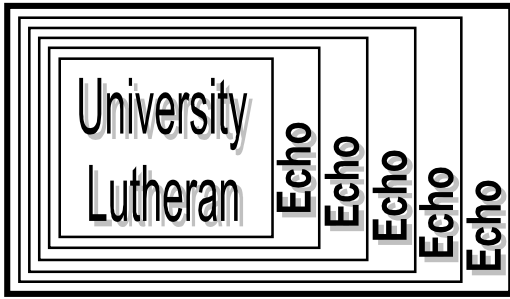

"I wait for the Lord, my soul waits, and in his word I have hope." Psalm 130:5

Generally speaking, we are not very good waiters. Sometimes we wait impatiently at best. For example, I was trying to get back to church the other day for an important meeting. I had been at Valley Eldercare where the visit took longer than expected. So I had only a few minutes to travel back to the church. Now there were three stoplights between my meeting and me, and as luck would have it, a red light stopped me at all three intersections. If you ask my children they would say this is normal. Dad's luck is bad luck when it comes to stoplights.

As I sat at one light after another, waiting for them to turn green, I marveled how it can be so difficult for me to wait. I am a fairly patient person, especially when it comes to my children and my work with people, but when I am late for an appointment and the stoplight turns red, well, let's just say I am talking to the light, asking it to hurry up and turn green. This time, however, my waiting paid off. It was at the third and final stoplight that the theme for Advent this year became clear to me like a gift from heaven – WAIT FOR THE LORD.

I recall as a child how difficult it was for me to wait for Christmas to come. My sister Terri and I would sit near the Christmas tree pining for those beautifully wrapped presents that could not be touched until Christmas Day. I am convinced that parents do this as a mild form of torture for their children. Yet Christmas presents aside, the real question for me as we enter the season of Advent is this: How do we wait for the Lord? Or to put it another way, are we impatient for the Lord Jesus to come to us, or is patience a virtue that we possess?

The verse from Psalm 130 quoted above is not a patient one. If you look at the Psalm, it starts out like this, "Out of the depths I cry to you, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!" Implicit in this plea to God is the impatience of someone who is in deep distress and needs the Lord to come and help him. If you doubt this, then listen to this verse from the same Psalm, "My soul waits for the Lord more than those who watch for the morning." Picture here a walled city with sentinel posts. Each post has a watchman, who looks out for the enemy all night long.

Presumably, these watchman, provided they have not accidentally nodded off to sleep, are very anxious for sunrise. The dawn of the day and daylight, mean that their work night is over and they can go home and get some sleep. Watchman can hardly wait for morning. I think this also true for people in this world like the writer of this Psalm, who are suffering hardship and are calling and waiting on the Lord to help them. Their morning would be the coming of the Lord, to love them and help them through whatever is causing trouble in their lives.

In Advent, we think about waiting for Jesus. We know that Jesus came to Bethlehem long ago. He was born and lain in a manger, and grew up to be the Lord and Savior we worship today. However, we also understand Jesus to be at the right hand of God, and we want him to come back soon and help us. We know he will return at the end of the age to overcome sin, evil and death, but still, we look for him to come to us now in this life. It is something like sitting in our cars and begging the light to turn green. We really want Jesus to come and help us.



The truth is that he does. Jesus, through the Holy Spirit, comes to us in everyday life, to walk with us, lead and guide us, and help us prevail even as we face the hardest challenges of life. When we sing, "Joy to the World" on the third Sunday in Advent, we really mean it when we sing, "let every heart prepare him room". We believe that Jesus comes into the world to live in our hearts and lives. Sometimes when life is particularly bumpy, it feels like we wait too long. Yet the good news is that the light will turn green, and Jesus will be there for us.

Advent Candles

The names of the candles and their meanings are as follows:

- The Prophecy candle represents the **hope** Israel had for the coming of the Lord.
- The Bethlehem candle reminds us we are to **prepare** for the coming of the Lord.
- The Shepherd's candle represents the **joy** there is because the Lord has come.
- The Angel's candle reminds us the Lord comes into the world to **love** people.

Then on Christmas Eve we light the Christ candle to announce that indeed the Lord has come into the world through the birth of Jesus.

Education Update - December 2014



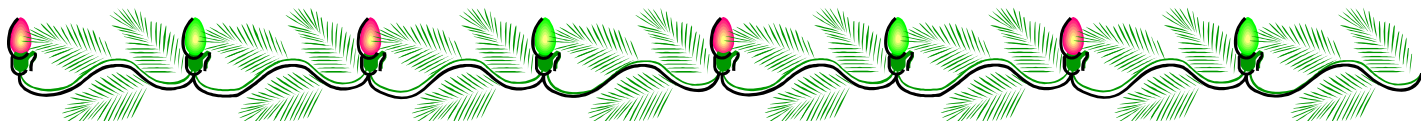
The University Lutheran Christmas program will be

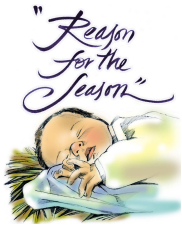
