A TALENT FOR MURDER

A Mystery by Jerome Chodorov and Norman Panama October 5th - 21st | show 1

What if Agatha Christie had become the intended victim in one of her own mysteries? That is the premise of this witty and constantly surprising comedy-mystery about a world famous mystery writer named Anne Royce McClain who learns that her life is being threatened by someone in her own household.

Could it be her live-in doctor, who also used to be her lover? Or could it be her enigmatic Indian butler, Rashi? Or one of the young relatives named in what will undoubtedly be a very substantial will? Of course, anyone threatening Anne should realize they are taking on an imposing adversary. She's been devising clever ways to "murder" people for years!

In fact, Anne is such an imposing figure, two legendary actresses have played the role: Claudette Colbert on Broadway and Angela Lansbury on British television.

A TALENT FOR MURDER earned the prestigious Edgar Award as the Best Mystery Play of 1982.

The Sound of Music

A Musical by Richard Rodgers and Oscar Hammerstein November 30th - December 16th | show 2

One of the world's best-loved musicals, THE SOUND OF MUSIC tells the true story of Maria Von Trapp as recounted in her autobiography, THE TRAPP FAMILY SINGERS. Set in Salzburg in 1938, this inspiring musical play tells how Maria, a free-spirited young postulant at the Nonnberg Abbey, becomes a governess in the home of Capt. George Von Trapp, a wealthy, autocratic Austrian. Taking charge of his seven children becomes more than an assignment for Maria. It becomes her life's work.

A smash hit on Broadway in 1959, THE SOUND OF MUSIC went on to become the most successful motion picture of its time, a favorite with music lovers of all ages. The songs in the show have become American standards, including "Do-Re-Mi,""Edelweiss," "So Long, Farewell," "You Are Sixteen," "I Have Confidence" and "Climb Every Mountain."

ETHEL WATERS: HIS EYE IS ON THE SPARROW

A Play with Music by Larry Parr January 25th - February 10th | show 3

This inspiring musical biography tells the story of one of America's greatest entertainers, the legendary Ethel Waters. Born in abject poverty to a teenage rape victim, Ethel Waters worked her way to Vaudeville, then to Broadway and later to Hollywood.

Originally billed as "Sweet Mama Stringbean," Ethel Waters became one of the leading singers in Harlem's Cotton Club, where she introduced "Stormy Weather." Irving Berlin gave her the first star-billing ever afforded to a black actress on Broadway in his revue, AS THOUSANDS CHEER, in which she introduced the song, "Heat Wave." Later she starred in CABIN IN THE SKY, introducing "Taking a Chance on Love."

ETHEL WATERS: HIS EYE IS ON THE SPARROW is rich with melodies and memories of one of the great ladies of the American Theater and features songs like "Dinah," "Frankie and Johnny," "This Joint is Jumpin," "Am I Blue?" and "Sweet Georgia Brown."

THE LAST ROMANCE

A Comedy by Joe DiPietro Arch 22nd - April 7th | show 4

THE LAST ROMANCE is a wonderful new comedy by Joe DiPietro, the Tony Award-winning author of the hit musicals MEMPHIS and I LOVE YOU, YOU'RE PERFECT, NOW CHANGE.

The "romance" of the title refers to the unlikely relationship that develops between two senior citizens who meet in a dog park in Hoboken, New Jersey. Ralph is an 80-year-old widower and Carol is a 70-year-old widow. Neither has imagined there might be the time or opportunity to find another love in their lives. But the moment they meet, they realize they have stumbled into an unusual and unexpected adventure.

THE LAST ROMANCE keeps its audience breathless with anticipation of what might lie in store for two funny, feisty people who find themselves reliving all the trials and uncertainties of an adolescent courtship. THE LAST ROMANCE is touching, hilarious and as satisfying as a lovingly prepared family dinner.



A Comedy by A.R. Gurney = May 17th - June 2nd | show 5

The leading character in A. R. Gurney's hilarious play about life, love and marriage is a bright, funny, loyal, mischievous female named Sylvia. She is also a dog. In fact, she is the indispensable third party in a domestric triangle that includes Greg (a middle-aged businessman) and his wife, Kate. Kate and Greg have just moved back to the city having successfully raised two children in the suburbs. Kate is looking forward to resuming her teaching career when Greg returns to his Upper West Side apartment one day with Sylvia, a frisky young blonde (part-Lab, part-poodle) he has "picked up" in Central Park. But Kate has no interest in adopting a pet.

The conflicts that ensue are funny, poignant and memorable. If you've ever owned a dog, loved a dog, or wished your dog had its own apartment, you will understand why Greg falls for Sylvia, whose love for him is disarmingly unconditional.



