1. Public Hearing

A. Public Hearing on the FY 2007-2008 Annual Rural Operating Assistance Program (ROAP) Grant.

County Manager Martin advised that this hearing is on the funds that are expected to be received on this current fiscal year and introduced Kristine Wagner, Program Coordinator, for further information. Ms. Wagner stated that the total awarded amount for the FY 2007-2008 ROAP Grant is \$250,038, giving the breakdown as \$112,954 (Elderly and Disabled Transportation Assistance Program -EDTAP); \$45,435 (Work First); and \$91,649 (Rural General Public - RGP). There is no local match required for the EDTAP or Work First funds. Supplemental funds may also be applied for in the amount of \$112,837. The Town of Spring Lake has committed to provide the required local match of the RGP funding if enough funding is not generated from the fares of the bus line from the Cross Creek Mall to Spring Lake which is what the RGP funds are being used for at this time.

Background: According to a memo from the Transportation Program Coordinator, the NCDOT deadline for our yearly application for ROAP funds is August 10, 2007. The required Public Hearing has been advertised for the Board's August 6, 2007 9:00 A.M. meeting. This application may be inspected at the Historic County Courthouse located at 130 Gillespie Street from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm, Monday thru Friday.

G. Approval of the Tax Collector's Preliminary Collection Report and Proposed Annual Settlement for FY07.

BACKGROUND: North Carolina General Statute Section 105-373 requires the Tax Collector of Cumberland County after the 1st day of July of each year to render a preliminary report to the Board of Commissioners concerning persons whose tax liabilities remain unpaid

and to propose an annual settlement of taxes charged to him for collection for the past year. The Tax Collector has submitted such preliminary report and proposed settlement. The preliminary report consists of (i) a list of persons owning real property whose taxes for the year 2006-2007 remain unpaid (the proposed insolvent list), and (iii) a statement under oath by the Tax Collector that he has made diligent efforts to collect such taxes. The proposed settlement consists of the amounts of taxes with which the Tax Collector has been charged for the year and the amounts of credits against such charges, the real and personal property tax balance is charged to the forthcoming tax year.

RESOLUTION

Resolution accepting preliminary report of the Tax Collector, crediting the insolvent list, and approving proposed annual settlement.

Whereas, North Carolina General Statute Section 105-373, requires the Tax Collector of Cumberland County after the 1st day of July of each year to render a preliminary report to the Board of County Commissioners concerning persons whose tax liabilities remain unpaid and to propose an annual settlement of taxes charged to the Tax Collector for collection for the past ten years; and

Whereas, the Tax Collector has submitted such preliminary report and proposed settlement.

Now therefore, the Board of Commissioners of Cumberland County hereby resolves:

- 1. That the preliminary report of the Tax Collector of Cumberland County, consisting of (i) a list of persons owning real property whose taxes for the year 2006- 2007 remain unpaid and the principal amount owned by each person; (ii) a list of the persons not owning or who have not listed real property whose taxes for the tax year 2006 2007 remain unpaid and the principal amount owned by each person (the proposed insolvent list) and (iii) a statement under oath by the Tax Collector that he has made diligent efforts to collect such taxes, be and it hereby is, accepted;
- 2. That the Board hereby finds that the persons in the list of those that do not own or have not listed real property are insolvent as that term is used in G.S. 105-373, directs that the list of such person be entered into the minutes of the meeting of the Board as the insolvent list, and further directs that the amounts in such list be, and hereby are, credited to the Tax Collector in his annual settlement;
- 3. That the proposed settlement of the Tax Collector, appended hereto, for taxes in his hands for collection for the tax year 2006 2007, be and it hereby is, approved and that he be, and thereby is, charged with the amounts set forth in the settlement under the heading "Charges" and credited with the amounts set forth in the settlement under the heading "Credits".

ITEM 1 & 2 BACKGROUND: On or about October 26, 2005, the County acquired by tax foreclosure judgment these properties at a cost, including interest and costs, for the two properties of \$3,535.74. Mr. Kishorkumar Kaneria was the last and highest bidder offering to purchase the County's interest in the property for \$24,173.75 and has deposited \$2,417.38 in the Finance Office. This property is surplus to the needs of the county and, according to N.C.G.S. 153A-176 and N.C.G.S. 105-376, the County has the authority to sell such property. Management has reviewed this offer and it is now being submitted for the Board of consider whether or not to accept Mr. Kaneria's bid. The property has been advertised and has received several bids; however, Mr. Kaneria was the final and highest bidder. The bid period is now closed.

Syeda Chowdhury Gainey has offered to purchase the County's interest in the property for \$8,431.79 and has deposited \$850.00 in the Finance Office. The tax value of the property is \$74,322.00. This property is surplus to the needs of the County and, according to N.C.G.S. 153A-176 and N.C.G.S. 105-376, the County has the authority to sell such property. Management has reviewed this offer and it is now being submitted for the Board to consider whether or not to accept Ms. Gainey's bid. Repeat Rehabs (page 10 of policy) BACKGROUND: Over the past 12 months, Community Development staff has noted that several homeowners who received housing rehabilitation assistance early in our program are seeking additional assistance. We have been able to attribute this to two important factors: 1) because the population that we serve is low income homeowners, most do not have the resources to maintain their homes (and many are elderly); and 2) current repairs that need to be addressed were not needed during the initial rehabilitation. To continue to support our mission of providing decent, safe and sanitary housing, it is our opinion that homeowners should be allowed to receive additional assistance if the first lien for rehabilitation work has been satisfied and at least ten years have lapsed since the initial loan. Allowing this additional assistance will continue to promote safe and decent housing for the low income citizens in our communities. <u>Life Estates (page 11 of policy)</u> Based on the definition of homeownership under the HOME program, life estates are not considered an acceptable form of homeownership. Ownership must be in the form of either fee simple title or a 99-year leasehold interest. Therefore, language specifically stating such is being incorporated into the HRP Policy.
