### About SNV

Seoul National University (SNU) is and has been the indisputable leader of advanced education in Korea since its establishment in 1946. SNU has earned this reputation by maintaining the highest standards in both teaching and research. Kwanak Campus, the main campus of SNU, accommodates four graduate schools, eleven colleges, sixty- six research institutes, and other supporting facilities. Yeongeon campus is the medical campus including the University Hospital as well as other research institutes and organizations related to medical sciences. About 20,000 undergraduate students and 11,000 graduate students enroll at SNU every year. The faculty, consisting of 1800 professors and instructors from around the world, teaches students and conducts research at SNU.

# Seoul, the city of Soul!

Seoul is the capital of Korea with a history of 600 years. It always had been the nation's capital since Yi Dynasty which was founded in 1394 and it has become the center of administration, economic, business, culture, technology and education. Seoul has four distinctive seasons. Temperature shows large seasonal variation - reaching as high as 38.4 degrees Celsius in summer and dropping as low as minus 19.2 degrees Celsius in winter. The total area of Seoul is 605.52 square kilometers or 0.6 percent of the entire country and has a population of approx. 10,300,000 which accounts for about a quarter of the total national population. The number of foreign residents in Seoul is more than 130,000, consists of almost 100 different nationalities. They form a small global village in each part of Seoul. Seoul is truly a metropolitan city where tradition meets modernization.

## Road to SNU

SNU offers international students various ways of study, not only as degree-seeking students but also as short-term students such as exchange students, visiting students or joint/double degree students. A large number of international students in the past have enjoyed studying and grasping Korean culture at Korea's most prestigious university. Out of 31,000 students, more than 1,200 students are international students, and about 200 among them are international exchange/visiting students. These short-term staying students explore not only about Korea but also other neighboring Asian countries because of its geopolitical location. Many international students who studied at SNU have become academics or professional workers specializing in Asia in their own fields.

## • Exchange Student Program

Exchange program is for students in SNU's partner universities who wish to study at SNU for one or two semesters and transfer credits to their home institution. The first official student exchange program launched in 1995 with the University of Tokyo and the number of institutions where they agreed for student exchange program has increased to 170 institutions all over the world. To be an exchange student, candidates must be officially nominated by their home institution and pay the tuition fee at their home institution. Dormitories are provided and fees for taking Korean language course will be partially supported.

## • Visiting Student Program

Visiting student program is offered to students who are from non-partner universities but wants to study at SNU for one or two semesters. Students should pay the tuition fee at SNU and may request for credit transfer at their home institution. Dormitory is not available for visiting students and also subsidy for Korean language program is not provided. To apply for a visiting student program, student must apply directly at the Office of International Affairs, SNU.

# Application Criteria & Process

## 1. Eligibility

- √ Have a GPA 2.7 or above
- √ Language proficiency of either English or Korean is highly recommended, but not compulsory

#### Restriction

- $\sqrt{\text{ The College of Medicine}}$  is restricted to students who are currently studying medicine at their home university.
- $\sqrt{\text{The College of Dentistry}}$  is open ONLY to masters level students currently enrolled in a master program at School of Dentistry or equivalent at their home university. Student exchange program is NOT available at the undergraduate level for the College of Dentistry.
- $\sqrt{}$  Applicants, who apply for the **Korean History** major, must provide a proof of Korean language ability. A satisfactory level of Korean language ability should be either (1) Level 5 or above of official Korean Language Proficient Test or (2) Level 5 or above of the Korean Test conducted at the SNU Language Institute.

### Important

All documents should be submitted in **ORIGINAL** or verified as an official copy, and should be in Korean or in English. If your documents are not in Korean or in English, please have your document translated in Korean or in English and have confirmed and sealed by an authorized body. <u>Application documents are non-returnable once they have been submitted to the OIA</u>. Please be aware that we will be unable to continue processing your application if you do not submit **ALL** the required application documents.

## 4. Screening Procedure

The OIA receives applications and reviews that all application requirements have been met. The application packet is then forwarded to the screening committee of each college for an assessment. Not all candidates nominated by partner universities are successful, but some may fail to have an admission if the requirements do not meet the committee's expectation. When the acceptance is confirmed, the OIA notifies the result through students' home institution. The OIA is not responsible for the selection process and its results since the decision is made by each college.

### 5. Acceptance Package

The acceptance package will include Certificate of Admission, Course registration guideline & Course registration form, and other necessary information.

# Academics & Students Life

### 1. Academic Calendar

<sup>\*</sup> Academic transcript will be sent to home institution for exchange students for credit transfer in mid-August and in mid-February. Academic transcript for visiting students will not be sent to the home institution from the OIA and visiting students must request for an issuance of academic transcript at the Registrar's Office.

### 2. Courses

Majority of courses are taught in Korean but each college or department offers number of courses in English. List of courses for a new semester is available at the beginning of January or July each year. Undergraduate students can take courses up to 17 credits and graduate students can take up to 12 credits.

### 3. Housing

 $\sqrt{$  On-Campus Housing: The Gwanak campus is the main campus of the SNU. Most colleges and schools are located at the Gwanak campus except for the College of Medicine, which is located at the *Yeongun* campus in northern part of Seoul. Housing for exchange students is available at the Kwanaksa (Gwanak campus dormitory).