Harold Prince - The Man Who Transformed Broadway (Part One: 1954-1964)

October 15, 16, 17, 22, 23, 24 | show 1

It's impossible to calculate the influence Hal Prince has had on the Broadway theatre in the past 50 years. He co-produced his first musical (PAJAMA GAME) in 1954. It became a smash hit. He followed it with DAMN YANKEES, WEST SIDE STORY, FIORELLO, FIDDLER ON THE ROOF and CABARET. Within a single decade, Harold Prince became one of Broadway's most successful producers, introducing the work of such now-legendary figures as Stephen Sondheim, Bock and Harnick and Kander and Ebb, along with songs like "Hey There," "Whatever Lola Wants," "Heart," "Maria," "If I Were a Rich Man," and "Sunrise, Sunset." That, of course, was just the beginning!

SOMETHING SORT OF GRANDISH

The Songs of Burton Lane December 10, 11, 12, 17, 18, 19 | show 2

In a career spanning almost 50 years, Burton Lane wrote songs for over 60 Hollywood films, including BABES ON BROADWAY with Judy Garland and Mickey Rooney, COLLEGE SWING with Bob Hope and Martha Raye and ROYAL WEDDING with Fred Astaire. On Broadway he collaborated with lyricists like E.Y. Harburg, Ira Gershwin, Dorothy Fields and Alan Jay Lerner to create shows like FINIAN'S RAINBOW and ON A CLEAR DAY YOU CAN SEE FOREVER. Join us in celebrating the composer who gave us such memorable songs as "Old Devil Moon," "Everything I Have is Yours," "How About You?" "Come Back to Me" and "How Are Things in Glocca Morra?"

The Songs of Lorenz Hart

February 4, 5, 6, 11, 12, 13 | show 3

When Larry Hart met Richard Rodgers, the first truly great songwriting team in American music was born. Other composers and lyricists had collaborated for years, but never had two men of such complimentary genius combined forces to write exclusively with each other for almost 25 years. Despite profound differences in their personalities and Larry Hart's often self-destructive tendencies, they created some of the greatest, most enduring songs in our Great American Songbook; songs like "Blue Moon," "Falling in Love With Love," "The Lady is a Tramp," "With a Song in My Heart," "The Most Beautiful Girl in the World," "I Could Write a Book" and "Bewitched, Bothered and Bewildered."

The Music of Cole Porter April 1, 2, 3, 8, 9, 10 | show 4

He's De-lightful! He's De-licious! He's De-Lovely! He's Cole Porter! For over 30 years, he set the standard for sophistication and wit (not only for the American Musical Theater) but for American popular music as well. In shows like ANYTHING GOES, PANAMA HATTIE, KISS ME KATE and CAN-CAN, Cole Porter introduced one great song after another, including such memorable standards as "Night and Day," "From this Moment On," "In the Still of the Night," "Let's Do It," "So in Love" and "Begin the Beguine." You'll hear these songs (and many others) in "ANYTHING GOES" – a musical celebration of Cole Porter's life and music.



Harold Prince - The Man Who Transformed Broadway (Part Two: 1970-Present) May 27, 28, 29, June 3, 4, 5 | show 5

In 1970, producer Harold Prince donned yet another hat to direct Stephen Sondheim's musical, COMPANY. He also directed Sondheim's FOLLIES, A LITTLE NIGHT MUSIC and SWEENEY TODD. After reinvigorating Broadway, Prince went to London and staged EVITA and THE PHANTOM OF THE OPERA. Today he divides his time between new works and revivals of American classics like Bernstein's CANDIDE and Jerome Kern's SHOWBOAT. Whether you prefer "Old Man River" or "Send in the Clowns" or "The Music of the Night," you can thank Hal Prince for keeping so many Broadway theater lobbies buzzing, for which Broadway has showered Mr. Prince with an unprecedented 21 Tony Awards!

Exchanging between Main Stage Plays and Musical Memories is available to Personal Angels and higher member levels.




general policies -

- Proper attire required (casual/business). Shorts are discouraged. Bring a sweater, the theatre tends to be chilly.
- The playhouse has a concession stand in the lobby. NO food or drink allowed inside the Theatre.
- Late arrivals may be seated in rear of theatre until intermission.
- All cell phones must be turned off prior to the performance.
- Heavy use of perfume or cologne is discouraged.
- A limited number of hearing devices are available. See the House Manager at the Box Office (you must leave an ID which will be returned to you after the show).
- A limited number of seat cushions are available at the Box Office for our shorter patrons.
- The theatre is equipped with wheelchair accessible spots. Seating for companions may be located adjacent to these spots. Please request this seating arrangement when purchasing tickets. Adjacent seats subject to availability.
