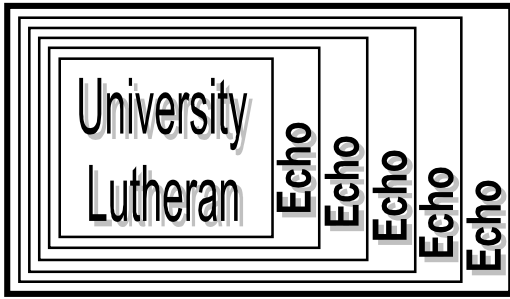

I have had the distinct honor of living with my mother-in-law, Alice Rude, since Thanksgiving. Health changes in her life have caused her to move away from her hometown, Sacred Heart, Minnesota, to be near one of her daughters, my wife. Within the next week, she will be moving into a two room suite at Tuftes Manor, and she is actually kind of excited for this new stage in her life. I must say that when she leaves I'm going to miss her. She has been the brunt of my good-natured son-in-law teasing for over two months now, and has very admirably and capably given it back to me.

During this time, I have been asking her to tell me stories of her past, particularly her growing up years. When Alice was six years old, her grandparents retired and she and her family moved in with them. The household consisted of her grandparents, her parents, and her two sisters. Alice said that life as a three generation family living under one roof was really good. She remembers her grandpa playing solitaire at the kitchen table after dinner while she and her sisters would do the dishes. Alice said that every night at one point he would say, "Read the Bible every day, you will never regret it."

The best part about this story is that after losing at solitaire (she said that she can't remember him ever winning), that he would go and read his Bible for an hour before going to bed. Alice credits her grandpa, his words about reading the Bible and his example of actually reading the Bible, for influencing her to read the Bible in her life as well. In a similar way, I remember both my mom and my grandma being Bible readers when I was a young lad, and when it was time for me to really start reading the Bible myself in college, their example also influenced and encouraged me.

This Lenten season, I have challenged myself to read all four Gospels during the forty days of Lent, from Ash Wednesday to Palm Sunday. This is a total of 89 chapters of Scripture or roughly 2.2 chapters of Scripture per day in Lent. I am inviting you, the people of University Lutheran Church to do the same. I will be starting with Mark, the first Gospel written, and then move from there to Matthew, Luke and then finally, to the last Gospel written, John. If you would like to read with me, then I ask you to sign up on the appointed sheet which you will find on the Lenten table in the narthex on Ash Wednesday.



If you decide to accept this challenge, then I will also invite you to a potluck dinner on Thursday, April 9, at 6:00 p.m., in the fellowship hall. Please bring a hot dish, salad or some other dish to share, and the drinks and dessert will be provided. After eating, we will share experiences from our reading, ask and answer questions, and Pastor Tom will have some humorous thoughts to share with you as well. By 7:30 p.m., we will be on our way home and all the better for it. And remember what Alice's grandpa said to his three granddaughters, "Read the Bible every day, you will never regret it."

By the way, our Wednesday Lenten series will be focused on Scripture this year as well. We will be using a series called, "The Parables of Lent". What this means is that we will study six parables of Jesus from the Gospels, one each Wednesday night, beginning Ash Wednesday. It will be our mission to discover the meaning of each of these parables, and then figure out how each parable particularly enhances our journey through the season of Lent. As I have looked carefully at each of the six parables, I must say that I am excited to share this time and these parables with you.

And, if you are interested in hearing any more intriguing stories from my mother-in-law, well, then tune into the newsletter in March. I promise I will tell you an awesome story about peas.

Wednesdays in Lent

Wednesdays in Lent are an important time at ULC. Sunday and Wednesday families come together for 6 weeks of worship that is focused on the Lord Jesus and his cross.

Ash Wednesday Worship is February 18

Lent begins with one of the most meaningful worship services of the Christian year. The Ash Wednesday service begins with confession of sins and imposition of ashes. The ash reminds us that we are sinful and mortal people – *remember that you are dust, and to dust shall return*. The service concludes with Holy Communion. The body and the blood of the Lord Jesus provide us with all the grace we need to receive abundant and even everlasting life from God. Join us for this important time of worship!



Wednesday Lenten theme: The Parables of Lent

This series will explore 6 biblical parables of Jesus. Each week the parable's plot will be explored in order to discover its meaning, and to connect it to our weekly Lenten theme. Here are the themes, parables, and something for you to bring for the Food Pantry:

The Workers in the Vineyard (Matthew 20:1-16)
Bring pudding and gelatin for the Salvation Army Food Cupboard

Week 5: March 25

Receive Forgiveness

The Prodigal Son (Luke 15:11-32)
Bring boxed cereals for the Salvation Army Food Pantry

Wooden Neck Crosses

This is one of our most favorite Lenten traditions. We will provide wooden neck crosses for people to wear during Lent and beyond. Some even like to hang them in their car.

