

NEW STUDENT CHECKLIST

Accept your offer of admission

Email your Admission Acceptance form to ISS or submit it online at umsl.edu/international.

Complete immigration procedures

If you are outside the U.S., take your I-20 to a U.S. embassy or consulate and apply for an F-1 student visa (or for a J-1 visa if you have a DS-2019). Information about visa procedures can be found at umsl.edu/international.

If you are transferring to UMSL from another U.S. institution, refer to the *Transfer Student Form* for instructions. If you will not have an F-1 or J-1 Visa, be sure to contact iss@umsl.edu to confirm your status.

Make housing arrangements

You can live on or off campus. If you plan to live on campus, make your reservations early because space is limited—you must register for on-campus housing before you arrive in St. Louis. It is recommended that international students live in Oak Hall or University Meadows, though other options are available as well:

Plan your arrival

You must arrive before Monday, August 17. If you will live on campus, we recommend that you arrive in St. Louis August 13-16. Remember that you cannot enter the country more than 30 days before your program start date.

Reserve temporary housing

If you plan to arrive before your room is available, reserve temporary housing as well. Make your request online at umsl.edu/~umslconf. For questions, email umslconf@umsl.edu.

Complete immunization requirements

Fill out the *UMSL Immunization & TB Screening* form and return it to the University Health Center before you arrive on campus. Send the form, and any questions, to health_services@umsl.edu.

All students must also have health insurance in the U.S. and those with F and J visas are automatically enrolled in UMSL's insurance program. For information about health insurance, visit umsl.edu/international.

Access your campus email and SSO identification number

Find your SSO ID to access campus services, take online placement tests, and set up your UMSL email account. Important correspondence is sent to your UMSL email address as soon as you are admitted.

Take the math placement exam 8

> Most undergraduate students must take the math placement exam before registering for classes. Undergraduate students must take this test online before orientation. See the *Math Placement Exam* document for instructions.

Begin the international transfer credit process 9

> If you completed undergraduate courses at another university, you may be eligible to receive credit towards your bachelor's degree at UMSL. See umsl.edu/international for more information.

Pre-register for classes July 10 – August 14 10

> During pre-registration, you will communicate with an advisor to register for a tentative schedule of classes. You will then finalize your schedule during orientation. See the Advising and Course Registration document for details.

- Request an airport pick-up by July 31 If you will live on campus, an UMSL student or staff member can pick you up at the airport. To use this service, you
- must arrive in St. Louis August 13-16. Submit your arrival information at umsl.edu/international. Arrive in St. Louis August 13 – 16

INSTRUCTIONS

Obtain <u>copies</u> of your immunization records and attach to this form (**students should retain original documents**). Examples of acceptable documents include:

Copies of personal immunization records
Copies of physician office or Health Department immunization records
Copies of high school or previous college immunization records
Copies of military immunization records

IMMUNIZATIONS

University Health Services provides students with routine immunizations. Most immunizations are available at low prices to students. Many people think "shots" or immunizations are just for kids. They're not! As a college student, you need to be protected against measles, mumps, rubella, tetanus, diphtheria, polio, varicella (chickenpox), Hepatitis B, and influenza (flu). Depending on your risk factors, you may also need protection against Hepatitis A, Pneumococcal Pneumonia and Meningococcal Meningitis.

Many people think diseases like measles have been wiped out. This is not true. During 1995, at least 39% of all reported measles cases in the United States occurred in people 20 years or older.

The following vaccinations are recommended but not required.

Hepatitis B

Influenza (Flu)

Tetanus/Diphtheria

Meningitis (see special requirements for students living in university housing)

Polio

Varicella (Chicken Pox)

The University of Missouri-St. Louis requires that all newly enrolled or readmitted students born after December 31, 1956 must comply with the two-dose Measles Immunization Policy. If a second immunization is needed, it must be the combined MMR vaccine.

Requirement:

2 doses of MMR vaccine. The first dose must have been given at age 12 months or later. The second dose must have been given at least one month after the first one.

