

In the seasons of Lent and Easter, Christian people ought to be talking about love. It's the time to smile from ear to ear and tell whoever will listen, that God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, Jesus, to die for us. Why? Well, because the death of Jesus on the cross and his resurrection from the tomb is all about love. Sometimes we wonder why Jesus had to die, and the truth is that Jesus died on the cross because of love – God's love for the world. I remember singing in Sunday School this song about the importance of love.

Love, love, love, that's what it's all about.

God loves us; we love each other; mother, father, sister, brother.

Let everybody sing and shout, because that's what it's all about.

It's about love, love, love. It's about love, love, love.

This includes Jesus' death on the cross. It was also about love, love, love. Think of it this way. A young boy saw his dad talking with a neighbor on the other side of the street. So the boy darted out on his bike toward his dad in front of an oncoming car. The dad, of course, saw the whole thing, and miraculously grabbed the boy and his bike out of the way. Both the boy and the dad nearly died that day, and the poor driver, she almost died too, of the shock and horror at what almost happened. Why did the father risk his life for his son?

It was, of course, love, love, love. He would do anything to protect his son, because he loves him. That is precisely what it means to be father. It means to care for, be protective of, and watch over one's wife and children, being ready and willing even to die for them. I bet every healthy father feels like this and would be willing to give up life and limb to protect his son, his daughter, and his wife too. I know parents who have lost children in situations beyond their control, and if they could have died on their behalf, they would have gladly done so.

This is what God did on the cross through Jesus. It was because of love that the Lord willingly was nailed there, and left to die. After all, God is our Father and we are his children, his sons and daughters, and he would do anything to protect us because he loves us. God as our Father cares for, is protective of, and watches over us, and yes, is willing to die for us, which, of course, he already did. Certainly, on that cross some 2000 years ago, the Lord died for us to save us from sin and hardship, evil and death, because of love, love.

The young boy on the bike did not understand till years later what his father had done for him. There is no way he would have survived the accident, he was too small, and the car was too big. Now the family recounts the story because the father has died and it has become their story of real love – how a father was willing to give his life for his son. Now the boy is a man and he has his own children, and he understands, because he too, would do the same. He loves his wife, two sons and daughter so much, he would die for them if need be.

This Lent and Easter, let us know in our hearts and tell with our mouths, that Jesus' death on the cross is much more than payment for sin. It is much more than Jesus being sacrificed so God might forgive us. Jesus' death on the cross is instead mostly about love, love, love. God the Father, died on the cross to save us his children, his sons and daughters, from sin and hardship, evil and death. These things like oncoming cars can harm us, but instead Jesus gave up his life on the cross to protect us from them, because he loves us. And that's what it's all about!

Maundy Thursday — April 17 — 7:00 p.m. His Last Night



This is the last night of Jesus' life. We will walk through the 4 major events of this night as did Jesus and his disciples – preparation, teaching, meal, and desertion. There will be confession and forgiveness, foot washing, Holy Communion, and the stripping of the altar. This is also First Communion for our fifth grade class. It is both a marvelous and a horrifying night all wrapped into one!

Do you know what MAUNDY means? Come to church this night and you will find out!

Good Friday – April 18 – 7:00 p.m.

Last Words around the Cross

Our whole focus this night is, of course, the cross and the death of our Lord Jesus Christ. So many people don't even believe this happened! Yet for us as Christians, it is at the heart of our confession of faith. Jesus died so that we might live! To this end, we will have a cross procession, we will light and extinguish candles, we will have a dramatic reading called "Last Words around the Cross", we will sing Lenten hymns, and we will meditate on the words, "Jesus loves me, this I know".

Easter Sunday – April 20 – He is risen!

Eighteen members and friends of ULC will be going to Quito, Ecuador next July 20-29 for a mission trip! We go to serve there in the following four locations:

- 1. For His Children Orphanage in Quito serving infants and other children
- 2. For His Children Orphanage in Latacunga serving special needs children
- 3. Quito Trash Transfer Station serving poor families with children
- 4. "Pan de Vida" ministries serving people's basic needs through the Gospel

Each one of these people will be contributing \$1,150 of their own money to go on this trip, and we are trying to raise an additional \$1,350 per person through fundraising. That is \$24,300. Thank you for your generous gifts. The last couple of weeks have been excellent. In round numbers, we have raised – \$2,000 ULC Mission Endowment Grant; \$3,000 Ground Round Pancake Breakfast, and \$2,000 A Place at the Table.





We will finally assemble those meals on the weekend of April 4-6. When all is said and done, we will have raised \$88,000, and prepared 2 meals a day for 548 hungry children. Wow!



Our ULC fundraising efforts are under way. We have raised about \$2,000 to date, and we hope to have even more before April 4. ULC Mission Endowment Fund

The ULC Mission Endowment Fund met on Tuesday, March 11, to consider grant applications. At the meeting, they awarded a generous \$2,000 grant to the Ecuador Mission Team! The Endowment Fund seeks to serve the needs of people on all levels, whether they are local, congregational, national or international.

Financial Update

General fund income has been slow in the first two months of 2014, while expenses have maintained normal levels. This has led to a \$22,300 shortfall in the general fund. We realize that the congregation has been raising lots of funds for Feed My Starving Children, the sanctuary lights, and especially the Ecuador Mission Trip, so it is not hard to see what is happening. Even so, during this Lenten and Easter season, we ask you to pay special attention to the general fund. Thank you for your generous gifts throughout the year!

We have had an interesting development for Stephen Ministry this past month. Calvary Lutheran Church has reached out to me with the request that we assist them in their development and implementation of a Stephen Ministry Program for their congregation. I am in the



process of setting up some meeting times with their Parish Representative. Hopefully the Stephen Ministry Leaders can meet together with them and lead them in the right direction!

ULC Church Council Summary - March 20, 2014



Financial Report

With the shortfall from 2013 in addition to the shortfall in January we finished \$14,000 behind. February also continued with a shortfall of \$8000 leading to the current shortfall of \$22,301.46.