Metal Pocket Crosses

You can also carry in your purse or pocket a bronze or silver cross that reminds you wherever you go that "God Loves You".

Lenten Coin Folders

We use coin folders to set aside a quarter a day during the 40 days of Lent for Susan Smith who is our new missionary in the Central African Republic.

Feed My Starving Children



Here is the breaking news for Feed My Starving Children 2015:

- Once again the community of Grand Forks is coming together to pack food for starving children across the world. This year that weekend is April 10-12.
- As a community, we have currently raised \$41,003 of the needed \$88,000 in order for us to pack 400,000 meals this year.
- One way ULC is raising money for FMSC is through noisy offerings in January, February, and March.
- On Wednesday, February 11 and Sunday, February 15, we will have "Love Offering" envelopes available for you to make other gifts to FMSC.
- On Sunday, March 1, 6:00 p.m., half of the "A Place at the Table" free will offering will go toward FMSC, and half to ELCA Hunger Appeal.
- You will have opportunity to sign up to help pack at the event on April 10-12 in the very near future. We will have a couple of designated ULC times.

Remember that every 22 cents will provide one meal for a hungry child in our world!

WELCA Bible Study: Making Conversion Last

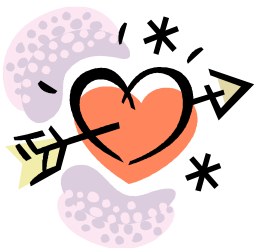

ULC Church Council Summary



Over the past two months, ULC has been busy with the Christmas season and Annual meeting. Now in the New Year, we are looking at possible ways to control expenses, and at the same time implement our new stewardship challenge, High Five. We will also be looking at ways we might increase involvement in all ULC programs, with a particular emphasis on Sunday morning.

Financial Report

1. We are hovering around \$18, 836 short in the General Fund. Typically, we find ourselves better than this at the end of the year. I would ask that if you can help with the shortfall to please do so. Your contribution is used to promote God's work in our community.
2. One of the ways you could help us on a monthly basis is to set up automatic payments to ULC. This can be done through the Simply Giving program we have in place. Please see Seanne in the church office to pick up an authorization form if you are interested.

Final thoughts today are from Hebrews 13:16.

"And do not forget to do good and to share with others, for with such sacrifices God is pleased."

Sacrifices are never easy. However, if you look at the sacrifice you have made and compare that to the impression you left on the person you helped or supported financially, you will realize your reward. With great excitement, we are announcing a new stewardship program at ULC called:

"Give ULC a High Five"

What is more positive and supportive than giving someone a high five? Friends and family who love and care for each other often show their warm feelings by giving high fives to each other. Well, why not give a high five to ULC? If you love and support ULC and the ministry we share together, why not give ULC a high five to say that this is a welcome place, a faithful ministry, a household of the Lord and his family?



What we are asking is that everyone who loves ULC and who thinks of ULC as their church family, give \$5 more every week than they are currently giving. It doesn't matter what your level of giving is right now, \$5 more every week can really make a difference. This program is designed to positively demonstrate to all ULC members and friends the power of \$5. It is really the simplest of ideas.

For example, if 50 ULC families gave \$5 more a week for one year, that would become \$13,000! If 100 ULC families gave \$5 more a week for one year, that would become \$26,000. If 150 ULC families gave \$5 more a week for one year, that would become \$39,000. Since we have a total of 279 families who contributed to ULC last year, it is easy to begin to see the potential power of \$5.

There is one small favor we ask of you. If you can make a note that says "high five" on your extra \$5 a week, that would be amazing because it would allow us to track how many high fives ULC is receiving. Then we will be able to give you positive updates during the year, showing the impact of all these high fives on our ministry. Too often we talk of shortfalls. Why not talk about high fives instead!

You are such a generous people! In 2014, you contributed \$429,000 for ministry at ULC. This is a record year for us as far as we can tell. The higher income was due mostly to two designated fund drives – sanctuary lighting and the Ecuador mission trip. However, general fund gifts were just a few hundred dollars higher in 2014 than 2013. At the end of the year, due to increased expenses, we are \$18,800 short in the general fund. 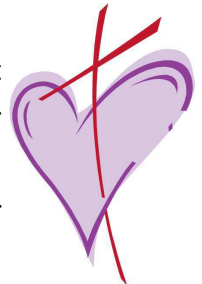


Planning for the Future
