### Letter from the PTSA President



Greetings,

I write my letter this month with a heavy heart. At our April PTSA meeting, Mr.

Merrell shared some of the results of the latest Fairfax County youth survey. For several years, the biggest area of concern in the survey data for Madison was alcohol usage. The data from the 2012 survey makes it clear the problem is growing. The percentage of Madison students who use alcohol has not only grown, but now exceeds both FCPS *and* national averages. At the time of the survey, 48 % of JMHS seniors reported using alcohol in the past 30 days (nationally 40%, FCPS 37%) – nearly *half*. One in 3 reported they had participated in binge drinking (5 or more drinks in a row within the past two weeks) (nationally 26%, FCPS 20%, JMHS 31.5%).

If those numbers don't scare you, they should.

First, alcohol impairs judgment. This is true for anyone of any age, but for teenagers, layer on the fact their stage of brain development renders them unable to think through all the possible consequences of a decision -- even if they are stone cold sober. There have been several stories in the press about some of those consequences. Most recently, the boys from West Springfield High School who were recently convicted for their behavior in recording and sharing the videos of sexual acts – admitting that they, and the girls who participated had all been drinking. Or the young man in Sterling who, while drunk, entered the wrong house and was shot by the neighbor who did not recognize him. Consider the risk of any teen that ends up behind the wheel of a car after drinking. It doesn't need to appear in the press to be a serious issue.

Second, there is no hierarchy of a "better" drug – because, well, kids are going to use something. I noted in a previous letter that at the P.R.O.T.E.C.T. presentation the PTSA hosted, it was made very clear by parents, professionals, and a student participant, that alcohol is the gateway drug to other drug use.

Third, it's illegal. Illegal for kids to be in possession and drink, and illegal for parents to knowingly host parties for underage drinkers. Here's what the Virginia ABC says about parental responsibility and the law:

> "Some parents provide alcohol to minors at parties or fail to see the truth that alcohol use occurs. If you're a parent who is thinking about providing or allowing alcohol at a party in your home (or elsewhere) you ought to know the laws. Parents may be held responsible if someone, as a result of alcohol use:

- Gets into a fight and hurts someone.
- Falls and hurts themselves or someone else.

- Sexually assaults someone.
- Damages property.
- Dies from drinking too much.
- Injures or kills someone while driving after leaving the party.

You have a civil liability (meaning you can be sued) to pay damages if either a partygoer is hurt or a third person is injured. Virginia law recognizes your liability for negligence if you provide alcohol to a minor who causes injury to another or him/herself. You may also face criminal charges of contributing to the delinquency of a minor."

Even if the above negative situations do not occur, you may face legal charges for providing or allowing alcohol to be used by minors in your home.

For example, it is against state law to allow (aid or abet) underage persons to possess or consume alcohol. This is a Class 1 misdemeanor and is punishable by up to one year in jail and/or a \$2,500 fine. Purchasing for and/or giving alcohol to a minor is also against the law, and penalties can include losing a driver's license for up to a year.

This is a community problem – there is a perception of parent approval that alcohol use among teens is okay. Become knowledgeable. Connect with other parents. When your son or daughter is going to a party – call the parents to ask if adults will be present, and if alcohol will be served. Have real consequences for alcohol use.

The Virginia ABC has some additional suggestions --Here are a few: **Communicate clearly & openly.** Set a firm "no alcohol" rule and firm consequences for breaking that rule. Supply your teen with accurate information.

Support community & school-sponsored afterprom/graduation celebrations. Most celebrations are parent sponsored and include community involvement. If your school does not sponsor such an event, please consider beginning a new tradition.

**Host a party.** Provide a fun and alcohol-free environment in your own home by holding a party yourself.

**Use a limousine.** The Virginia Limousine Association encourages its members to sign a pledge that they will not transport, supply or allow use of alcohol by minors in their vehicles.

**Reflect on your own actions.** Look in the mirror. Are you sending the right signals to your teen? Strive to be a positive role model.

Dear Parents, Staff and Students,

While I would always encourage plenty of sleep and a healthy diet, I would like to make it a point of emphasis over the next several weeks.

Between now and the end of the year there will be many events at Madison which will showcase the talents of our students. Whether it is a sporting event, a music concert, the spring musical or the annual Mr. Madison contest, there are lots of opportunities to support Madison students in their endeavors. IN CONSIDERATION of the right to attend and participate in the JMHS PTSA All Night Graduation Celebration, the parent/guardian of the identified student hereby:

- 1. Authorizes and gives the student permission to participate in the event;
- 2. Understands that the event will include most of the following:
