopefully more juniors will join into the fray that will end at the last match of the Season, the NY State Championship.

EFTCC takes great pride in attempting to open up Field Target to a variety of shooters and there equipment. We have made sure that our targets will function properly when hit with a 10 meter gun all the way out to 55 yards. This can be seen by the accomplishment Paul Bishop made by missing only 2 shots through out the entire match shooting a stock P70JR at 565 FPS with FTS pellets for 6.1 FTLBs. (Paul graciously asked to not have his score counted just as Hans and Ray didn't count their scores) Even Paul was surprised when he knocked down the 45 yard Crow that only fell 9 times out of the 48 that it was shot at throughout the match. The other low powered shooter that toppled that target was Jock Elliott with an R7 shooting 615 FPS with FTS pellets for 7.2 FTLBs. That longest target at the match fell 19% of the shots fired upon it and 22% of the time that the target fell was

from low powered shooters. This builds a lot of confidence in the shooters as can be noted by the 4 adults and 2 Juniors that chose to shoot low powered guns even though many of them had Higher powered equipment. 3 R7s, a stock P70JR, HW30, and a QB79 CO2 10 meter gun were successfully used during the match. Take a closer look at Bob Ford's score and Equipment. Not only did he shoot low power but he shot with a fixed 3x21 power scope and his score still stayed way up in the pack. Just check out the scores by those shooters.

Other notables were that there were no Cold Lines, and the only target that came in question was from the first shot on a target. When I told the shooter to look for a split on the face through the scope, he clearly noticed the mark on the rim of the Face of the Hole. That is when he realized that a split can take paint off the center of the Kill Zone making you think that you had a clean hit when indeed he didn't.

A special thanks to Tom Owen and Paul Cray who helped us setup the match the day before and dig the targets deep into the snow. When the targets were down they were completely gone but there were clear views of all of the KZs no matter what the height of the shooter when they were up.

The White Snow Shoe Rabbits we put out were not as invisible as I thought they would be especially after a few people missed them.

Also thank you to all those that helped pick up the targets at the end of the match. It sure goes quickly with all those extra hands.

We used timers through out the match and everything moved very nicely. Everyone finished at almost the same time so there was no waiting at the end for any one squad as has happened in the past. No one timed out so the timers are really becoming a non issue as the shooters are getting more accustomed to shooting on the clock.

The awards were handed out and everyone was on there way by 1:30 in plenty of time to get home for the Super Bowl.

So if you have a gun that you shoot well—it doesn't matter the amount of power that it has or even the scope that you have on it—You can have a great time and can successfully shoot a Field Target match with us so..... Come on out and give it a go.
