

You have likely heard this chant at football games. Fans on one side of the field shout, "We have the spirit, yes, we, do. We have the spirit, how about you?" Then fans on the other side, not to be outdone, shout the same, "We have the spirit, yes, we, do. We have the spirit, how about you?" These same words are shouted back and forth, one side to the other, louder and louder, until both sides break into the words, "We have more. We have more." The idea here is the side who is the loudest actually has the most school spirit.

Is this true in the church with the Holy Spirit? Are only the loudest denominations filled with the Holy Spirit? Can a shy and quiet person who doesn't say much have the Holy Spirit? If we talk a lot about the Holy Spirit, does it mean the Spirit is in us? Lutherans are often accused of not talking enough about the Holy Spirit. Some in the church say the Holy Spirit is not given in Lutheran infant baptisms because the child isn't speaking for itself. Still others say you don't have the Holy Spirit in you unless you really emotionally feel it.

I think arguing about who has the Holy Spirit is silly. Jesus says this about the Spirit to all who believe in him in John, chapter 16, verse 7, "I will send him to you." Did he mean only the disciples? Did he mean only adults? Did he mean only certain individuals and denominations who claim to emotionally feel the Holy Spirit and speak in tongues? Of course Jesus was not being exclusive as such with that statement. Jesus was saying, if you believe in me, if you follow me, and if you love me, you have my Holy Spirit in you, even Lutherans.

During the month of June on Wednesday evenings, I will be preaching on the Holy Spirit. This is a four part sermon series entitled, "The Holy Spirit Calls Me". The goal of the series it to familiarize you will certain passages about the Holy Spirit, to help you trust the Spirit has come to you and lives within you, and to open your eyes to the many ways the Spirit is impacting your life and calling you to use your gifts. I hope in the end, you will conclude that the Holy Spirit is with you, and has given you gifts to serve both the Gospel and people.

Here are the four weeks of the series:

Week 1 (June 3): Here Comes the Dove: Holy Spirit and Holy Baptism

Week 2 (June 10): Paraclete, Not Parakeet: Holy Spirit Comes Alongside Us

Week 3 (June 17): Tongues of Fire: How Every Christian Speaks the Gospel!

Week 4 (June 24): Fruits and Gifts Galore: Serving the Common Good

The gift of the Holy Spirit is truly amazing. The Lord gives us this gift so we are not alone in life, and so we understand the Holy Spirit lives within us. The Lord gives us this gift so we can receive forgiveness and love, grace and guidance, confidence and strength for our lives. The Lord gives us this gift, so we may share the good news of the Gospel with other people, and so we may serve our neighbors in ways they need us. So indeed, you have the Holy Spirit, yes, you, do, and this same Spirit is now and forevermore calling you!

Women's Summer Bible Study No Catchy Slogans

Does the subject of giving—especially financial giving to the church—make you a little uncomfortable? Do you feel awkward when conversations or sermons about money come up?

This summer's Bible study, "No Catchy Slogans," looks at Scripture passages about giving. The author, former Women of the ELCA staff member Emma Crossen, writes in her introduction: "Giving money is an important topic for Christians to consider. All congregations need money to pay pastors, care for buildings, and support ministries. All people need encouragement and guidance about their relationship to money. Few things affect our daily life more. It seems appropriate that the Bible gives so much attention to money and giving. Yet, it's too common to see Bible passages taken out of context, turned into catchy slogans, and enforced as rules that Christians should follow."

Session 1: Give in Secret (June 12) Giving money is an important topic for Christians to consider, but taking Scripture out of context confuses the message.

Session 2: Be Like the Widow (July 10) What if Jesus is pointing to an injustice in the story of the widow's mite?

Session 3: God Loves a Cheerful Giver (August 14)
In Paul's second letter to the church at Corinth, we get a short and upbeat slogan about giving.


HELP US BEAUTIFY DETROIT THIS SUMMER!

There are currently 65,000 abandoned properties in the city of Detroit. This summer gathering participants will help board up many of these abandoned homes which will create safer walking routes for school children in underserved neighborhoods. Beautifying the boards used for board up's reduces the chance of vandalism and creates public art for area residents.

DIAPERS FOR DETROIT



Imagine sending your baby or toddler to preschool or daycare wearing a plastic grocery bag instead of diapers. This is happening in Detroit. In fact, diapers are such a hot commodity, pharmacies and stores sometimes keep them behind glass because of theft. On average, a newborn goes through 8 to 10 diapers a day, a cost that can add up to \$100 a month for one baby. For people who are poor that cost is out of reach, and they too often have to choose between diapers and food. People who are on federal assistance programs like WIC, Food Stamps or Medicare, can't get diapers.

Please help youth at University Lutheran Church collect "Diapers for Detroit". We are hoping to bring hundreds of diapers with us to the gathering. There will be a collection spot and display in the narthex. We can't do this without your help. The greatest need is for children's sizes 3 and 4, but all sizes are welcomed, including baby wipes and supplies for adults. THANK YOU!

OUR FAMILY LABELS: ULC Youth are collecting labels from Our Family products. The labels are redeemed for a donation to the youth program. Each label is worth 5 cents, and periodically they have a special promotion where their value doubles to 10 cents. The part of the label that is sent in is the barcode, so from larger items such as cereal boxes or egg cartons, you may just cut out the barcode (to cut down on bulk). The youth cut the barcodes from the items to get them ready for processing. If you have some to bring in, please put them in the box by Heather's office. Thanks for your participation.



ULC Church Council Summary






- 2. Look for the summer fundraisers coming up in June, July and August. Blizzard Bingo is the first, and this will be on June 28.