 $\sqrt{$  Off-Campus Housing: Off-campus housing is available around the campus. SNU does not provide an assistance to find off-campus housing and it is students' own responsibility to find accommodation outside campus.

### 4. Students Activities

SNU offers variety of students activities and sports clubs. Students clubs include musical bands, choir, orchestra, dance, painting, photography, students newspaper, traditional Korean music, travel clubs and SNU International Students Association. Sports clubs are available in fencing, golf, basketball, rugby, scubadiving, snowboard, ski, horse riding, baseball, yacht, judo, kendo, soccer, taekwondo, tennis, etc. The most popular students clubs amongst these are taekwondo, judo, kendo and traveling clubs.

### 5. Health Care

Students must have insurance from their home country. However, SNU provides students medical mutual aid service, which provides partial support for the health cost of a student's medical expense on illness, accidents (occurred on campus) and other medical care. Students can receive the benefits of the mutual aid by paying the fee of 2,500 KRW per semester upon the entrance of SNU.

## 6. Immigration

A student visa (D-2) is required to study in Korea if a student is not of Korean nationality. In most cases, exchange students can acquire their D-2 visa easily when they present their Certificates of Admission issued by the SNU to the relevant passport officials in their home country. Please contact your nearest Korean Embassy or consulate for more detailed information on the visa application process.

\* Note to Chinese Students: If you wish to study in Korea, you must obtain permission from the Korean Ministry of Justice. You can do this easily by obtaining a <u>certificate for confirmation of visa issuance</u> (CCVI) from the OIA. If you would like us to send your CCVI along with your Certificate of Admission, please send us the four (4) documents listed in the Checklist of Required Application Documents (Paragraph 7, Section H). Please be aware that we provide this service ONLY to exchange students.

### Subsidy

Korean language program is separate from regular university courses, and students have to pay the tuition fee. For exchange students only, however, the OIA and LEI made a special arrangement in financial subsidy:

√ Students who are majoring Korean Studies or Korean Language in home institution:

#### **Full financial support**

- √ Students who are not majoring in Korean Studies or Korean Language in home institution:
  - **70 per cent** of the tuition fee is supported from the OIA and **30 per cent** of the fee should be paid by the students
- \* Above financial subsidy is **not available for visiting students**. For any other types of financial support, please inquire to LEI at <a href="klp@snu.ac.kr">klp@snu.ac.kr</a>.

## 2. Application

The OIA will collect applications from exchange students and will forward applications along with recommendation to KLEC. The notification of acceptance and detailed schedule will be forwarded to the applicants along with the admission package for exchange students.

- $\sqrt{\text{Application Procedure}}$ : Students shall apply for the language program through the OIA. Further notice will be announced once the acceptance is confirmed.
- $\sqrt{\text{Transcript}}$ : Students completing this course will receive an official transcript from the KLEC. Please be advised that the grades you have earned at KLE will not appear on your general SNU transcript.

### 3. Others

### Taking Additional SNU Courses

While registered in the KLEC's program, you will be allowed to register for regular university courses offered by SNU. However, in consideration of the heavy course load of the KLEC's Regular Korean Language Program, we strongly recommend that you enroll in no more than 2 regular university courses if you are registered in this program.

### • Travel Insurance

It is mandatory for every KLEC student to obtain travel medical insurance. Students should comply with the following guidelines:

- √ You have to be insured by an insurance company which takes effect in your country or in Korea
- √ The insurance policy should cover sickness, accident and death during your study in SNU
- $\sqrt{}$  You can register for KLEC after submitting the copy of the insurance policy which states the above conditions
- √ Insurance policies in languages other than Korean or English should be notarized before submission
- $\sqrt{}$  In case the insurance expires before finishing the course, you have to resubmit the insurance policy copy or the notarized document after renewal or reapplication of the insurance policy
- $\sqrt{}$  Any inquiries and information regarding insurance should be conducted by yourselves with the staffs of insurance company. SNU does not involve in any insurance-related affairs

# SNU Buddy Program

The OIA organizes a buddy program for international students in order to assist their adjustment in Korea and campus life. Upon your buddy request, the OIA matches you with one of SNU buddy students, who will be your helper and friend throughout the semester.





During your stay at SNU, the SNU buddy shall meet up with you regularly or irregularly to build good relationship. At the beginning of the semester, SNU buddy's main jobs are to help you to settle in new environment, which may include:

- airport pick-up services
- ▶ help you to find accommodation or guide you for a dormitory life
- ▶ help you to register or change classes & may give you information related to classes
- show you around the campus and Seoul
- ► help you with other necessary administrative procedures such as foreign registration at the Immigration's Office, and opening bank account
- ▶ obtain cultural experiences as well as participate in many events for international students and buddies organized by the OIA

By participating in various activities held at the OIA such as International Food Festival, Cultural Heritage Tour and Wine & Cheese Party with international students, they become your best Korean friends. Many international students had great experiences with their SNU buddy students during their stay at SNU and keep their good friendship even from the distance.