OR

Titer (blood test) results proving immunity to measles (rubeola), mumps, and rubella. Documentation is required.

*Students may request a waiver for medical or religious reasons with documented proof. For information on this call, (314) 516-5671.

Part II	Meningococcal Vaccine	Required for students living in residence halls

Missouri legislation requires students in university housing to either: 1.) Show documentation of Meningococcal vaccine **or** 2.) Sign a waiver that indicates they have been provided educational materials but have chosen not to receive the vaccine at this time. The waiver form may be downloaded and printed from www.umsl.edu/services/health/pdfs/meng_vac_waiver.pdf.

Part III	Tuberculosis (TB) Screening	Required for students in any of the following categories

The University of Missouri - St. Louis requires that newly enrolled or re-admitted students, where the following situations exist, comply with the Tuberculosis (TB) screening instructions.

A. Check any that apply:

- O From or have lived for two months or more in Asia, Africa, South America, or Eastern Europe.
- O Have been diagnosed with a chronic medical condition that may impair your immune system.
- O A health care worker.
- O A volunteer or employee of a nursing home, prison, or other residential institution.
- O Contact with a person known to have active tuberculosis.
- O None of the above apply.

B. If any of the above (in "A") apply, the following is **required:**

Screening: Call University Health Services at (314) 516-5671 to schedule an appointment for screening. Chest x-rays will be required for anyone with a positive skin test.

OR

Provide documentation of TB screening (PPD Mantoux skin test read in millimeters of induration) done in the U.S. within the past 12 months.

OR

Provide documentation by a health care provider of prior treatment of active TB disease.

Part IV Other Immunizations Recommended, but not required, for all students

Tetanus/Diphtheria administered within the past 10 years.

Hepatitis B series (3 doses). Even if incomplete, provide dates of any doses received.

Influenza vaccine. Available each fall and advisable for all students but, in particular, for those with asthma or other chronic illnesses.

If any of these additional immunizations (in Part IV) have been received, please send a copy of your records as well.





YOUR STUDENT ACCOUNT

Students at UMSL use two software programs to maintain their records at the University:

- MyView (<u>myview.umsl.edu</u>)
 Used to update biographical information, financial records, and enrollment details
- MyGateway (<u>mygateway.umsl.edu</u>)
 Contains course content, organization and job listings, and announcements about campus events

Find your SSO ID

In order to access MyView, MyGateway, and your UMSL email account, you will need to obtain your SSO ID:

- Go to <u>myview.umsl.edu</u>
- Click "Look up My User ID"
- Enter your student number (found at the top of your admission letter)
- Write down your SSO ID

Activate your Student Account

- Go to myview.umsl.edu
- Click "Forgot My Password"
- Select "Change/Recover Password"
- Enter your SSO ID, date of birth, and student number (found at the top of your admission letter) You do not need to
 enter a social security number
- Select next and follow the prompts to continue

Once your account is active, you may log in to MyView and MyGateway, browse course listings, take the math placement exam (see enclosed sheet), and set up your email account.

Activate your UMSL Email

- You must activate your Office 365 account to access your email.
- Follow the "Getting Started" steps on www.umsl.edu/technology/email/
- You will be issued a first time use password.
- Once you log in and complete the verification process, you will be taken to the Office 365 account home page. From this page you can set a new password.





MATH PLACEMENT EXAM

Undergraduate students must demonstrate math proficiency before registering for math classes at UMSL. The University offers a convenient online placement test called ALEKS, and undergraduates must take this online exam **before** orientation.

Do I Need to Take the ALEKS Test?

First-year students: Yes, all freshmen must take the ALEKS test before orientation.

Exchange students: Maybe. ALEKS is only required if you will take courses with math prerequisites

during your time at UMSL.

Other undergraduate students: Maybe. Before registering for a math class or a course with math prerequisites,

you must take the ALEKS test **or** transfer credit for the prerequisite math course.

Taking the Test Online

Go to aleks.com/umsl/ppl and sign in with your SSO ID and password.

