Fall Speakers September 4 • Jim McFarlane Watercolor demo

Jim McFarlane currently serves as president of the American Watercolor Society. He has also earned signature membership in the Philadelphia Water Color Society, the Pennsylvania Watercolor Society and the National Society of Painters in Casein and Acrylics. Prior to serving the AWS, he served on the Board of Directors and as president for both the Philadelphia Water Color Society and the Greater Norristown Art League.

McFarlane teaches watercolor painting at the Woodmere Museum, the Greater Norristown Art League, and the Doylestown Art League. He regularly conducts workshops, serves as a juror, presents demonstrations and is featured speaker for community groups. His paintings have been honored with numerous awards in local, regional and national shows. In 2002 and again in 2003 he received the Best of Show Award from the Philadelphia Water Color Society in their 102nd and 103rd International Annual Exhibitions. He was also honored with the PWCS Crest Medallion given for "Consistent Excellence". His work was selected to be included in the 2011 Taiwan International Water Color Exhibition at Penn State and in Taipei, Taiwan. In 2012 he was invited to participate in the joint Taiwan / Australia International Watercolor Exhibition and also was included in the 3rd Invitational Exhibit of Contemporary International Watermedia Masters in Nanjing, China. Most recently McFarlane was featured in the Spring 2013 issue of the European magazine Watercolour.

McFarlane's paintings are represented in numerous private and corporate collections, including The Blue Cross Corporation, The Subaru Corporation, The ARA Corporation, Spring-House Estates Corporation, The Pew Collection, The Clark Ladner Firm, and the Montgomery County, PA Bar Association. McFarlane was honored to be chosen as the 1998 artist for the American Cancer Society Holiday Card Campaign and to be included in Who's Who in America. Helena van Emmerik-Finn is a graduate of the Philadelphia College of Art who has studied under the tutelage of such celebrated artists as Bernard Ungerleider, Daniel Greene, and June Maxwell.

Throughout her career as a fine artist, Helena van Emmerik-Finn has garnered much acclaim for her work in pastel. She enjoys the medium of pastel because it gives her the freedom to work with strong colors in a spontaneous, intuitive style. Her works have the immediacy of a bold, impressionist application. Helena's still life pastels have an old-world feeling to them. She loves to include pieces from her Delft-Blue porcelain collection in them.

Her landscapes feature rustic landmarks and everyday scenes of domestic life from her beloved Bucks County, as well as scenes from her travels abroad. Paintings from her foreign travels include destinations such as Italy, Croatia, The Netherlands and France and feature imagery that spans from quaint to historic.

She has exhibited her work in some of the area's most prestigious juried shows including Rittenhouse Square Fine Arts Annual, Lititz Fine Arts Annual, Phillips Mill Annual Fall Exhibition and Lambertville Historical Society Annual Juried Exhibition.

Landscape painting outdoors can be a challenge. The solution can be painting a landscape from a photograph. But working from a

photo also has its challenges. This one-day workshop will guide you through the steps you need to get a successful landscape painting from a photo! We will discuss materials, color choices, mixing paint and how to do a basic block-in. We will also talk about general photography and how to take a good photo to work from. I will encourage creativity and finding your own style and at the same time help you establish the academics of good landscape painting. All levels welcome but it helps if you have some basic painting skills.

• EASEL: French, portable standing or table easel

• **BRUSHES:** Varied sizes of flat, filbert and round soft and bristle brushes. Try and get the best brushes you can afford. • PAINT: Limited Palette to get started with Titanium White Cadmium Yellow Light (you can subsitute the with Cadmium colors with HUES or something close) Cadmium Red Light (you can subsitute with Cadmium colors with HUES or something close) Prussian Blue Burnt Sienna You can get by with just these colors but it helps to have these additional colors: Yellow Ochre Burnt Umber Ultramarine Blue Ivory Black Feel free to bring in any other colors...

• **SURFACES:** Good canvas or gessoed panel. Varied sizes that you feel comfortable with no larger than 18 x 24

- Wooden palette
- Gamsol or Turpenoid (odorless turp only)

tural values and aesthetics such travel would allow. His innate approach to creating art is well founded with a volume of lifetime observations and self-studies in the arts and humanities. As a Kay Scholar with a degree in Philosophy from the University of Pennsylvania and a degree in American Studies from Bucks County Community College, Alan transfers knowledge into art and aspires to the aesthetic concept of "The Art Spirit." Fetterman says of his work, "After painting almost entirely plein-air for more than a decade, I began to realize new dilation and growth by embracing other mediums and expressions; such as sculpture, photography, music, poetry and prose. Now, I simply follow the strings of constructive human inertia and do not settle for less than full-pursuit towards a larger creative lexicon and artistic language. As an award-winning artist, he has had 32 solo-exhibitions and well over 150 group shows in museums and galleries throughout the Americas including such places as Carmel, California, Vero Beach, Florida, Curitiba, Brazil and throughout the Delaware valley region. He is a long-standing board member of the Philadelphia Sketch Club and past member of New York City's Salmagundi Club. His profile and work is published in many books including "A Bucks County State of Mind"; "The Embraceable You" and most recently in a monograph book about the artist titled "Illuminate " by art historian and art critic Cathie Viskjo.
