

ARTICLE BY MRS. HOSEY
IN BUS. ED. JOURNAL



After some dozen years as tax-paying residents we felt it was high time to see our state legislature in operation. The effort was well rewarded. It was most interesting to come home and read about Mr. Ingalls and Mr. Travia, after having heard them speak from the floor of the Chamber. The keynote speaker, of course, was the Governor. Did you know that the average person in the U. S. consumed about 1,488 pounds of food in 1960? According to the

U. S. Department of Agriculture these estimates were made on the basis of retail weights of all the food products of farms, ranches, and fisheries. Dairy products leading with 414 pounds per person, or about 250 quarts of milk, the equivalent. Fruit and vegetable group was a close runnerup with 409 pounds per person, and meat consumed per person was 178 pounds, third largest food group. This included poultry and fish, as well as beef, pork, and lamb. Interesting, of course, all ages are taken into consideration, yet they all count equally in figuring per capita consumption. Now back to the new diet . . .