ENGLISH PROFICIENCY EXAM

Most undergraduate and graduate students are required to take the English for Academic Purposes (EAP) placement exam **during** orientation. This exam must be completed before students can finalize course registration. Students who miss the exam will need to schedule a make-up test before finalizing classes. For a list of exemptions to the EAP test, visit the Admitted Students section of <u>umsl.edu/international</u>.

Depending on the results of the exam, students *may* be required to enroll in specific EAP subjects during their first year at UMSL. EAP classes are taken at the same time as regular courses and receive both grades and credit hours at the University. Advanced EAP subjects are counted as electives in most degree programs.

The EAP Proficiency Exam measures a student's English skills as used in academic study. The test lasts approximately two hours and has three sections:

- Listening & Note-taking
- Writing & Grammar
- Speaking





ADVISING AND COURSE REGISTRATION

At UMSL, all students must meet with an advisor to plan their degrees and select appropriate courses. Academic advisors are also available to guide you and answer questions throughout your time at the University. For more information about advising, please visit umsl.edu/advising.

Who Is My Advisor?

All undergraduate students are assigned to a staff advisor according to their major. To identify your advisor, visit umsl.edu/international ("Admitted Students" section) and click on "Advising." There you will find the contact information for your college.

Pre-registration: July 10 - August 14

Before you arrive on campus, we encourage you to pre-register for a tentative schedule of up to 9 credit hours:

- 1. Complete your Math Proficiency Test (if required see the *Math Placement Test* sheet)
- 2. Sign up for orientation and complete the registration questionnaire: umsl.edu/newstudentprograms
- 3. Learn about degree requirements for your major: bulletin.umsl.edu
- 4. Make a list of courses you would like to take: myview.umsl.edu (links under "Guest Access")
- 5. Review important dates on the Academic Calendar: bulletin.umsl.edu/#academiccalendartext
- 6. Begin the international transfer credit process, if needed: umsl.edu/international ("Current Students" section)
- 7. Email your advisor to discuss your pre-registration. Be sure to say that you are a new international student and your advisor will complete your pre-registration for you.

Final Registration: August 17 – 19

After orientation, you will finalize your course schedule with your advisor. You will work together to create a balanced, full-time course load of 12 or more credit hours. To complete final registration:

- 1. Attend orientation
- 2. Take the English Proficiency Exam during orientation (if required see the English Proficiency Exam sheet)
- 3. Meet with your advisor on campus

Financial Responsibility

Please note that when you register for classes the Cashiers Office will bill tuition to your student account. You can view your bill online at myview.umsl.edu. Additional information about billing will be provided during orientation.





UNDERGRADUATE ORIENTATION

All visa-holding international students are required to attend orientation and finalize course schedules at that time. Please check below to see which orientation you must attend.

International Student Orientation

(for students with 30 or fewer U.S. college credit hours)

International Student Orientation is held in the Millennium Student Center beginning at 8:00 a.m. on Monday, August 17. Please make arrangements to stay on campus until 5:00 p.m. on August 17 – 19 and sign up for orientation at umsl.edu/newstudentprograms (click on "New Student Orientation").

On the first day of orientation, please bring

- Your passport, I-20 or DS-2019, local St. Louis address
- Emergency contact information (a person in the U.S. or abroad we could contact if you have an emergency)
- The same documents for any dependents (a spouse or children) who entered the U.S. with you

Transfer Student Orientation

(for students with more than 30 U.S. college credit hours)

Students with more than 30 U.S. college credit hours may attend an abbreviated orientation. In this compact session you will learn key facts about your immigration status, employment eligibility, and health insurance at UMSL. Please bring the documents listed above with you for immigration check-in.

Transfer students in the US attend must orientation on August 12 from 3:00 – 8:00 p.m. in the Millennium Student Center. Be sure that you have received a new I-20 from UMSL **before** registering for classes and that you sign up for orientation on umsl.edu/newstudentprograms (click on "Transfer Student Orientation").
